Happy New Year!

Open Space/Public Parks

The City of Hercules is fortunate to have wonderful public parks and hundreds of acres of open space which help define the character of our community. What you may not know is that camping and dumping in our parks and public open spaces is prohibited. While our staff is diligent about ensuring this does not occur, we would like to enlist the assistance of our residents in letting us know if you are aware of anyone camping or dumping in our parks or open space areas. Sycamore Crossings Update

At the December 8th City Council meeting, Terramar, the developer of the proposed Sycamore Crossing Shopping Center provided an update on the project. The design of the necessary utility relocation work by PG & E and East Bay MUD is complete and the final hurdle to getting all permits is the regional water permits given the seasonal creek and wetlands on the site. Securing of the regional water permits through the State Regional Water Quality Control Board is taking more time than expected with the permits expected to be in place with three to six months. The developer's leasing agent provide an update as to the leasing efforts on the site which will be anchored by a new Safeway. It was reported that they have letters of intent from four restaurants, one sit-down and three quick service concepts, plus strong interest from other retailers for the shop space. This update was provided as part of the City Council considering and approving a six month extension to June 30, 2016, of the deadline to acquire the site from the Successor redevelopment Agency which was approved by the City Council.


PG&E Community Pipeline Safety Initiative

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is working with customers and the City of Hercules to help ensure first responders have immediate access to natural gas transmission pipelines in case of an emergency. This important safety work involves reviewing structures, trees and brush located near the gas pipeline that could block emergency access for first responders or damage the pipeline.

PG&E is currently working with the City to review 45 trees located on City streets and other public areas that may pose a safety concern. For any tree that is identified as needing to be replaced for safety reasons, PG&E and the City will work together on a plan for tree replacements and restoration. Local residents who live near the planned safety work will be notified prior to any work taking place.

PG&E is also reaching out to local property owners to review approximately 63 trees located near the pipeline on private property. If there is a tree on your property that presents a potential safety concern, you will receive a letter from PG&E indicating the need to set up a meeting and gather additional information. For any tree that needs to be replaced, PG&E will work collaboratively with the property owner to develop a plan forward, which may include planting a new tree at a safe distance from the pipe and other landscape restoration.

The general location of the areas in which work is proposed to take place is illustrated on the map below:

Human Resources

The Request for Proposals for a redesign of the City's website is almost complete. When the proposals are received, staff will evaluate and take a recommendation to the City Council for approval.

The new agenda management system, Legistar, including the VoteCast portion is installed and ready to become operational to produce all City agenda and packets. Staff is in the process of obtaining some training and staff is expecting this to be operational March 1, 2016. Once operational, the current process and Legistar will be run for redundancy for the first two meetings to ensure everything

Planning Division

Administrative/ Conditional Use Permits approved by the Planning Director/Commission:

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and continue to evaluate and implement water reduction strategies. They retrofitted outdoor lighting at City Hall to LED and removed debris throughout town.

In preparation for the predicted El Nino winter storms, staff continues to inspect storm drain systems throughout town and clean catch basins, v-ditches, culverts, and creeks as needed. Sand and sandbags have been stockpiled at the Civic Center and Community Swim Center and are for public use.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is well under way. The culvert across North Channel has been installed and will allow the John Muir Parkway extension to be constructed over winter. The Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Community Center Parking Lot Repaving Project are substantially complete, some minor punch list items remain. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential development has been completed and the developer is now installing the underground utilities. Bids for the Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant were opened and are currently being evaluated. Two bids were received, with Kiewit submitting the low bid amount of \$43,143,000, which is higher than the Engineer’s Estimate of \$39,850,000. The bids will be further evaluated over the next month, construction is tentatively scheduled to begin this March and last approximately 2 ½ years.

Press Release

Attempted Bank Robbery

On December 24, 2015, at 11:58am, a male adult entered the Lucky Store, at 1590 Sycamore Avenue, and attempted to rob the US Bank (inside the store).

The suspect stood in line with other customers. When it was his turn, the suspect told the teller "I wanna do a cash withdrawal". The suspect gave the teller a demand note. As the teller was reading the note the suspect grabbed the note back and left the store, by the East door, without any money. No weapon was seen or simulated. The suspect is described as a Caucasian, or Hispanic male, 30 to 40 years old, 5-7 to 5-8, 160-180 pounds, dark brown hair, thick mustache, wearing a burgundy ball cap, sun glasses, black puffy jacket, blue jeans, red 49'er gloves, and Van shoes. No vehicle was seen.

Residential Burglaries

The Hercules Police Department has responded to 14 residential burglaries, and one attempted

residential burglary, during the month of December. The locations are in several residential neighborhoods.

Eight of the incidents occurred during the daytime hours. In one of the daytime incidents the resident was at home. The suspects rang the doorbell but the resident did not respond. The suspects went around to the back, broke a rear window, and entered the house. The resident confronted the two African American male adult suspects and they fled. In a second incident a resident heard someone ring his door bell, but he did not respond. He looked out the window and saw a male putting a flyer on his door. A short time later the resident left for work and saw a male loitering near his home. He did not call the police. The suspect(s) broke a window at the rear of the home, but did not make entry.

Seven of the burglaries occurred between 6:00pm and 11:00pm. Three of the residents were at home at the time of the incidents. In one incident, the victim saw a Caucasian male adult get out of a car and try to open the victim's garage door. The suspect was not successful and fled the scene. In a second case, the suspect broke a window in the garage door. The suspect reached in and unlocked the door but was not able to make entry due to items blocking the door. The resident was advised of an alarm activation and stayed in his room until the police arrived and cleared the scene. In the third incident, the resident saw two males in his backyard, trying to break into his garage. The resident fled out the front door and drove out of the area. The suspects had unscrewed the lights in the backyard, broke a rear window and entered the house.

The underlying factor, in all of these cases, is the houses appeared to be unoccupied. In almost all of the cases, occurring at night, there were no cars in the driveways and no lights visible inside the houses. Several homes had alarms, which were activated. In at least one incident, it appears the suspects fled when the alarm went off.

At this time it is unknown if any of these cases are related. The cases occurred all over the city and the descriptions of the suspects are varied. Investigators continue to follow all leads on these cases.

Most residential burglaries are crimes of opportunity. The most common method of operation is for the suspect to ring a door bell, or knock on the door. If there is no answer the suspect goes around to the side or back of the house and breaks a window or door, and makes entry.

The best crime prevention method is to try to make your residence appear occupied. If you are at home, and someone rings your doorbell, do not open the door. However, you should respond by saying "who is it", etc. If you are suspicious, or uncomfortable, call the police. If you are not at home, leave a radio or TV on so noise can be heard. If possible leave a car in the drive way. Try to have someone take in your trash cans, so they are not sitting on the street all day announcing you are not at home. If you are going to be gone in the evening leave a light or two on, preferably on timers, and leave a radio or TV on.

Always remember that the eyes and ears of the community are one of the best tools of the police department. If you are suspicious of anyone, or anything, going on in your neighborhood, do not hesitate to call the police. We want to check out any suspicious activity and keep our community safe.

New Motor Vehicle Laws effective January 1, 2016

Sacramento - With the New Year just around the corner, the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to inform the public of several new laws or changes to existing laws that, unless otherwise noted, take effect on January 1, 2016. The following are summaries of some transportation-related laws coming into effect.

Driving Under the Influence (SB 61, Hill): This law extends the existing Ignition Interlock Device (IID) pilot project to July 1, 2017 for Alameda, Los Angeles, Sacramento, and Tulare counties. The IID pilot project requires a person convicted of a DUI to install an IID for five months upon a first offense, 12 months for a second offense, 24 months for a third offense, and 36 months for a fourth or subsequent offense. The project was originally set to end on January 1, 2016.

Traffic Amnesty (SB 405, Hertzberg): Among other things, this law amends the criteria for a person to be eligible for the traffic citation amnesty program. The [traffic amnesty program](#) was approved through the 2015/16 Budget Act. A person is eligible for the traffic amnesty program if he or she has not made any payments after September 30, 2015, to a collection program for fines or bail already due. The law also indicates that payment of bail, fines, penalties, fees, or a civil assessment is not required in order for the court to remove the civil assessment of up to \$300 against any defendant who fails, after notice and without good cause, to appear in court.

Earbuds or Headsets (SB 491, Transportation Committee): This law, among other things, makes it unlawful to wear a headset covering, earplugs in, or earphones covering, resting on, or inserted in, both ears, while operating a motor vehicle or a bicycle. This prohibition does not apply to persons operating authorized emergency vehicles, construction equipment and refuse or waste equipment while wearing a headset or safety earplugs.

Pedal-Powered Vehicles (SB 530, Pan): This law expands the definition of Pedi cab to include a four-wheeled device that is pedal-powered, has a seating capacity for eight or more passengers, cannot travel in excess of 15 miles per hour, and is being used for transporting passengers for hire. This law sets requirements related to local authorization, operator qualifications and training, financial responsibility, accident reporting, safety equipment, and inspections. The law establishes rules and standards for Pedi cabs that allow passengers to consume alcohol on board, if authorized by local ordinance or resolution

Consumer Protection - Starter Interrupt Warning (AB 265, Holden): This law requires a “buy-here-pay-here” dealer to make certain disclosures and notices to a vehicle buyer when a vehicle is sold with tracking and starter interrupt technology installed. This law also requires advance warning be given to the purchaser prior to engagement of the starter interrupt technology, if the buyer fails to make timely vehicle payments. A “buy-here-pay-here” dealer is defined as a used car dealer that assigns less than 90 percent of their conditional sales and lease contracts to third party lenders, and therefore provide direct financing to car buyers.

Electrically Motorized Skateboards (AB 604, Olsen): This law defines “electrically motorized board,” and restricts their operation on public facilities, requires boards to be equipped with safety equipment, and authorizes cities and counties to regulate their use. It also makes it a crime to

operate an electrically motorized board while under the influence of drugs or alcohol. In addition, the law limits the board's operation to individuals 16 years or older, requires operators to wear a bicycle helmet, wear safety equipment to increase visibility at night, and limits their operation to roads with a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less. A conviction for violating this law is punishable by a fine of up \$250.

Electric Bicycles (AB 1096, Chiu): This law adds an entirely new definition of an electric bicycle to the California Vehicle Code. An electric bicycle is defined as a bicycle with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts. The law creates three classes of electric bicycles. Manufacturers will also need to certify the electric bicycles comply with specified requirements. Electric bicycle riders will be able to use roads similar to other bicycle riders, while providing a measure of local control if safety concerns arise on specific paths or public trails.

Transportation Network Companies (AB 1422, Cooper): This new law requires a transportation network company (TNC) to participate in the DMV's Employer Pull Notice (EPN) Program. TNCs provide prearranged transportation services for compensation using an online-enabled application or platform, to connect drivers using their personal vehicles with passengers. The program will provide each TNC with a report showing a driver's current public record, as recorded by the department, and immediate notifications of moving violations, accidents, driver license suspensions, revocations, and other actions taken against the driving privilege. The DMV's EPN program provides employers and regulatory agencies with a means of promoting driver safety through the ongoing review of driver records.

California New Motor Voter Program (AB 1461, Gonzalez), creates an automatic voter registration process for qualified individuals who apply for a driver license or identification card, or submit a change of address to the DMV. The law will require that DMV implement the New Motor Voter Act no later than one year after the Secretary of State certifies all of the following: the state has a statewide voter registration database that complies with the requirements of the federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (52 U.S.C. Section 20901 et seq.), the Legislature, has appropriated the funds necessary for the Secretary of State and DMV to implement and maintain the program, and the Secretary of State has adopted regulations to implement the law.

California Residency Requirement (AB 1465, Gordon): This law will require an applicant for an original driver license or identification card to provide proof of California state residency, starting July 1, 2016 and it will bring DMV into compliance with a federal law requirement. The DMV will need to adopt regulations relating to the procedures for verifying that the applicant is a California resident.

Possession of Stolen Property/ Probation Violation/ Identity Theft: On December 10, 2015 at 10:06am, an Officer stopped a Lexus for a non-functioning third brake. The vehicle was occupied by an adult male and female. Both were on searchable probation. The driver,

58 year old Derek Williams, of Richmond, had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The officer conducted a search of the vehicle and of Williams. In Williams' possession, the officer located his wallet. The wallet contained Williams CA ID card along with credit cards and CA ID cards that belonged to other people. The officer also found a Wells Fargo checkbook issued to someone other than Williams. The owner of the checkbook was located and said Wells Fargo, in Richmond, called him after someone tried to cash one of his checks for \$650. The victim didn't know either suspect and did not give them permission to possess his checkbook. Evidence of Identity Theft was also found in the possession of the female, 30 year old Shakelia Chatman, of Richmond. Chatman was cited for Identity Theft and Probation Violation and released. Williams was arrested for Identity Theft, Possession of Stolen Property, and Violation of Probation. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Attempted Residential Burglary: On December 10, 2015 at 10:29am, Officers responded to an alarm in the 400 block of Sparrow. Officers located a broken window to the rear of the residence. The residence was checked and no one was located inside. The homeowner responded and confirmed there had been no entry into the home. The homeowner said there was a suspicious male in the area prior to him leaving for work. The Homeowner said a subject rang his doorbell and when he looked out the window, the subject placed a flyer in in door and left on foot. The unknown race male lingered in the area until the homeowner left.

Vandalism: On December 10, 2015 at 6:19pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Cinnabar for a report of vandalism. The reporting party said his vehicle's rear window was shattered, by an unknown suspect, sometime today. The object used to shatter the window was a river rock

Theft of a delivery package: On December 11, 2015, at about 8:50pm, an Officer responded to a residence in the 200 block of Iris for a report of a stolen package. An anonymous citizen said he found an empty box addressed to a person living in the 100 block of Poppy. The resident was contacted and stated that the box was scheduled to be delivered to her home today. There is no suspect information.

Mail Theft/Possession of Stolen Property/Probation Violation: On December 11, 2015 at about 8:35am, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Flowering Ash for a report of a subject, wearing all black and on a mini bike, opening up mailboxes. An Officer located the subject on Pebble Bay. The original reporting party positively identified 28 year old Tiffany Nurss of Rodeo as the suspect he saw opening the mail boxes. Nurss was determined to be on searchable probation. She had mail, from the 100 block of Copper Beach Glen, on her person.

Possession of a controlled substance/ Probation violation: On December 11, 2015, at about 8:18 pm, an Officer initiated a traffic stop, on a 2003 Toyota Corolla, for a stop sign violation. The driver, 24 year old Khurram Gill of Hercules, displayed objective symptoms of being under the influence of a controlled substance. Gill handed the Officer a small clear plastic baggie containing a substance believed to be a narcotic. Gill was placed under arrest for being in possession of a controlled substance. Gill was also determined to be on Misdemeanor probation in Contra Costa County. Gill was cited and released.

Occupied Stolen Vehicle/Violation of Felony Probation: On December 13, 2015, at about at

about 2:18am, an Officer initiated a traffic stop on a red 1992 Honda Civic for driving with no lights on. Dispatch advised that the vehicle was reported stolen out of Vallejo. The vehicle was stopped. The driver, and lone occupant, 21 year old Codey Allen Peeples-Connolly of Vallejo, was taken into custody. It was determined Connolly was on Probation out of Napa Connolly was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft: On December 13, 2015, at 11:48am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Lilac Circle for the report of identity theft. The reporting party said she received a bill from Comcast for \$800.00 for a cable account, in Georgia. She did not authorize anyone to open the account.

Warrant Arrest/Possession of Controlled Substance/Unlicensed Driver: On December 14, 2015, at approximately 8:04am, an Officer stopped a black BMW for expired registration and a third brake light not working. The driver, 28 year old Martin Mota, of Pittsburg, did not have a valid driver's license. Mota also had an outstanding warrant for his arrest from Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office. Mota threw a small package out the driver's window as he was pulling into the Shell Gas Station parking lot. The package was a cigarette package, and it contained a plastic baggy. Inside the plastic baggy was a substance believed to be narcotics. Mota was arrested for possession of a Controlled Substance, the outstanding warrant, and driving without a license. Mota was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Felony Probation Warrant and Identity Theft: On December 14, 2015 at 10:25pm, an Officer stopped a vehicle for DUI indicators. During the stop the passenger, 47 year old Yolanda Anderson of San Pablo, was found to have an outstanding Felony Probation issued by Alameda County on 02/27/2015. Anderson was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. During a search of Anderson's purse, incident to arrest, the officer found two checks belonging to two people. A small notebook was also located. It contained credit card information for several accounts in different names.

Notice to Vacate Illegal Campsite: On December 15, 2015, at 11:09 am, Officers went to the area of Forest Run, at the north end of the property, where people have been camping for an extended period of time. The property is owned by the City of Hercules. The officers located a 54 year old male in the area camping. He was served with a Notice to Vacate Illegal Campsite. He had until December 18, 2015 to vacate the site. At 10:50pm a Hercules Supervisor, met with the director of Contra Costa Homeless Rescue team. Together we contacted the male, at his campsite off of Forest Run. The male was offered housing and blankets. He refused all services from the Homeless rescue team.

Outside Assist: On December 15, 2015, at 12:25pm, an Officer, responded to HPD Lobby, for a sexual assault incident which occurred in Oakland. Oakland PD was contacted and asked HPD to take a courtesy report regarding the incident. The victim is a 36 year old female adult, Hercules resident. The incident occurred between 11-22-15 and 11-25-15. A case was taken documenting the incident, and forwarded to Oakland Police Department.

CRIME PREVENTION TIP: Knocking on the door of a house, to see if someone is home, is a tactic used by many residential burglary, suspects. If the home owner answers the door, the suspect often will ask for someone he knows does not live there, or just flee. It is recommended that you not open the door for anyone you do not know, but let them know someone is at home. Talk to the person through the door. If you must open the door, for a delivery, etc. make sure you can see the subjects face and hands. If they are "bundled up", as in this incident (and/or wearing gloves), ask them to remove their hood. If they refuse, be very suspicious and do not open the door. Call the police and let us come out and check the area. The Hercules Police Department commends this resident for being suspicious and promptly calling the police.
