Willow Avenue Reconstruction

Work will start later this month on the reconstruction of Willow Avenue from Highway 4 to the Hercules Transit Center. There will be detours in place for a period of time, estimated to be three to four weeks once the work starts. Electronic reader boards announcing the detours will be in place by Monday, October 5th, with the detours starting Monday, October 12th. In addition, maps of the detours and information on the project will be available on the City's website. We appreciate and thank everyone in advance for their patience and flexibility as we get the important road work done.

Measures B and C: Maintaining Public Safety

As you may know, local Measures B and C are the only items on the Hercules November 3 Special Election ballot.

If adopted by the community, Measures B and C will continue previous voter-approved measures to maintain essential City services that make our community a safe place to live, with no increase in tax rates.

Measures B and C will not create new taxes, or increase existing tax rates. Measures B and C simply continue existing measures the City has relied upon to maintain essential services, including public safety and street maintenance.

Measures B and C will ensure we can maintain our local Hercules police department and critical public safety services, including:

- Maintaining the number of police officers patrolling neighborhood streets
- Improving 9-1-1 police response times
- Expanding neighborhood crime prevention programs

Measures B and C continue to require strict fiscal accountability, including Independent Citizen Oversight and mandatory annual financial audits.

Administrative or Conditional Use Permits approved by the Planning Director or Planning Commission:

- Home Occupation permit approval given to Bernardina Gorospe, doing business as KKB Tours , for an administrative office space only for a charter bus service subject to multiple conditions of approval (including the prohibition of any vehicles associated with the business to be parked on street frontage and only one business related standard passenger vehicle parked on the applicant’s private property.
- Conditional Use Permit for a Pet Supply Retail Store at 2162 Railroad Avenue was approved in the Railroad Avenue Live-Work section of town was approved as a new business
- Master Sign Program was approved for the Aventine mixed use building at 1375 Sycamore Avenue that includes signage guidelines, halo-lit individual letter building identification signage at the top of 3 towers (as well as in the future courtyard), retail tenant, live-work tenant, and temporary signage for the entire building

Aventine (aka Town Centrale) Parking District Discussion

At the September 30th Public Safety/Traffic Subcommittee had a discussion about a proposed parking district along Sycamore Avenue between San Pablo Avenue and Tsushima Street for the mixed use 4-story building now referred to as “Aventine”. Aventine’s proposal includes placing restrictions of some sort on all street parking in front of the building and the creation of new parking stalls in one of the travel lanes between their building and San Pablo Avenue in order to provide at least 45 permit parking stalls that would only allow overnight parking by Aventine residents. Two- hour parking limitations would be on all stalls along the street with various time of day restrictions. The Committee directed the applicant and staff to make several tweaks to the proposal and forward the information to the Planning Commission for their public hearing on the topic. **Planning Commission will hold a public hearing at 7pm on October 19th** in City Council Chambers at 111 Civic Drive, Hercules to make recommendations to City Council in the Parking District Formation prior to the Council having its public hearing and actually forming the City’s first parking district. Further information will be posted to the 10/19/2016 Planning Commission Agenda at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Community Discussion of a Verizon Cell Tower Proposal as a Monopine at Valley Bible Church

Next week Tuesday night, October 6 at 7:00 pm in room #105 at 1477 Willow Avenue a community meeting will be held to discuss a proposed 45’ Wireless Telecommunication tower disguised to look like a pine tree. The tree and equipment compound will be located at the northerly portion of the church site within 50’ of the three large onsite crosses. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate and implement water reduction strategies. They also repaired streetlights and signs throughout town, installed new LED lighting in existing fixtures at the Community Center and City Hall, cleaned and inspected V-ditches in advance of the rainy season, cleaned-up illegal dumping, are making repairs to a pump in the Victoria lift station, and repainted the study room in the library. They also restriped crosswalks in the vicinity of the Hanna Ranch School and assisted at the ribbon opening ceremony for the Bay Trail phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center (RITC) in Hercules.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the RITC is well under way. The contractor is clearing out the North Channel in preparation for the culvert installation which will provide access to construct the John Muir Parkway extension over Winter. The Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project is tentatively scheduled to begin Monday, October 12. Reader board signs will be installed next Monday, October 5, and will provide notification that Willow eastbound from the Hercules Transit Center to the Highway 4 Overcrossing will be closed for approximately a month. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential development is underway. The final map and grading plans are under review. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward on schedule, staff is awaiting environmental clearance from Caltrans. Construction is scheduled for next summer, when school is on break.

Patrol & Investigations Priority Calls

THE FOLLOWING CASES ONLY REFLECT A PARTIAL LIST OF CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT POLICE PERSONNEL RESPONDED TO.

Animal Cruelty: On September 17, 2015, at about 10:07 am, an Officer responded to the 100 block of Jacaranda Court for a reported neighbor dispute. One neighbor alleged that the other neighbor purposely poisoned their dog. A half-eaten chocolate bar with a string tied around it was found in the backyard. The dog consumed the chocolate bar and appeared ill. It appears someone was purposefully taunting the dog to eat the chocolate bar. A case was taken and is still being investigated.

The elderly female was reported as being unconscious and sweating profusely inside the locked vehicle. When officers arrived on scene they found the elderly female slouched over in the driver's seat. Officers forced entry into the vehicle and removed the elderly female who was still unconscious. She later regained consciousness but was still lethargic. She was later medically cleared by paramedics at the scene and refused to be transported to the hospital for further medical assistance.

Mental Health Evaluation: On September 18, 2015, at about 3:05 am, Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Manzanita Place for a reported assault. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the subject being combative was a danger to others. The subject was transported by ambulance to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center for a 72 hour mental health evaluation.

Found Property: On September 18, 2015, at about 3:59 pm, a citizen from Rodeo turned in a passport found in the 800 block of Willow Avenue.

Court Order Violation: On September 19, 2015, at about 9:43 am, Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Thistle Court for a reported court order violation. The subject restrained from the residence was reportedly asleep inside the living room. The subject was contacted inside the residence, placed under arrest for the court order violation and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Mental Health Evaluation: While officers were taking the restrained party listed above into custody, his girlfriend who resides at the residence began acting irrational upon learning that her boyfriend was going to jail. She began making threats to damage her mother's home and threatened to physically harm her mother. The subject was determined to be a danger to others and was sent to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center for a 72-hour mental health evaluation.

Identity Theft: On September 19, 2015, at about 1:35 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 300 block of Violet Road for a report of an identity theft. The victim said someone used her personal information without her authorization to access her bank account and make three fraudulent transactions.

Identity Theft: On September 19, 2015, at about 9:02 am, a citizen from the 200 block of Pepperwood Road submitted an online report regarding identity theft. The victim said he received a credit card in the mail from Target which he did not apply for. The victim contacted the Target fraud department and discovered his personal information was used to open the account without his authorization.

Collision: On September 20, 2015, at about 9:00 am, Officers were dispatched to San Pablo Avenue and Hercules Avenue for a vehicle versus a pedestrian collision. A pedestrian, walking west bound in the crosswalk from the north/east corner of Hercules Avenue was struck by a vehicle that was turning north onto San Pablo Avenue from west bound Hercules Avenue. The injuries were determined to be minor and the pedestrian was not transported to the hospital.

Auto Burglary: On September 20, 2015, at about 9:23 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Worthing regarding an Auto Burglary report. A purse and miscellaneous documents were taken from inside the vehicle.

Mental Health Evaluation: On September 20, 2015, at about 12:58 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Hemlock Court for a report of a suicidal female. The subject was contacted and determined to be a danger to herself. She was transported to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center by ambulance for a 72 hour mental health evaluation.

After a short foot pursuit, Jackson was arrested for shoplifting and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility for shoplifting and resisting arrest.

Miscellaneous Information: On September 21, 2015, at about 11:30 am, Officers were dispatched to the area of Mandalay Avenue just behind Hanna Ranch School for a female and male yelling. The responsible address was determined to be in the 100 block of Mandalay Avenue. Officers attempted to make contact with the residents but did not initially get a response from inside the residence. County SWAT was called out for a possible barricaded subject. After about a half an hour, a male exited the residence and it was determined that the dispute was regarding the male's sister recently passing away. A Case was taken for documentation purposes due to Hanna Ranch

Elementary School and associated Day Care being locked down, and the county SWAT call out being initiated.

Domestic Battery: On September 21, 2015, at about 12:08 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the Hercules Police Department Lobby for the report of a domestic Battery. A Hercules resident reported that his girlfriend assaulted him on 9-08-15.

Auto Burglary: On September 21, 2015, at 12:53 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Big Lots located in the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue for the report of an auto burglary. The victim reported someone broke the rear driver's side window of their rental vehicle. Items taken included a duffle bag containing the victim's Illinois driver's license, airplane tickets, passport, and credit cards.

Auto Burglary: On September 22, 2015, at about 7:26 am, a citizen reported someone smashed the right front window of their vehicle while it was parked at the Starbuck's parking lot in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. A backpack containing a laptop, a cell phone and other electronic equipment were taken from inside the vehicle.

The suspect asked the juvenile if he could borrow his cell phone to make a call. The juvenile gave the suspect his phone and the suspect made a couple of phone calls. After making the second call, the suspect told the victim, "This phone is now taken". The second subject told the suspect to give the victim his phone back. The victim grabbed the phone and the suspect punched him on the chest. After a brief struggle, the victim was able to gain possession of the phone and both the suspect and second subject walked away toward Rodeo. The victim boarded a bus and called Dispatch about ten minutes later. An area check was conducted and the suspect was not located.

Identity Theft: On September 22, 2015, at about 10:08 pm, a resident from the 100 block of Square Rigger Cove came to the Hercules Police Department to report being the victim of Identity theft. He stated that he was contacted regarding suspicious purchases on his credit card. A credit account inquiry revealed six transactions totaling \$2360.37 that were not his.

Possession of Stolen Property: On September 23, 2015, at about 12:56 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a vehicle at Palm Avenue and Willow Avenue. During the contact it was determined that the rear seat passenger from El Sobrante was on probation out of Contra Costa County. A search of the truck was conducted and unopened mail belonging to a residence from San Pablo was located. The mail was later determined to be stolen. A case was taken to be forwarded to the DA's office for review.

Officers contacted the business owner who said someone smashed the rear window of the business between 9:30 pm last night and 9:50 am today. About \$400.00 was stolen from a cash register.

The driver reportedly swerved his vehicle to avoid hitting a deer and collided into tree. No injuries were reported and the vehicle was towed per the owner's request.

Upon arrival it was determined to be an issue between a daughter and her parents. After further investigation, the daughter was determined to be a danger to others and was transported by ambulance to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center for a 72 hour mental health evaluation.
