**Information About Measures B and C**

As I previously wrote, the Hercules City Council unanimously approved placing Measures B and C on the November 3, 2015 ballot to protect and maintain local city services and fiscal stability, with no increase in taxes.

Measures B and C do not create new taxes. They simply continue existing voter-approved local revenue, which the City has used to maintain fiscal stability and essential services for residents with locally-controlled funding that, by law, cannot be taken by the State.

If enacted, Measures B and C will protect and maintain essential City services that make our community a safe, well-maintained place to live and raise families, including:

- Maintaining the City's financial stability and enhancing fiscal accountability
- Maintaining the local Hercules Police Department, including:
  - o Maintaining the number of police officers patrolling neighborhood streets
  - o Improving 9-1-1 response times
  - o Expanding neighborhood crime prevention programs
- Attracting business to Hercules
- Preventing cuts to street maintenance

Funding from this locally-controlled revenue has helped the City avoid insolvency and reduce a \$9 million deficit, while improving fiscal stability and enhancing fiscal accountability.

Measures B and C continue to require strict fiscal accountability, including Independent Citizen Oversight and mandatory annual financial audits.

## **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT**

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate water reduction strategies. They also repaired streetlights and signs throughout town, patched potholes on Willow Avenue, oversaw electrical repairs to the Industrial Lift Station, tree trimming in Victoria Park, and replaced 18 parking signs on Crystal Circle. In anticipation of the start of the school year, staff also made improvements to the 3 child care centers including painting, deck repairs, dead tree removal, and relocated furniture and facilities.

Engineering – The \$7M Bay Trail phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center (RITC) in Hercules is nearing completion and a punch list of final items is being created. The Path To Transit phase was rebid and an \$11.7M construction contract was awarded to OC Jones by Council on August 11. An agreement was also approved for Parsons Brinckerhoff to provide construction management services. Work is anticipated to begin early September. The Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project is out to bid and the construction contract is tentatively scheduled to come before Council on September 8. Rough grading for the Muir Pointe residential development is mostly complete, approximately 45,000 CY of excess soil was removed. The final map and grading plans are under review. The 100% Plans for the \$48M Pinole-Hercules Waste Water Treatment are undergoing final review and the prequalification process for potential contractors has been completed. Design for the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward on schedule. Construction is scheduled for next summer, when school is on break.

### **Press Release**

On August 10, 2015, at approximately 10:28 pm, an armed robbery occurred at the My Goods Market in the 800 block of Willow Ave in the City of Hercules, CA.

The suspect was described as an African American adult male, possibly in his 30's, approximately 5'6 to 5'8 tall, approximately 150-175 lbs., and was wearing a tan pullover hooded sweatshirt, gray beanie, blue jeans, yellow and black gloves, and yellow/black/white athletic shoes. The suspect had the hood from his sweatshirt over his head during the commission of the crime.

The suspect pointed a black semi-automatic firearm at the cashier as he leaned over the counter and demanded, "Get the money out of the register." After taking nearly an undisclosed amount of cash, the suspect exited the food mart and fled on foot onto Willow Avenue towards Rodeo. There is no further information at this time and the investigation is still active.

**Identity Theft:** In early July 2015, the Hercules victim, received a Wal-Mart master card from

**Auto Burglary:** On August 9, 2015, at about 9:31 am, an officer was flagged down near Willow Food & Liquor (844 Willow Avenue) about an auto burglary. At approx. 9:25 am, the victim parked and secured his vehicle ('11 Infiniti FX35 LL Silver VIN: JN8AS1MW2BM733038) in front of Willow Food & Liquor. The victim walked around the corner to smoke a cigarette and returned at about 9:30 am to find his front passenger window shattered and his backpack missing. While on-scene, the victim received a phone call from a person stating they found his business card in a backpack on a freeway off-ramp in Fairfield near the Cordelia Junction. **Armed robbery:** On August 10, 2015, at about 10:29 pm, a clerk at the My Goods market located in the 800 block of Willow Avenue reported being robbed of an undisclosed amount of cash by a subject described as a Black Male Adult, about 5'6", wearing gloves, a grey beanie and a tan colored hoodie. The suspect leaned over the counter with a gun in his right hand and ordered the clerk to "get the money out of the register". After receiving the cash, the suspect walked away northbound on Willow Avenue towards Rodeo.

**Hit & Run:** On August 11, 2015, at about 3:55 pm, an officer was dispatched to Village Parkway near Hercules Avenue to investigate a report of a hit & run. The registered owner from Devonwood, stated he saw her vehicle (00 Volvo V40) undamaged on August 10, 2015 at 8:00 pm as it was parked along Village Parkway. The owner returned on August 11, 2015 at 3:55 pm to find damage to her vehicle with no notice left. No suspect info.

Officer found the three year old playing on the play structure. The child in good health. Witnesses at the park said the child was left behind by a possible daycare provider about 30 minute prior to our arrival. Officers were able to locate the daycare provider at 181 Falcon Way. The daycare provider was unaware

that the child had not been loaded into a second vehicle when they left the park. The child's mother was contacted and she responded to Falcon to take custody of her child. A report was taken to be forwarded to CPS and the State Licensing Division for licensed daycare providers. The daycare provider was told to advise all of her client's parents of the incident that occurred today.

**Residential Burglary:** On August 14, 2014, an officer was dispatched to the 300 block Turquoise for a report of a possible attempted residential burglary. The victim reported that sometime between 11:00 am and time of call, an unknown suspect entered her garage through a doggie door, unlocked the garage door and took a ladder from the garage and place it on the side of the house.
