PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT



Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate and implement water reduction strategies. Staff also completed an inventory of all the streetlights in the City and are making needed repairs, are inventorying the storm drain system for cleaning in advance of winter, and purchased sand and sandbags.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the RITC is well under way. The contractor is excavating the North Channel and installing lightweight concrete bedding

in preparation for the culvert installation which will provide access to construct the John Muir Parkway extension over winter. Construction on the Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project is advancing on schedule for a November 20 completion date, currently the road base and bottom lift of asphalt in the westbound direction has been completed. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential development is nearing completion. The final map and improvements plans are under review. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward on schedule, staff just submitted the completed design to Caltrans for review. Construction is scheduled for next summer, when school is on break.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

BURGLARY PREVENTION TIP

The MOST important thing you can do is call the police to report suspicious persons, activity, or suspected crimes. Residents have to be the eyes of their neighborhood and may report suspicious activity anonymously.

LIGHT up your residence, LOCK your door at all times, and CALL THE POLICE when you see something suspicious. To contact Hercules Police Department's officers immediately, call (510)724-1111 from a cell phone or 911 from a land line.

Patrol & Investigations Priority Calls

THE FOLLOWING CASES ONLY REFLECT A PARTIAL LIST OF CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT POLICE PERSONNEL RESPONDED TO.

Residential Burglary: On October 15, 2015, at about 8:15 am, an Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 1100 block of Earnest Street for a report of a burglary. The burglary occurred sometime between 10:00 pm last night and time of call. The point of entry appears to be through an unlocked garage door. There is no suspect information.

Attempted Suicide: On October 15, 2015, at about 1:38 am, Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 200 block of O'Neil Circle for a welfare check on a 58 year old male subject. The Reporting Party was calling from the St. Helena Center for behavioral health. Officers arrived and while checking the rear of the property they were able to see an open pill bottle, an open ½ pint of Jack Daniel's Whiskey and a hand written note on the kitchen counter. The note was titled "Last Will + Testament." Due to the exigent circumstances, Officers breached the front door of the residence to gain access. The subject was found unconscious in his upstairs bedroom. It appeared that he took an unknown amount of muscle relaxers in an attempt to end his life. The subject was transported to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center for medical treatment and placed on a 72-hour mental health evaluation. Public works responded to repair the front door.

Guns Turned in for Destruction: On October 16, 2015, at about 12:25 pm, a citizen came into the Hercules Police Department and turned in three hand guns (two .22 Cal and one .32 Cal) that he said belonged to his deceased grandfather. The guns were entered into the Automated Firearms System and logged into evidence for destruction.

Residential Burglary: On October 16, 2015, at about 4:24 pm, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 200 block of Glenwood for a reported burglary. The burglary occurred sometime between 8:00 am this morning and time of call. It appears the point of entry was made after the front door was kicked in. The items taken include \$150 in miscellaneous US coins and a battery charger. There is no suspect information.

Residential Burglary: On October 16, 2015, at about 9:47 pm, an Officer responded to the 200 block of Glenwood for a reported burglary that occurred sometime between 9:00 am and the time of call. This residence is located directly below the residence burglarized in the incident noted above and the point of entry was the same. The items taken included a large flat screen television and jewelry. There is no suspect information.

72 Hour Mental Health Evaluation: On October 17, 2015, at about 9:45 pm, Officers responded to the area of San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore Avenue for a shirtless subject reportedly running down the middle of the street into traffic that appeared intoxicated. The subject, who was later identified as a 28 year old male from Pinole, was located at San Pablo Avenue and John Muir Parkway. He had several scratches and bruises on his arms and back and appeared very intoxicated. The subject was determined to be a danger to himself and was transported to the Contra Costa County Regional Medical Center by ambulance for a 72 hour mental health evaluation.

Found Property: On October 18, 2015, at about 7:39 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Lily Court for a report of found property. The resident told dispatch she found a plastic bag containing bullets in her backyard. The Officer took possession of a plastic bag containing 6 - 45 cal. cartridges, 5 - 40 ca. cartridges, and 2 - 9mm cartridges. All the ammunition was placed into Evidence as Found Property.

Miscellaneous Incident: On October 18, 2015, at about 1:25 pm, Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Starling Way for a 911 call regarding a person requesting an ambulance and reporting her dogs were fighting each other. Upon arrival, Officers found a resident trying to separate two Pit bulls from fighting each other and a third Pit bull injured in the kitchen. Animal Control was requested and after responding, they determined the injured dog in the kitchen

dog suffered severe blood loss and was in shock. The owner agreed to surrender the injured dog to Animal Control. No persons were hurt during this incident and the investigation was turned over to Animal Control.

Single Vehicle collision: On October 19, 2015, at about 2:04 am, Officers were dispatched to a crash that was later determined to be a solo vehicle collision between a Nissan Sentra and a tree on the center island of Hercules Avenue between San Pablo Avenue and Titan. The vehicle was heading E/B when the driver fell asleep and drove onto the center island and struck the first tree. The Nissan then hit a City Light pole before stopping when it hit a second tree. The driver was transported to a hospital for medical attention by ambulance and his vehicle was towed.

Battery and Contributing to delinquency of a minor: On October 19, 2015, at about 7:12 pm, a resident from the 100 block of Agate reported her daughter received a text this afternoon from her classmate's 20 year old brother threatening to beat her up. The mother said that her daughter and her classmate used to be good friends but they had a recent falling out and have had issues at school. Both girls attend John Swett High School in Crockett. At about 7:00 pm, tonight, her daughter's classmate, her 20 year old brother and both of her parents showed up at their residence uninvited and began verbally abusing her daughter thru the front door. Her daughter became so upset about what was being said she stepped outside and confronted them. She was then punched in the face and during the fight she sustained an injury to her wrist. Both of the girl's fathers were able to separate the two girls. No prosecution was desired and a case was taken for documentation purposes.

Runaway Juvenile: On October 19, 2015, at about 10:30 pm, a resident from the 800 block of Forest Run reported her 14 year old son left the residence without permission and had not returned. He was last seen wearing black gym shorts with white leggings and a grey sweater. An area check was conducted however the juvenile was not located. The juvenile was entered into the statewide database.

Supplement to Runaway Juvenile: On October 20, 2015, at about 10:30 am, a Hercules Police School Resource Officer located the Runaway Juvenile from Forest Run in the Rotunda area of the Hercules High School. After the contact was made with the juvenile's parent, he was removed from MUPS and released back to class.

Prisoner Pick-up: On October 20, 2015, at about 4:21 pm, an Officer responded to Solano County Jail to pick-up 23 year old Victavia Georges (Transient). Georges was arrested in Vallejo and found to have our outstanding Felony No Bail Ramey Warrant for Burglary, Theft and Forgery. The Warrant was issued on 10/13/2015 with a bail amount of \$42,500.00. Georges was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Residential Burglary PC 459: On October 20, 2015, at about 7:27 pm, Officers were dispatched to a residential burglary in the 100 block of Aster Court that occurred sometime between 8:00 am and the time of call. When the victim returned home she found the lights on and the rear kitchen slider open. It was later determined that entry was made through an open rear bedroom window which had the screen removed. The burglar(s) ransacked the residence and took \$400 dollars hidden in a bedroom drawer. At this point it is unknown if anything else was missing from the residence. It appears that thief attempted to remove a flat screen TV mounted on the wall but were

unsuccessful. Latent prints were located on the screen of the TV and were logged into evidence for further analysis.

Residential Burglary PC 459: On October 20, 2015, at about 7:56 pm, Officers were dispatched to a residential burglary in the 1500 block of Partridge that occurred sometime between 6:48 pm and the time of call. Entry into the residence was gained by removing the screen from a rear window and then breaking the glass. The victim said when she was leaving she saw a Black Male Adult associated with a white Mercedes in the area who appeared to peer into their garage as they were leaving. At this point the loss includes \$400 in cash, an XBOX and 2 pairs of Gucci glasses. Evidence was located at the scene and will be sent to the laboratory for further analysis.

Possession of less than 1oz. of Marijuana while driving: On October 20, 2015, at 11:53 pm, an Officer stopped 18 year old Joseph Carlson of Hercules for a headlight out at 3600 San Pablo Avenue. During the stop, the Officer smelled the odor of Marijuana so a search of the vehicle was conducted. During the search approximately 24 Grams of Marijuana were located in a silver jar. Carlson did not have a medical recommendation for the marijuana so it was taken as evidence. Carlson was cited and released on scene.

Found Property: On October 21, 2015, at about 4:24 pm, an Officer was flagged down in the 1600 block of Pheasant Drive for a set of keys that were found. The keys included a key fob for a Hyundai and a United Nations Key chain. The keys were booked into safekeeping at the Hercules Police Department.

Residential Burglary: On October 21, 2015, at about 8:01 pm, Officers responded to a residence in the 100 block of Ash Court for a reported burglary that occurred sometime between 11:00 am and the time of call. It appears entry was made through the rear living room window. The master bedroom was ransacked, select jewelry was taken from a dresser and a safe containing miscellaneous documents and two watches was also missing. It appears that the thieves attempted to pry the safe in the garage. Several bent screw drivers and shavings from the safe were found on the garage floor. There were also two separate footprints that appeared to be from a pair of vans and Nike Air force Ones found on the garage floor. No other evidence was located.

Non-Injury Traffic Collision: On October 21, 2015, at about 8:07 pm, Officers responded to the area of Refugio Valley Road and Pheasant Drive for a reported collision between a 2005 Ford and a 2014 Nissan. Upon arrival, it was determined that the Nissan had collided into the rear of the Ford as the two lanes merged southbound on Refugio Valley Road. The Nissan was occupied by a 38 year old female from Richmond and her 10 year old daughter. The airbag in her vehicle did not deploy and neither occupant was injured. The Ford was occupied by one 58 year old male from Hercules who complained of pain to his neck but declined medical attention. Both vehicles were able to drive away and each driver was provided a case number.

Runaway Juvenile: On October 21, 2015, at about 10:08 pm, an Officer responded to a residence in the 100 block of Bedford for a report of a 15 year old female that was last seen at about 4:45 pm today. She has a history of running away and has previously been located in the cities of Oakland, Richmond and Vallejo.

Outside Assist: On October 22, 2015, at about 2:58 am, Officers responded to a loud collision

heard on I-80. Upon arrival it was determined that the collision was on I-80 eastbound prior to the Highway 4 interchange. Both the number 1 and 2 lanes were blocked and there were multiple vehicles involved. One of the vehicles was found on its side and another had the airbags deployed and appeared totaled. None of the involved parties were in need of immediate medical attention. Hercules Officers were first on scene, assisted with traffic control setting a flare pattern and identifying the involved parties. CHP arrived and assumed control of the investigation.

Residential Burglary (Unlocked Garage): On October 22, 2015, at about 9:15 am, an officer was dispatched to a residence in the 1200 block of Taraya for a reported burglary that occurred sometime between 10:00 pm last night and time of call. It appears that an unknown suspect entered through an unsecured garage door and stole multiple property.

Shoplifting: On October 22, 2015, at about 12:35 pm, an officer was flagged down near 1625 Sycamore (Home Depot) for a reported theft that just occurred. The citizen reported seeing a tall Black Male Adult running from the store with store merchandise in his hands while being chased by a store employee. The BMA was wearing a ball cap, sunglasses, white t-shirt, brown work pants and an orange vest. He was last seen getting into a gray Kia and left in an unknown direction. It was later determined the suspect stole a DeWalt drill kit.

Unlicensed Driver: On October 22, 2015, at about 8:14 pm, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 1998 Honda Accord at San Pablo Avenue and Tsushima for an expired registration violation. The driver, 19 year old David Spears of Richmond was determined to be driving without a driver's license and was issued a citation.

Suspended Driver's License: On October 22, 2015, at about 8:46 pm, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 2003 Chevy Malibu at San Pablo Avenue and John Muir Parkway for an equipment violation. The driver, 23 year old John Thomas Cain of Antioch was determined to be driving while his driving privileges were suspended and was issued a citation for the violation.

Suspended Driver's License: On October 23, 2015, at about 1:45 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 2007 Nissan for an inoperable tail light violation at Sycamore Avenue and Refugio Valley Road. The driver, 36 year old Maria Rosas of Hercules was determined to be driving while her driver's license privileges were suspended and issued a citation.

Unlicensed Driver: On October 23, 2015, at about 9:13 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 1994 Chevy Impala in the parking lot of Rite-Aid located at 1560 Sycamore for expired registration over six months. The driver, was determined to be driving with an expired driver's license. He was issued a citation and the Chevy was towed for the expired registration.

Residential Burglary (Vacant Property): On October 23, 2015, at about 12:39 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a vacant residence in the 100 block of Finch Court for a reported residential burglary that occurred sometime in the past month. A complete dinner plate and flatware, collection of crystal and porcelain figurines, artwork (prints), and gold and diamond jewelry were taken from the residence. There were no signs of forced entry and nothing of evidentiary value was located for collection. There is no suspect information.

Suspicious Circumstance: On October 23, 2015, at about 8:29 pm, Officers responded to the 400 block Grenadine for a report of a subject described as a Tall, thin build, subject wearing a hooded sweater with the hood up. The subject was seen running out of the front door of another residence

and getting into a “Mazda type van.” A welfare check of the residence the subject was seen running from was conducted and there were no signs of a possible burglary. A resident was also later contacted and stated that the residence was intact and her property was accounted for.
