Grand Theft: On January 30, 2016 at 8:20 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Skelly Way to take a theft report. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole approximately \$4,000-\$6,000 worth of saddles, bridles, etc. from his locked shared Horse Tack room at the McCloud Ranch. The theft occurred sometime between the beginning of December 2015 and now.

Suspicious Circumstance: On January 30, 2016 at 9:24 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to Ohlone Dog Park for a report of thumb tacks being left scattered on the ground. The reporting party said he arrived at the dog park this morning at 8:30 a.m. and located approximately 100 thumb tacks scattered on the ground within the dog park. The thumb tacks were not there the night before, at 5:30 p.m. The reporting party raked the dog park and disposed of the thumb tacks.

Vandalism: On January 30, 2016 at 12:19 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Brenner to take a vandalism report. The reporting party said at 12:00 p.m. today he noticed his mailbox was damaged by an unknown suspect. He last saw his mailbox, undamaged, at 11:00 a.m. yesterday.

Auto Burglary: On January 30, 2016 at 3:59 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to the parking lot of Franklin Canyon Golf Course, 3500 Franklin Canyon Rd. to take an auto burglary report. The victim vehicle, a 08 Nissan Frontier pick-up truck, was burglarized sometime within the past five hours. A Sacramento resident said he parked his truck at 9:30 a.m. to play golf. He came back to his truck at 3:30 p.m. and found his right rear passenger window had been shattered by an unknown suspect. The unknown suspect stole a small duffel bag containing clothing valued at approximately \$200.

Driving on a Suspended Driver's License & Warrant Arrest: On January 31, 2016 at 10:02 a.m. an officer saw a Gray '13 Ford Focus driving N/B Pheasant Drive near Cardinal Way. The officer recognized the vehicle as belonging to a 20 year old female of Hercules. The officer had knowledge the owner's driver's license was suspended/revoked and that she had an outstanding, cite releasable, Misdemeanor Warrant. The officer stop the Focus and determined the driver was the owner of the vehicle. Lashay Anderson Warrant was arrested for a Warrant issued on 10/27/2015. Anderson was cited for Driving on a Suspended License. She was also cited for the Warrant and given a new court date. She was released from the scene.

Auto Burglary: On January 31, 2016 at 10:04 PM an officer located a Nike bag, with clothes and toiletries, in the gutter in the 400 block of Falcon Way. The bag did not appear to have been exposed to the weather for an extended period of time so a search for an auto burglary was conducted. The officer located a Toyota Corolla, parked in front of a house in the 300 block of Falcon Way, with a broken right rear window. A resident was contacted and he stated that the car belonged to his daughter's boyfriend. The owner of the vehicle said he he last saw his vehicle, intact, today at 3:00 PM.

Auto Burglary: On February 1, 2016 5:34 AM an officer located a 2006 white Chevrolet van, on Santa Fe at Camden, with the driver's window shattered. The owner of the vehicle was contacted and stated he last saw the van intact at 8:00 PM. The only item missing from the van was the garage door opener.

Auto Burglary: On February 1, 2016 at 8:17 a.m. an officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Devonwood to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party said he came outside, at 7:00 a.m., this morning and found the left rear passenger window of his Silver '06 Toyota Highlander had been shattered. He last saw the Highlander undamaged at 12:00 a.m. this morning. The unknown suspect reached inside Highlander and stole a Black rolling suitcase containing snow clothing. The officer located the stolen suitcase, and some of the clothing, in the area of Devonwood.

Auto Burglary: On February 1, 2016 at 8:26 a.m. an officer was doing an area check, on Village Parkway, for other auto burglaries .He located a Beige '99 Geo Prizm, parked on Village Parkway at Forest Park, with two front windows shattered. The interior of the Prizm was ransacked. The registered owner of the vehicle was contacted and already was aware the burglary. She stated she had not had an opportunity to report it yet. She came outside this morning at 6:15 a.m. and found the front windows shattered. The vehicle was undamaged at 1:00 p.m. this past Saturday,

01/30/16. The items missing were her DMV registration card and an insurance card.

Petty Theft: On February 1, 2016 at 12:17 p.m. an officer was dispatched to the 1300 block of Willow Ave. (Commercial Truck Yard) to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party stated the auto burglary occurred sometime after Friday. The officer contacted the reporting party near his White '11 Freightliner big rig truck. The reporting party said he arrived today at approximately 12:00 p.m. and saw the driver's door to his truck was open ajar. He looked inside his truck and saw several items missing from the cab and sleeping area. The unknown suspect also used black spray paint to vandalize his mattress. The reporting party last saw his truck this past Friday, 01/29/16, at 1:00 p.m.

Non-Injury Vehicle Collision: On February 1, 2016 at 5:19 p.m. an Officer was driving S/B San Pablo Ave., near John Muir Parkway. He saw two vehicles stopped and parked against the West curb. The Officer stopped to check on the driver's and learned a non-injury vehicle collision had occurred. The involved vehicles were a Silver '07 BMW X3 and a Silver '05 Infiniti G35. The driver of the X3 was found to be driving on a suspended or revoked California Driver's License, and had no proof of insurance. A report was taken for documentation.

Vehicle Theft: On February 1, 2016, at 7:47pm, a resident called from the 400 block of Turquoise. He reported his Burgundy 1990 Honda Civic was stolen within the last 10 minutes. The vehicle was parked, and locked, in front of his residence. An area check was negative.

Auto Burglary and Two Vandalisms: On February 1, 2016, at 8:15pm, and officer was dispatched to the area of Forest Run, at Village Park Way, for possible auto burglaries. The officer located three vehicles with smashed out windows. All of the vehicles owners were contacted and stated they had parked their vehicles, on Forest Run, between 5:00pm and 5:30pm. The contents of one of the vehicles was scattered on the ground, but nothing was missing. The other owners stated the contents of their vehicles appeared undisturbed.

Mental Health Evaluation: On February 1, 2016, at 9:14pm, officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Emerald Way. The reporting party stated their adult daughter was out of control. Officer contacted the female and she was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Battery on School Property: On February 2, 2016 at 11:26 a.m. a School Resource Officer took a case for an alleged battery which occurred at Hercules High School. A parent alleged a teacher put hands on their 15 year old female child. The female teacher stated she touched the student, on the shoulder, to get her attention after telling her to put away a cell phone while in class. A report was taken.

Possession of a Weapon on School Grounds: On February 2, 2016 at 2:46 p.m. a School Resource Officer investigated a report of a student possibly armed with a weapon. The officer located the, 14 year old male, student and arrested him for possession of a knife on school grounds. The knife was found inside the student's backpack. It was a kitchen pairing knife (3" blade). The juvenile was transported to Juvenile Hall.

Vandalism: On February 2, 2016 at 4:07 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Willow Ave to take an auto burglary report. The reporting party said an unknown suspect burglarized his Gray '14 Toyota Sienna sometime after 3:00 p.m. today. The Officer observed the left rear passenger window of the Sienna had been broken. The reporting party said nothing was taken from the interior of the Sienna and it didn't appear as though the suspect attempted to get inside. The Officer determined a vandalism had occurred instead of an auto burglary.
