Mental Health Evaluation: On January 12, 2016, at 7:53 am HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of Lupine Hills Elementary School for the report of a male adult just wandering around in the area. An Officer contacted the 29 year old male, of Sacramento. The male was very unsteady on his feet, and almost fell over two times. The male said he did not know how he got to Hercules. He was unsure when he last ate, and was very confused. The male's mother was contacted and said he was supposed in San Jose on January 11; however, never showed up. The male was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. He was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Missing Person: On January 12, 2016, at 8:07 am an Officer was dispatched to HPD lobby for a missing person. The reporting party recently rented a home in Hercules when her 41 year old was relocated, by his employer, from Texas. The missing person went back to Texas and was supposed to be driving a moving truck back to California with their belongings. The reporting party last spoke to the missing person on January 10th and has not been able to reach him since. The male was entered into Missing and Unidentified Persons System. At 5:27 p.m. the Officer was notified by the male had returned home. The Officer contacted the male, in person, and removed his information from MUPS.

Courtesy Report for Outside Agency: On January 12, 2016, at 8:07 am, an Officer was dispatched to HPD for a courtesy report of a stolen rear license plate. The Hercules resident said she parked her 2007 Nissan Altima in the parking in Lincoln, CA, on January 9, 2016, at approximately 2100 hours. On January 10, 2016 at 1100 hours, she realized her rear license plate was taken from the rear of her vehicle. The plate was entered Stolen Vehicle System.

Warrant Arrest: On January 12, 2016 at 2:14 p.m. a Police Assistant advised an officer there was a male, at the front counter, with a possible arrest warrant. The adult male was attempting to get a contents release from a towed Chevy S10 pickup truck. On January 4, 2016 an officer towed the unoccupied truck for no valid registration. During an inventory search the officer found a wallet belong to 51 year old Christopher Bovee, of Martinez.

During the investigation the officer learned Bovee had an outstanding Felony No Bail Warrant issued on 12/30/2015. The wallet was placed into Evidence for Safekeeping. An officer contacted the male, at the front counter, who identified himself as Christopher Bovee. The officer verified the subject was indeed Bovee and was advised the warrant was still current and valid. Bovee was arrested for the warrant and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto Burglary: On January 12, 2016 at 5:22 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take an auto burglary report. The Texas resident said he parked his Red '13 Dodge Dart on Tsushima St. at Sycamore Ave, near the construction site, at 7:00 a.m. this morning. At 4:00 p.m. the reporting party found the right rear passenger window had been shattered. An unknown suspect stole a DeWalt Drill combo kit and an Apple Laptop computer from the rear passenger seat.
