Hercules Bay Trail Opening

The community is invited to join us on Saturday at 9 AM for the opening of the new Bay Trail segment here in Hercules. The ribbon cutting at 9 AM, just to the west of Shoreline Park at 1000 Tug Boat Lane in Victoria by the Bay, will be followed by a Healthy Lifestyle and Mobility Expo along the trail route which will last until 12 noon. The completion of the trail and the creation of the vertical clearances needed for a future third rail line done as part of this project are the first phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center here in Hercules. The second phase is now under construction and will see John Muir Parkway extended via a new bridge across Refugio Creek to Bayfront Boulevard, together with a new Creekside trail and restoration of Refugio Creek.

November Election

Our City Clerk would like to remind Hercules residents that the fourth annual National Voter Registration Day takes place Tuesday, September 22 with tens of thousands of Americans expected to get registered to vote.

In 2008, six million Americans didn't vote because they missed a registration deadline or didn't know how to register. Any Hercules resident that has recently changed their name, address, or political party should re-register to vote. Eligible voters can visit the County Registrar's website at www.cocovote.us to verify their registration status.

The deadline to register to vote for the November 3 election is October 19, 2015. Residents can register to vote securely at the Secretary of State's website www.registertovote.ca.gov.

The Contra Costa County Elections Division will begin mailing ballots to vote-by-mail voters the week of October 5. Residents can vote by mail on or before November 3rd. Ballots must be postmarked and signed on or before November 3 and received by November 6.

For Hercules residents, Measures B and C are the only local ballot Hercules residents will consider this November. If enacted, Measures B and C will not create new taxes, but simply continue locally-controlled funding previously approved by a majority of Hercules voters in order to maintain financial stability and essential local services, including public safety, business attraction and street maintenance.

By law, Measures B and C continue to require strict fiscal accountability, including Independent Citizen Oversight and mandatory, annual financial audits.

The AS400 Upgrades project was completed on September 11, 2015.

We are in the process of preparing a Request for Proposals for a redesign of the City's website. Once the RFP is out and we receive the proposals, staff will evaluate and take a recommendation to the City Council for approval.

The VoteCast system included in the agenda management software has been installed and implementation for the entire process will begin in early to mid-October. This should speed up the agenda process for staff

With the Finance Department now fully staffed, the upgrades to Executime will be able to begin. The first meeting will be held on October 6th and the hope is to have the system upgraded by the beginning of next year.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate and implement water reduction strategies. They also repaired streetlights and signs throughout town, trimmed trees at the fire station, oversaw maintenance work at the Victoria Lift Station and the cleaning of sanitary sewer hot spots, cleaned up illegal dumping, began seasonal v-ditch cleaning, and worked with the lighting and landscaping district contractor to convert pop-up spray irrigation to drip in the Business Park.

Engineering – The \$7M Bay Trail phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center (RITC) in Hercules is substantially complete and the grand opening is this Saturday. Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase began last week. O. C. Jones is clearing the North Channel and will begin installing the culvert crossing. O.C. Jones was also awarded an \$833K contract to rehabilitate Willow Avenue and repave the Community Center. Construction is anticipated to begin early October and be completed by the end of November. The project will require half of Willow be reconstructed at a time, so only westbound traffic can be accommodated. A detour plan for eastbound traffic has been developed, individual businesses have been notified, and various media will be used to inform the general public. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential

development is underway. The final map and grading plans are under review. The draft plans and specifications for the \$48M Pinole-Hercules Waste Water Treatment have been completed and are scheduled to be brought to Council for final approval on September 22, then bid out later in the month. Proposals for the design and environmental clearance for the Bay Trail West Phase of the Intermodal Transit Center will be also be brought before Council on September 22. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward on schedule. Construction is scheduled for next summer, when school is on break.

Residential Burglaries

On September 9, 2015, at 8:28 am, HPD Officers were dispatched, to the 1200 block of Hercules Avenue, for the report of a possible “in progress” residential Burglary. The Reporting Party, adult male, was inside the residence. He heard someone knock at the door, and subsequently heard someone inside his residence. The Reporting Party locked himself in a bedroom. Officers arrived and set up a perimeter. Officers found the front door ajar. The residence was cleared, and no suspect(s) was located inside the residence. The victim was located and was unharmed. The residence was ransacked and the screens were removed, from two exterior windows, on the back side of the residence. One kitchen window was found open. It was determined there was jewelry missing from the residence.

While Officers were conducting a neighborhood check they were dispatched to the 300 block of Grissom for a suspicious Circumstance. The reporting party stated an African American female was sitting in a black Chrysler 300. The vehicle was backed into the driveway, and the house alarm started to go off. The reporting party was able to provide the officers with a license plate number. The female was described as being tall; in her 20’s; having pink finger nails, and wearing a black blazer with a blue blouse. The Chrysler then drove out of the driveway and down Grissom when the alarm started to sound. Officers began to canvass the neighborhood for the Chrysler and the female. An Officer located the Chrysler, unoccupied, in the 100 block of Montego. Officers set up a perimeter, and started to canvass the neighborhood for the female. An Officer saw a female, matching the suspect description, walking in the 100 block of Catalina. The Officer turned around to contact the female and she had disappeared. Due to the location of the events, and potential outstanding subject(s), Hanna Ranch School and daycare were put on lock down at 10:14am. A Detective was waiting near the Chrysler and observed the suspect walking out from a backyard in the 100 block of Montego (near where the vehicle had been left). The female attempted to run away. 21 year old Vonisha Grisby, of Vallejo, was apprehended and detained. Property from the residential burglary, on Hercules Avenue, was located in the Grisby’s possession. Grisby was arrested for First Degree Residential Burglary. A second adult female, was located sitting, in her vehicle, on the corner of Montego and Bonaire. 28 year old Nastassjja Ellison, of Novato, was determined to be with Grisby, and was arrested for First Degree Residential Burglary. A third female, 22 year old Akoshiana Steward, of Oakland, was located near Miramar and Refugio Valley Road. Steward had a tool connecting her to the Residential Burglary on Hercules Avenue in her possession. Further, her wallet was located in Grisby’s car. A second attempt burglary, matching the method of operation for the other two incidents, was discovered in the 100 block of Carson. The Lock Down was released at 11:14am.

All three females were transported to the Martinez Detention Facility and booked for one count First Degree Residential Burglary; and two counts of Attempt Frist Degree Residential Burglary.

Warrant Arrest: On September 5, 2015 4:38 pm, an officer contacted a stranded motorist in the 4000 block of San Pablo. The driver, 45 Terry Sutton Vallejo, was arrested for an outstanding warrant. Sutton was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest On September 5th 2015 at approximately 8:21 pm, a HPD Officer conducted a traffic stop, on a silver 2005 Honda Odyssey, for a vehicle code violation. The front passenger, 25 year old Brittany Michelle Braggs of Antioch was discovered to have a no bail warrant held by San Jose PD. She was placed under arrest and transported to The Martinez Detention Facility.

Assault with Deadly Weapon/Domestic Violence/Child Endangerment: On September 6, 2015, at 11:33 am, HPD Officers were dispatched to Burger King, in the 800 block of Willow Avenue, for the report of a male being run over by a vehicle. The vehicle was reportedly driven by the mother of the victim's newborn child. The 34 year old male victim, of Richmond, stated he met with his child's mother in the parking lot of Burger King. The purpose of the meeting was to exchange the custody their 4 month daughter. After the child had been placed in the victim's

vehicle the suspect drove, her Chevrolet Avalanche, directly at the victim. The victim was standing next to his car. The victim was struck in the lower leg area, knocking him to the ground. The suspect then drove out of the parking lot, running a red light while exiting the parking lot. There were independent witnesses who verified the victim's statement. The victim suffered abrasions to his elbow and legs but declined medical treatment. An Emergency Protective Order was granted, which included the temporary custody of the child. The female driver, 34 year old Jennifer Clute, was located in American Canyon and arrested for the incident. She was charged with Assault with a deadly weapon, Felony Domestic Battery, and Child Endangerment. Clute was served with the EPO and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Hit and Run Collision: On September 6, 2015, at approximately 5:31 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Willow Avenue at Canterbury for the report of a Hit and Run Collision. The victim driver, of Rodeo, was turning east onto Viewpointe from south bound Willow. He was struck by a Burgundy 1999 Saturn sedan which was turning south bound onto Willow from West bound Viewpointe. The driver was described as an African American adult in his thirties.

He was transported to County Hospital to be medically cleared, prior to being booked into Martinez Detention Facility.
