Progress on Aventine (aka Town Centrale mixed use building)

The scaffolding has been coming down and the 4-story building reveal has progressing on the mixed use 4-story building. Building staff has been diligently working with the development team in conducting daily building inspections on various components of the interior of this exciting

mixed-use building over the last year of construction. As the building is fast approaching completion of its first phase, Planning, Building, Engineering, and Public Works staff have been coordinating multiple efforts from improvements in the right-of-way, the new parking district, and repairs to damaged areas, and timing of first tenant occupancies. Soon improvements in the publicly owned rights-of-way will be put in place, street trees and street lights will be re-installed, canopies will be added to the building, and pedestrian bulb outs will be added adjacent to the building. It is anticipated that tenants will move into the westerly half of the building in April with the second half of the building being completed several months thereafter. Keeping watching as this project nears completion.

Progress on Alexandria By the Bay by City Ventures

Thirty Eight homes have been completed within the newest subdivision and another 4 homes are anticipated to be completed next week, leaving only one home continuing its construction. Once all homes are completed, Gardenia Loop will be slurry sealed, a new design enhancement will be put in place at the entryway into the subdivision, and all landscaping, ponding basin, and playground will be inspected. It is anticipated that all work will be complete by the end of March, weather permitting.

Progress on Muir Point 144 Home Subdivision by Taylor Morrison Builders

The master house plan construction drawings have been reviewed by the Planning staff and have now been forwarded to Contra Costa County Building Division for further review and building construction approval. Additionally, the Final Map has been reviewed in coordination with City Engineering and should be presented to City Council in the month of March for acceptance and recordation.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, continue to retrofit City Hall and Senior Center outdoor lighting to energy saving LEDs, and are rebuilding 2 Heritage garden signs. Staff also oversaw the planting of 5 replacement trees at Foxboro Park, coordinated with EBMUD on backflow inspections, repaired lights in the library, and are working with PG&E to resolve power issues to street lights on John Muir Parkway.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is moving forward, but has slowed down due to the rain. Staff is focusing on the project financing and grant administration. The contractor plans to install the new sewer line on Bayfront over the next month, weather permitting, which will require some traffic detouring. The Willow Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Community Center Parking Lot Repaving Project are substantially complete, PG&E needs to raise a couple of utility boxes before the final punch list can be completed. The Bay Trail West segment is under design and slated for construction Summer 2017. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development is now installing the underground utilities. Bids for the Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant were opened and Kiewit submitted the low bid amount of \$43,143,000 which has been recommended for approval by the joint Waste Water Subcommittee and Hercules Council. Pinole will be considering award in March. Staff from Pinole and Hercules are currently working with the State Water Resources Control Board to secure the loans to fund the project. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin this March or April and last approximately 2 ½ years. Design on the Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is moving forward and on-track for construction this Summer. Staff is

reviewing the public improvements for Aventine, which could be under construction as soon as next week.

An 85 year old female was located lying in bed. Fire pronounced death at 7:08 a.m. The female had pre-existing medical issues. There were no indications of foul play. The Contra Costa Coroner's office released the body to the family.
