Below is a list of all the IT items that have occurred:

1. The Aquatics computer has been upgraded, including a new cash drawer since the old one has an older interface and will not work with the new machine.

2. An operating system PTF (Program Temporary Fix) Load on the IBM iSeries server (AS400) was complete on Thursday, February 3rd.
3. A software upgrade for the City's financial software is scheduled for Friday, February 4th.
4. Time-keeping software, Executime, will be upgraded at the start of the next pay period. We will launch the new software on Monday, February 8th. A mandatory training for supervisors and/or any timesheet approvers is scheduled for Thursday, February 11th.
5. Sometime in the early morning of Thursday, January 28th, we experienced a power outage, bringing down a majority of our servers. All servers seemed to perform fine throughout the day. However, that night's backup ran exceptionally longer than usual, bringing the mail server down in the process. It was later discovered that the mail server had some corrupt virtual disk files due to the power outage earlier in the day. A restore of the server was performed and we were able to bring it back online by the end of the day on Friday. It appears that one of two of our oldest battery backup units had a battery that was faulty or no longer holding a charge. To prevent potential data corruption in the future due to power outages, both of those battery backup (UPS) units were replaced yesterday. We are also planning to replace two other battery backup units in the next few weeks.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-

related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, continue to retrofit City Hall and Senior Center outdoor lighting to energy saving LEDs, repair fencing at the Dog Park, and rebuild 2 Heritage garden signs. Staff also cleaned catch basins, removed trees that were blown over during the recent storm, coordinated with EBMUD on backflow inspections, and assisted with the remodeling work at the Senior Center.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is moving forward, but has slowed down due to the rain. Staff is focusing on the project financing and grant administration. The contractor plans to install the new sewer line on Bayfront over the next month, weather permitting, which will require some traffic detouring. The Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Community Center Parking Lot Repaving Project are substantially complete, some minor punch list items remain and are being completed as weather allows. Final grading for the Muir Pointe residential development has been completed and the developer is now installing the underground utilities. Bids for the Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant were opened and are currently being evaluated. Two bids were received, with Kiewit submitting the low bid amount of \$43,143,000, which is higher than the Engineer’s Estimate of \$39,850,000. The bids and other associated consultant contracts will be further evaluated at the Pinole-Hercules Joint Wastewater Subcommittee on February 4 and respective City Councils over the next month. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin this March or April and last approximately 2 ½ years. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward and on-track for construction this Summer.

Patrol & Investigations Priority Calls

THE FOLLOWING CASES ONLY REFLECT A PARTIAL LIST OF CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT POLICE PERSONNEL RESPONDED TO.

Mail Theft: On January 20, 2016, at about 6:40 pm, a citizen came to the HPD lobby and reported she was expecting checks, from her Bank, to be delivered to her residence sometime around December 24, 2015. She never received them. On December 30, 2015 she received a telephone call from her bank regarding fraudulent activity with the missing checks.

Warrant Arrest: On January 21, 2016, at about 1:27 am, an Officer initiated a traffic stop on a 2010 Mazda, at Dutch Elm and Mahogany, for a stop sign violation. The driver, 42 year old Brandon Christopher Cruz, of San Diego, was determined to have an outstanding cite-only warrant issued by Kern County SO. Cruz was issued a citation with a new a court date and released on scene.

Carjacking: On January 21, 2016 at 7:50 am, a Concord resident drove to Hercules to pick-up his brother. He parked on Village Park Way, in front of the Devonwood condo complex. As the brother was getting into the passenger of the van an African American male, in his 30s, 6'2, 200lbs, wearing dark clothing and armed with a handgun, contacted the driver of the van. A second African American male, in his 30s, wearing a black hoody, and blue jeans, approached the passenger. Both victims were ordered out of their 2004 white Ford work van, CA License number 8N21234. The vehicle has a roof rack and is loaded with plumbing equipment. The suspects drove Northbound on Village Parkway, towards Hercules Avenue. The victims were not injured.

Occupied stolen vehicle recovery: On January 21, at 4:36 pm, an Officer stopped a green 1993 Honda Accord, for no license plates, at 1369 Willow Avenue. The 34 year old male driver said he just purchased the vehicle. The Officer checked the vehicle identification number (VIN), and determined the Honda had been reported stolen, to Oakland PD, yesterday. The male was arrested for Possession of a Stolen Vehicle. It was determined the male is currently on Contra Costa probation for vehicle theft and was also charged with Violation of Probation. It was learned the male was in need of medical treatment. He was transported to the County Regional Medical Center and released pending completion of medical treatment.

Stolen Vehicle Recovery: On January 21, 2016, at about 9:28 pm, an Officer responded to the area of the Social Services building, located in the 100 block of Linus Pauling. Officers received information a stolen vehicle, taken earlier today in the carjacking, was seen in this area sometime today. An area check was conducted and the outstanding Ford Econoline van was not located. However, an unoccupied 1998 Honda CRV, reported stolen to Vallejo PD on 10/12/2015, was located in the southeast area of the parking lot.

Domestic Battery and Mental Health Evaluation: On January 21, 2016, at about 9:29 pm, Officers responded to a residence located in the 100 block of Copper Beech Glenn for a reported domestic battery. The reporting party, a 42 year old female, said she hit her husband and he wants to press charges against her. Officers contacted both parties and saw no visible injuries on either party. The husband said his wife struck him with a closed fist, 2-3 times, in the area of his shoulders/back. He declined medical treatment and prosecution. While speaking with the wife she made statements about wanting to hurt herself and her children. Officers determined she met the

criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Attempt Residential Burglary: On January 21, 2016, at about 10:05 pm, an Officer responded to a residence, in the 100 block of Ash Court for an alarm with the master bedroom window being the point of activation. Officers found the side gate was partially ajar, and a screen from the master bedroom window was removed. The window was broken and the window was slightly open. The residence was checked and no suspects were located and there was no other signs that entry was made into residence.

Identity theft: On January 22, 2016, at 9:12 am, an Officer processed an online report from a resident of the 100 block of Dartford. The reporting party gave his personal identifying information, and debit card number, to an apartment hoax scammer. His debit card was charged for an unauthorized Airline ticket.

Violation of court order: On January 21, 2016 at 1:26pm, a citizen reported his child's mother did not show up for their custody exchange. This is a violation of their court ordered custody agreement.

Vehicle Theft: On January 22, 2016, at about 6:53 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Paradise for a report of a stolen black 1995 Honda Civic. The Honda was last seen parked in front of the apartment complex today at about 5:30 am. The victim returned home at the time of call and saw that the Honda was missing.

Commercial Burglary: On January 23, 2016, at about 4:01 am, Officers were dispatched to Starbucks located in the 3600 block of San Pablo Avenue for a reported Burglary. Employees were on scene but the business had not been checked. Officers observed the south side window, next to the courtyard area, was shattered. Both the tills, and the four drop boxes, were pried open. No suspects were located inside the business. The employee said that no cash is left in the tills or drop boxes overnight and nothing else appeared to be missing.

Suspicious circumstance: On January 23, 2016, at 12:37pm, Dispatch received a call stating 14 year old, African American male, 5'5" tall, wearing a red top, blue jeans, red sneakers, and earrings in both ears, attempted to snatch a necklace from a 40-50 year old Filipino female. The incident occurred at the Starbucks (3700 San Pablo Avenue). The reporting party stated the female was just walking into the business, when the juvenile assaulted the victim. The juvenile was unsuccessful and was last seen running away, on San Pablo Avenue, towards Hercules Avenue. Neither the reporting party, the victim, nor the suspect could be located in the area. Another witness stated the victim left in a gray four door Honda. Store employees stated the juvenile had entered the store, prior to attempting to steal the necklace, and attempted to steal cash from the tip jar.

Fraudulent Use of an Access card: On January 23, 2016, at about 7:01 pm, an Officer took a report for a reported "shoulder surfing" incident. The incident occurred about 6:00 pm at a Bank of America ATM in the Creekside shopping center. The victim said she made a withdrawal and believed she closed out her transaction. As she walked away from the ATM she saw a White female adult, 20's, with brown hair, and a White male adult, walk up to the ATM after she used it. Shortly afterward a B of A representative called the victim to inquire if she made multiple

transactions at the ATM in Hercules. The victim was informed someone made two withdrawals, and attempted a third transaction but was denied.

Outside Assist: On January 24, 2016, at about 4:27 am, Officers responded to the BART Lot located in the 1300 block of Willow Avenue for a welfare check on an 18 year old female. The reporting party said the female was dropped off by unknown subjects. Officers contacted the female, who was crying and visibly distraught. The female stated she had been sexually assaulted in Oakland. The suspect drove the victim to Hercules and dropped her off. Oakland Police responded and transported the female back to Oakland for the investigation.

Suspicious Person: On January 24, 2016 at 11:52 am, Hercules Officers were dispatched to a report of a suspicious person seen on the Fire Trail near Forest Run. The reporting party said it was the same person who had been illegally camping behind Forest Run. Officers contacted the 52 year old male, on the Fire Trail near Forest Run. There did not appear to be an active campsite nearby. The male stated he is staying in an apartment nearby.

Battery: On January 24, 2016 at 12:06 pm, an Officer was dispatched to Circle K, 828 Willow Avenue, to take a Battery report. The reporting party said she was parking her vehicle in the parking lot of Big Lot's (1600 block of Sycamore) earlier today. She was confronted by an African American female, in her 50's, regarding how she parked. The reporting party and the suspect got into a verbal argument. The suspect pushed the reporting party, and stepped on her foot. The suspect drove away in a Red '06 Honda CR-V. An officer contacted the reported suspect and obtained a statement. The female denied pushing or stepping on reporting party's foot. The reported suspect said they only bumped into each other. An independent witness was contacted and verified the suspect's story of the two women just bumping into each other.

Warrant Arrest: On January 24, 2016 at 12:55 pm, an Officer saw 24 year old Khurram Gill walking on Redwood Road near Sycamore Avenue. The Officer was aware Gill had two outstanding cite releasable Misdemeanor Warrants. Gill was contacted and detained. The first Warrant was issued on 01/20/2016. The second Warrant was issued on 01/20/2016. Gill was cited and released, with a new court date, on both Warrants.

Hit and Run vehicle collision: On January 24, 2016 at 12:55 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the Shell Gas Station, 3900 San Pablo Avenue to take a hit and run report. The reporting party said, at approximately 12:30 pm, he was driving in the #3 lane of W/B Sycamore Avenue at Willow Avenue. A small Gray car (Unknown Make/Model) accelerated and collided into the rear of his Ford Ranger. The suspect driver initially stopped to speak to the reporting party. However, the suspect suddenly got back inside his car and drove off. The suspect was described as being in his late 20's.

Stolen Vehicle: On January 24, 2016 2:32 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a stolen vehicle report. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole her Black '97 Honda Accord, from her carport, at the Glenwood complex. The incident occurred sometime between 3:00 pm yesterday and 1:15 pm today.

Auto Burglary: On January 24, 2016 at 6:09 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 2000 block of Pheasant Drive to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party said an unknown suspect

shattered the right front passenger window of his Silver '07 Mazda 6. The vehicle was parked on the street in front of his home. The incident occurred sometime between 5:00pm – 6:00pm today.

Petty Theft from unlocked vehicle: On January 24, 2015 at 6:43 pm, a resident from the 2000 block of Pheasant Drive called to report two unknown African American male juveniles stole some items from his vehicle. The reporting party said he arrived home at 5:30 pm. He removed a music instrument from his trunk and went in the house without locking his Toyota Corolla. He returned to his vehicle approximately 30 minutes later and saw his trunk open and two juveniles running towards Cardinal Way. He was missing a flashlight and a pair of reading glasses.

Auto Burglary: On January 25, 2016 at 8:54 am, an Officer was dispatched to the 2200 block of Pheasant Drive to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party said this morning, at 8:40 am, she found her vehicle's right rear wing window had been shattered by an unknown suspect. The Silver '01 Ford ZX2 was last seen parked, undamaged, at 5:00 pm last night. The unknown suspect reached in through the broken out wing window and stole a small black bag

Mail Theft: On January 25, 2016 at 10:16 am, an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a report regarding stolen checks that were fraudulently cashed. The reporting party said she was notified, by Chase Bank, her Mechanic's Bank checks had been cashed at Chase. The reporting party stated she never received the fraudulently cashed checks in the mail and believes an unknown suspect stole them from her mailbox.

Identity Theft: On January 25, 2016 at 11:15 am, an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take an identity theft report. The reporting party said he received a letter, in July 2015, stating he had defaulted on a car loan for a purchase of a Porsche Cayenne through Pentagon Federal Credit Union (Alexandria, VA). The reporting party said he did not buy a car and ignored the initial letter. He received several other notices which he also ignored. The reporting party received a Civil Court Subpoena stating he was being sued for defaulting on the car loan for the Cayenne. A case was taken for ID theft.

Identity Theft: On January 25, 2016 at 12:48 pm, an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take an identity theft report. The reporting party stated she was recently notified, by her bank, that her account had fraudulent activity. The reporting party was issued, and mailed, a new bank debit card. However, she never received the card in the mail. The reporting party then received a letter regarding a fraudulent credit card account that was opened using her personal identifying information.

Misdemeanor Warrant arrest: On January 26, 2015 at 8:35 pm, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on a 96 GMC step side for expired registration. During the stop he determined that the passenger, 28 year old Monique Sampayo of Rodeo, had an outstanding warrant. The warrant was a no cite warrant issued on 8/24//15. Sampayo was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Driving on a Suspended Driver's License: On January 27, 2016, at about 11:08 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a Silver 2013 Nissan Altima for not displaying any license plates in the 4000 block of San Pablo Avenue. The driver was identified as 45 year old Siobhan Williams of Rodeo. Williams was found to be driving on a suspended or revoked driver's license and was cited and released.

Unlicensed Driver: On January 28, 2016, at about 1:29 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 2003 Nissan Murano at San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore Avenue for not displaying any license plates. The driver, 35 year old Kimberlee Dishmon of Rodeo was determined to be driving without a valid driver's license and was cited and released.

Recovered carjacked vehicle: On January 28, 2016 at about 8:34 am, an Officer responded to a tow yard in Vallejo to process the recovered Ford van that was located unoccupied in Vallejo after a citizen called VPD and HPD yesterday to report finding the vehicle parked IFO their home.

Warrant Arrest: On January 28, 2016, at about 10:34 am, a resident in the 100 block of Beryl Court reported two suspicious BMA's carrying backpacks ringing doorbells in the area. They were located on foot at Turquoise and Lapis and one of the subjects was identified as 48 year old Timothy Jasper of Sacramento. Jasper was found to be on probation out of Sacramento County for burglary and had an outstanding felony burglary probation violation warrant for his arrest. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility for the warrant.

Battery on School Grounds: On January 28, 2016, at about 10:34 am, an Officer took a report for a physical altercation between two male students at the Hercules Middle High School campus.

Illegal Transportation of Marijuana and Probation Violation: During the inventory of the van noted in the above incident, a large garbage bag containing about four pounds of Marijuana and a brown paper bag containing about three pounds of Marijuana were located in the rear passenger compartment. Fang was placed under arrest for Illegal transportation of Marijuana and transported to the Hercules Police Department for further investigation. Fang was later transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto Burglary: On January 29, 2016, at about 3:50 am, an Officer took a report for an Auto Burglary that was reported on-line that possibly occurred in the 1300 block of Willow Avenue sometime between 9:00 am and 8:30 pm on January 28, 2016. A car stereo, USB flash drive, garage door opener and books were taken.

Warrant Arrest: On January 29, 2016, at about 10:28 am, an Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a 2002 Honda Accord in the Park Lake Plaza shopping center for a handicap parking violation. A passenger, 56 year old Dinah Washington of Rodeo was determined to have an outstanding \$5,000 no-cite warrant for Possession of Stolen Property and Theft held by Pinole PD. Washington was placed under arrest and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Brossard was determined to be on three separate probations out of Contra Costa County and a restrained party in a court order. Vandalism and Public Intoxication: On January 30, 2016, at about 1:06 am, Officers responded to a residence in the 200 block of Scupper Court for a vandalism and intoxicated unwanted subject. The victim reported that his girlfriend, 25 year old Sakora Vernaell of Richmond punched and shattered a window near the entryway to his home after he refused her entry into the home. Vernaell was located in the parking near the residence and was bleeding from her right hand and had a small laceration on her foot from the shattered window. Upon being contacted, Vernaell exhibited obvious signs of being heavily intoxicated. The victim said he wanted prosecution against Vernaell and signed a Complainant's Arrest form. Due to Vernaell's injuries, she was transported by AMR to Kaiser in Richmond and was cited and released for vandalism and public Intoxication.

Grand Theft: On January 30, 2016 at 8:20 am, an Officer was dispatched to 215 Skelly Way to take a theft report.
