Hercules Bay Trail Segment Opening Event

The community is cordially invited to join us for a ribbon-cutting for the newest segment of the San Francisco Bay Trail which has been completed here in Hercules! The ribbon-cutting will be on Saturday, September 19th at 9 AM in Shoreline Park at 1000 Tug Boat Land (in the Victoria by the Bay neighborhood). The ribbon-cutting will be followed by a Healthy Lifestyle and Mobility Expo which will consist of informational displays along the new 2/3rds mile segment of the Bay Trail. So bring your walking shoes and check out the great views over San Pablo Bay.

Willow Avenue Reconstruction

Next week the City Council will be awarding a contract for the reconstruction of Willow Avenue from Highway 4 to just past the Hercules Transit Center. Once construction starts later in September, it is expected to take approximately 60 days to complete and there will be detours in effect so watch for further information. The stretch of street is very bad repair and so while there will be some inconvenience, we believe it will be worth it once completed.

Path to Transit to Start

The second phase of the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center in Hercules will start later this month. The City has been successful in securing the permits required to start construction and a construction contract has been awarded to OC Jones. The Path to Transit will extend John Muir Parkway across Refugio Creek to Bayside Boulevard and will see restoration of the Refugio Creek and a related tributary.

Alexandria at Victoria by the Bay

The first five families have moved into the new Alexandria at Victoria by the Bay neighborhood and we welcome our newest residents to Hercules!

Important Voter Information

Measures B and C are the only local measures on the Hercules November ballot. We are providing factual information about Measures B and C so that you can make an informed decision when you vote November 3rd.

If enacted by voters, Measures B and C will not create new taxes, but simply continue locally-controlled funding previously approved by a majority of Hercules voters in order to maintain financial stability and essential local services, including public safety, business attraction and street maintenance.

By law, measures B and C continue to require strict fiscal accountability, including Independent Citizen Oversight and mandatory, annual financial audits.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate and implement water reduction strategies. They also repaired streetlights and signs throughout town, patched potholes on Willow Avenue, and oversaw electrical repairs to the Industrial Lift Station. Staff also made repairs to the interior of the Foxboro Community Center and installed picnic signs and a barbeque at Foxboro Park.

Engineering – The \$7M Bay Trail phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center (RITC) in Hercules is substantially complete with only a few items remaining, such as installation of the benches and garbage cans. Final landscape mitigation planting will occur in Winter when the weather is optimal. The City received the last permit needed for the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase from the Corps of Engineers, clearing the way for the start of construction, which is scheduled to begin next week. Bids for the Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project were opened and O. C. Jones submitted the lowest responsible, responsible bid in the amount of \$833K, which is within budget. The construction contract will come before City Council on September 8 and assuming the project moves forward construction is anticipated to begin late September and be completed by the end of November. The project will require half of Willow be reconstructed at a time, so only westbound traffic can be accommodated. A detour plan for eastbound traffic has been developed, individual businesses have been notified, and various media will be used to inform the general public. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential development is scheduled to resume next week. The final map and grading plans are under review. The draft plans and specifications for the \$48M Pinole-Hercules Waste Water Treatment have been completed and are scheduled to be brought to Council for final approval on September 22, then bid out later in the month. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward on schedule. Construction is scheduled for next summer, when school is on break.

Hercules Police Department



On September 1, 2015 Hercules Police Officers along with personnel from over 20 Law Enforcement, and fire agencies, in twenty states, will proudly wear this special “UNITED” BADGE. This badge will be worn for the entire month of September to Commemorate and Honor those who paid the ultimate sacrifice on that unforgettable day. Every year after, officers will don the 911 badge on September 1st and retire it on September 30. On October 1, 2015 all 9-11 badges will be carefully put away until September 1, 2016. Hercules Police Department, along with Napa Police and Fire Departments, are the first agencies in Northern California to participate in the “America’s First Responders UNITED” project.

Press Release

The Hercules Police Department continues to seek information leading to the identity of an Armed Robbery suspect. The Robbery occurred at the 76 Gas Station, in the 800 block of Willow Avenue, on August 10th, 2015, at approximately 10:28 p.m.

The suspect walked up to the female cashier, leaned over the counter, and pointed a semi-automatic pistol at her. He very calmly said “Get the money out of the register”. Once the suspect had the undetermined amount of money, he left the store and fled on foot towards, towards Rodeo. The suspect was so cool other customers in the store did not know the store was being robbed until the suspect left.

The suspect was described as an African American male in his late 20’, early 30’s; 5’-6” to 5’-8”; 150 to 175 pounds, with no visible facial hair. He was wearing a tan pullover hooded sweatshirt, with the hood pulled up, gray beanie under the hood, blue jeans, yellow and black gloves, and yellow/black /white athletic shoes. It is believed the suspect is right handed. The investigators feel the suspect’s calm demeanor, his approach to the cashier, and his ability to go undetected by other customers, indicates this suspect has committed other like crimes. It is also believed he may have had a vehicle in the area.

Patrol & Investigations Priority Calls

Parole Hold/ Possession of Stolen Property: On August 20, 2015 6:56 a.m., Hercules Detectives were conducting surveillance of the shopping center at 3600 San Pablo Avenue. Their attention was drawn to a silver BMW 750 moving around in the shopping center lot. The driver and sole occupant of the BMW was a young black male adult. The driver displayed suspicious activity by parking next to an SUV and peered inside. The subject saw the SUV was occupied (coincidentally by one of our detectives) and moved his BMW to another parking stall in the lot. The subject exited his BMW and peered into another vehicle. From there, the subject got back into his BMW and drove out of the lot. Officers recognized the driver and had knowledge he was on parole. An investigative stop was conducted at Mc Donald's. The driver was positively identified as 22 year old Caesar Ammons, of Rodeo and confirmed he was on searchable parole. Officer searched the BMW and located a backpack with several laptops and cell phones. It yet to be determined if the items are stolen. Officers performed a parole search of Ammons apartment in Rodeo. They located a box of checks belonging to a San Leandro/Oakland resident. The owner of the checks was contacted and confirmed the checks were stolen in a residential burglary, in San Leandro. Ammons was arrested for Possession of Stolen Property and Violation of Parole. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Residential Burglary: On August 20th 2015 at approximately 6:41 p.m., a HPD Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Rocky Point Court for a cold burglary report. The reporting party, currently living in Millbrae, is in the process of selling his vacant home. He was last at his property on August 16th 2015. When he returned today, someone had taken the dishwasher and garbage disposal from his house. There were no signs of forced entry.

Auto Burglary: on August 20th 2015 at approximately 9:15 p.m., a HPD Officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Willow Avenue for an auto burglary. The Vallejo resident stated that he parked his 1999 Toyota Camry in the parking lot around 6:30 p.m. and when he returned, the front passenger window as shattered and his Samsung laptop was missing.

Sex Offender Compliance Check: On August 20th, 2015 Hercules Detectives conducted compliance check at all 18 of our PC 290 registrant's residences. Seven were found to be at home and in compliance. One recently relocated to Vallejo and one was recently placed in a convalescent home. There was no response at the other 9 locations.

Outside Assist: On August 21, 2015 at 10:44 a.m., a Pinole Police officer initiated a vehicle pursuit on a white Odyssey van, with paper plates, on Tara Hills near Magee. The pursuit was terminated when the driver of the van entered the I80 westbound off ramp at Appian Way traveling east (the wrong way). The vehicle was observed, by Hercules Police Officer, entering west bound Highway 4, travailing east (the wrong way). The Hercules officer located the van in the parking stall in the 1200 block of Willow Avenue. The vehicle was a confirmed stolen, out of Contra Costa County. Seconds later a second Hercules officer located the suspect on Mariners Point at Willow. Pinole Police arrived and took over the investigation.

Throwing substance at a vehicle: On August 21st 2015 at approximately 9:39 p.m., HPD Officers were dispatched to the 3600 block of San Pablo Avenue. The reporting party stated she was driving southbound on San Pablo Avenue near Tsushima Avenue when the front passenger window of her GMC Yukon shattered. It appears a rock had caused the damage to her window.

Possession of Stolen Property/ID theft/Probation violation: On August 22nd 2015 1:53 a.m., a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a brown Kia, for a vehicle code violation. Two of the three occupants were found to be on searchable probation. A probation search was conducted. During the search, several credit cards and a CA drivers licenses, that did not belong to any of the subjects, were located. Officers also found three notebooks containing the identifying information of numerous subjects. 56 year old Jewel Bennett of Richmond and 39 year old Jmeila Gibbs of Richmond were arrested for Possession of Stolen Property and Violation of Probation. They were transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The third occupant was released at the scene. Officers are in the process of to identifying and contacting all the victims.

Vandalism: On August 22, 2015, at about 7:27 a.m., an officer was dispatched to Santé Fe & Camden Lane to investigate a report of a suspicious vehicle. Officers located a 2004 Honda Accord, parked along Santé Fe with a broken left rear window. The registered owner said between 4:00 p.m. on August 21, 2015 and the time of call, an unknown suspect(s) broke the vehicle's window. No signs of entry were observed and nothing was missing.

Auto Burglary/Vandalism: On August 22, 2015, at about 8:52 a.m., an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Paradise Drive to investigate a report of an auto burglary. The reporting party stated she saw her rental car (2015 Chevrolet Impala) parked and secured in her parking stall yesterday afternoon. She returned to find four flat tires and the vehicle's GPS missing.

Vandalism: On August 22, 2015, at about 9:41 a.m., an officer was flagged down at Starbuck's, (3700 San Pablo Ave), regarding a vandalism. The manager for Starbuck's, reported sometime between 9:30 p.m. and 4:00 a.m., an unknown suspect maliciously broke the glass to the front door of the business. The glass was still intact and there were no signs entry was made.

Vandalism: On August 22nd 2015 at approximately 7:53 p.m., a HPD Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Hercules Avenue for vandalism to a vehicle. The reporting party stated that the rear window of her 2014 Kia Soul was shattered overnight. The damaged appeared as though it was caused by a BB or pellet.

Mail Theft: On August 23, 2015, at about 5:00 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 2200 block of Redwood Road to investigate a report of mail theft. The reporting party said he saw his mailbox, untampered, at about 12:30 p.m. He returned at about 4:50 to find the mailbox door bent and the weather stripping removed. All the mail was missing.

Driving under the influence: On August 23 2015 at 9:45, an Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a silver BMW, for inoperable head and tail lights. The driver, 28 year old Daniel Leyva, of Hercules, displayed objective symptoms of intoxication. The subject was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device showed Leyva to be over the presumptive level for the purposes of driving. He placed him under arrest for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. He was cited and released to a responsible party.

Hit & Run: On August 23, 2015 at about 11:41 a.m., an officer was dispatched to the 2100 block of Railroad Avenue to investigate a report of a hit and run that occurred overnight. The victim stated that on August 23, 2015, at about 4:00 p.m., she saw her 2010 Toyota Sienna Van parked, in the rear alley of her residence, undisturbed. On August 24, 2015 at about 11:40 she found damage on her rear bumper consistent with that of a sideswipe collision with no notification left.

Mail Theft: On August 25, 2015 at about 9:00 a.m., an officer was dispatched to investigate a report of a mail theft that occurred on the 100 block of Sequoia Road. The victim stated her mail box had not been checked since August 18, 2015, at about 12:00 p.m. On August 24, 2015, at about 4:00 p.m., she found her mailbox door open, the lock damaged and there was no mail inside.

Officers contacted Michael Simon who was found to be on Federal Probation. Simon granted officers permission to search his car and during the search the officer located a bag containing approximately 2 grams of cocaine on the floor next to the passenger seat. The passenger, Dominique Nisby, was watching and soon as the officer found the cocaine she walked up and said that it was hers. Nisby was arrested and booked at HPD.

DUI On September 3rd 2015 at approximately 1:00 a.m., a HPD Officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop on a Honda Civic in the area of Lupine Road and Heather Avenue for a vehicle code violation. The driver, Ricky D Devilla of Concord, displayed the objective symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. SFSTs were conducted and he registered a PAS read out of .151/.170 and was placed under arrest. At MDF, Devilla failed to blow in the Drager and refused to submit to a blood draw. A warrant was obtained for the blood draw and Devilla was booked into MDF without further incident. The vehicle was towed.
