**Stolen License Plate:** On March 1, 2016 at 11:05 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to 900 Alfred Nobel Dr. to take a report for a stolen front license plate. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole a front license plate from his White '98 Ford F800 box truck which was parked at his business. Another license plate was found attached to the front of the box truck. The theft of the front license plate occurred sometime in the past year. They were unable to give a more specific time frame.

**Mental Health Evaluation:** On March 1, 2016 at 12:39 p.m. an officer was dispatched, to the apartment complex at 100 Civic Drive, for a report of an assault. The manager of the complex stated one of her adult female tenants reported she had been assaulted by her sister. The tenant appeared to have an injury on her face. The manager stated she has never seen a sister visit the tenant and did not see anyone today. Officers contacted the female outside her apartment. She had a cut lip/face and dried blood on her shirt. Officers saw dried blood on the kitchen floor, but no indication of a fight or struggle. It appeared the female had an accidental fall, which caused her injuries. The female appeared confused and officers determined she met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

**Outside Assist:** On March 1, 2016 at 1:52 p.m. Pinole P.D. responded to Domestic Violence incident, which had just occurred, in the 700 block of San Pablo Ave. Pinole P.D. requested a Spanish speaking Officer from Hercules P.D. to assist with translating for the victim. As the Officer was interviewing the victim the male suspect returned. The Pinole, and Hercules, Officer pursued the suspect on foot and apprehended him a short distance from the apartment. The Hercules Officer assisted Pinole P.D. with translating during their interview of the suspect.

**Hit and Run vehicle collision causing injury (Late Reported):** On March 1, 2016 at 2:34 p.m. an officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a late reported hit and run vehicle collision report. The reporting party said on February 25, 2016, at 11:30 p.m., he was riding his Red/White '00 Honda 650R dirt bike E/B Refugio Valley Rd. He turned into the entrance to Hercules High School to check on his headlight. As he slowed, to make the right turn, he was hit from behind by a Red colored unknown make/model vehicle. He was thrown approximately 30 feet from his dirt bike into the intersection. The suspect vehicle made no attempt to stop or to render him aid. He last saw the suspect vehicle driving E/B Refugio Valley Rd. The reporting party never saw the driver. The reporting party sustained injuries to his back and arms. However, he has not sought medical aid.
