Hercules Regional Intermodal Transportation Center Update

Good progress is being made on the Path to Transit phase now under construction which will extend John Muir Boulevard, construct the bridge across Refugio Creek to connect to Bayfront Boulevard, and to restore a large section of Refugio Creek. Now that we are in the dry season, the construction of the bridge can commence and work in creek bed will start shortly. Refugio Creek will be temporarily diverted from upstream of the work zone via a temporary pipe and pumps to reenter the creek bed downstream of the work area. This phase of the ITC is scheduled to be completed before the end of the year. We are working with WestCat to introduce some bus service to the waterfront area in 2017 since the Path to Transit will have been completed.

The next phase of work will be the construction of the West Segment of the Bay Trail from the future railroad plaza where Bayfront meets Railroad Avenue to the west to connect to the exiting Bay Trail heading towards Pinole. This element is in final design and environmental review and will start in 2017.

This week the City will be submitting an application for the Federal government's 2016 round of TIGER grant funding for the utility relocation phase of the project which is the next required phase. This \$17 million dollar relocation of existing fuel oil pipelines and fiber optic cables will allow for the construction of the third rail needed to allow a train to stop. The design of the utility relocation is more than 60% complete and if successful with our TIGER Grant application could also start in 2017. Construction of the third track, the passenger platform and related improvements would be the next phase and what is required to get the train to stop. The City will be seeking funds from a number of upcoming grant opportunities to secure the entirety of the funds to make this phase happen.

Sycamore Crossing Site Broker

The City has selected the firm of John Cumbelich & Associates to serve as the commercial real estate broker in marketing the Sycamore Crossing site for sale. Sycamore Crossing is the former Redevelopment agency owned site of nearly 13 acre site bounded by San Pablo, Sycamore and Tsushima. The site is zoned General commercial and will be marketed under the State's required expedited sales process as required when redevelopment agencies were dissolved. We expect strong interest in the site and look forward to working with John and his associates to market the best of what Hercules as to offer.

Safeway Interest in Hercules

Safeway still has strong interest in a new store in Hercules and have now turned their attention to

the privately owned Market Hall site at Sycamore and San Pablo adjacent to Highway 80. On Tuesday, May 10th, The City Council will be receiving an update on the property owners plans to build a stand-alone Safeway and fuel center on this nearly 7 acre site and the timing for the project to be considered by the Planning Commission and City Council.

Hercules Population Update

The State Department of Finance recently released its estimate of population of cities and counties as of January 1, 2016. In between the US census ever 10 years, population figures are provided by the State. For Hercules, our population increased to 25,578 from 24,791 the prior year or a .87 percent increase. The estimated increase for the County overall was 1.12%.

AVENTINE PROGRESS CONTINUES

You may have noticed folks parking in front of the Aventine building overnight along Sycamore Avenue. The parking district has not yet been put in place, and will be anticipated to be online in the next 1-2 months for preferential overnight parking for 45 stalls along Sycamore Avenue. In talking with the developer Carmel Partners, it is anticipated that the entire building will be complete by the end of June this year with street improvements to follow shortly thereafter. Stay tuned and keep watching while the building completion unfolds and new life is breathed into the neighborhood.

MUIR POINTE SUBDIVISION (along John Muir Parkway, west of Alfred Noble Drive)

The Final Map is getting close to being brought forward to the Council for approval and recordation of the 144 lot subdivision. Homes will look very similar to the Bayside subdivision (which is west of Sycamore between Front and Tsushima Streets) and have garages off alleyways. Two new city parks will be constructed with the project along with various open spaces and pathways and new bike lanes in John Muir Parkway. The developer Taylor Morrison hopes to be under construction with the model homes before summer.

Administrative Use Permits, Administrative Design Review Permits, Temporary Use

Permits, Home Occupations Approved by the Planning Director or the Planning Commission

- A Temporary Use Permit was approved for Home Depot to operate an outdoor rug sale from April 22 through May 22, 2016 depending on success of sales.
- A home occupation for Zenaida Cuizon at 373 Violet Road was approved for a home based office to sell sewing garments, design, patterns and arts & crafts and is required to not generate pedestrian or vehicular traffic beyond that which is normal to the surrounding area or involve the use of vehicles with 6 or more wheels for service pickup or delivery.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, filled pot-holes on Refugio Valley Road, and began season mowing at locations throughout town. They also oversaw contract moving, the repair of a streetlight that was hit by a car, sidewalk grinding repairs, and tree trimming at the Civic Center. Staff is also soliciting bids for the Refugio Valley tennis court backboard repair, sidewalk replacements at various locations to reduce tripping hazards, and lighting repairs in Victoria by the Bay.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path to Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is moving forward. The contractor has begun constructing Bayfront Bridge which will span over Refugio Creek and the creek bypass is in place. The contractor plans to install the new sewer line in Bayfront next month, weather permitting, which will require some traffic detouring. The Bay Trail West segment is under design and slated for construction Summer 2017. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development is now installing the underground utilities. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project continues to progress with construction anticipated to start in May. Staff from Pinole and Hercules are currently working with the State Water Resources Control Board to secure the loans to fund the project. The Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation Project is out for bid and on-track for construction this Summer. Construction is underway on the public improvements for Aventine. Engineering staff is working with several telecommunications contracts on the installation of dark fiber at various locations in town.

Hercules Police Department, in Conjunction with the Drug Enforcement Administration, to Participate in National Prescription Take Back Day

On April 30, 2016, from 10:00am to 2:00pm, Hercules residents may bring any unwanted prescription, or over the counter drugs, to City Hall. The drop off location will be the parking lot in front of City Hall. It is suggested all pills be removed from the prescription bottles and put in a plastic bag. Liquids should be in sealed bottles.

Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Studies show a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition the old methods of disposing of unused medicines (flushing them down the toilet, or throwing them in the trash) pose potential safety and health hazards.

If you are unable to attend this event there are Prescription Drug, and Sharps, drop boxes, just to the left of the City Hall door. Residents may drop off there unwanted prescription drugs at any time.

Search Warrant: On April 13, 2016 at 8:15am, Hercules officers executed a search warrant, in the 100 block of Paradise, regarding Identity Theft. 39 year old Sharika Shanae Foreman was arrested for Identity Theft, and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The investigation is ongoing.

Driving Under the Influence: On April 14, 2016, at about 1:52 am, an Officer was driving down the ramp from the backlot of the police department when he saw a silver 2004 Honda Accord stopped, on the embankment, along the north curb of Sycamore Avenue. A tree was in the street and had been sheared from its original location on the center median. The Honda had damage to the front end. The driver, and sole occupant, was identified as 22 year old Michael Sean Murillo, of Hercules. Murillo displayed objective symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol and a controlled substance. Murillo was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening Device indicated the subject had alcohol in is system. He also said he had taken a controlled substance. Murillo was placed under arrest for Driving under the Influence of Alcohol and/or Drugs (23152 (a) CVC) Murillo was cited and released to a responsible party.

Outside Assist: On April 14, 2016, at about 5:23am, Officers responded to a residence in the 600 block of Windsor for a reported domestic violence incident. The investigation determined the assault occurred in Richmond. Richmond PD was called and took over the investigation.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On April 14, 2016, at about 8:58 pm, Officers responded to the 800 block of Willow Avenue to meet with an AAA tow truck driver, who was in possession of a stolen 2014 Mercedes GLK 250. The tow truck driver said he was dispatched, from Mountain View, to Great America in Santa Clara. He met with an African American adult male, who identified himself using only an AAA card. This subject was accompanied by a Hispanic male adult. Neither subject had any additional identification, ignition key, or registration, for the vehicle. The African American male requested the Mercedes be towed to an address in Vallejo. The address turned out to be a liquor store/ gas station. The driver was met by several subjects and they began to offload items from the Mercedes. At this time the tow truck driver's dispatch informed him that the Mercedes was stolen and told him not to leave it. The tow truck drove away and ended up in Hercules. The Mercedes was formally recovered by HPD and towed, to a local tow yard, at the request of Santa Clara PD.

Solo injury accident: On April 18, 2016 1:37am, a 23 year old Pinole resident fell asleep driving e/b on Refugio Valley Road below the football field. Her Toyota Camry drove onto the center Island and struck a tree. The Camry then re-entered the roadway and drove over the opposite curb striking a road sign and a tree. The female was transported to Kaiser Vallejo with leg pain and had some bleeding on her forehead.

Natural Death: On April 18, 2016 at 10:29am, an Officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Regatta Point for a possible Coroner's Case. A 79 year old female was found, unresponsive, in her bed. Rodeo-Hercules Fire located the female in a downstairs bedroom. Fire pronounced the female deceased at 10:33am. There was no indication the death was suspicious; and the female suffered from several medical issues. The CCCSO Coroner's Deputy released the body to her family.

Outside Assist: On April 18, 2016 at 12:45pm, Hercules Officers were notified CHP officers were at E/B Lupine Rd. at Redwood Road. CHP Officers were behind a reported Homicide Suspect vehicle, a Black Dodge, with California plates. Officers were then advised the CHP helicopter was overhead and was requesting immediately assistance. Three adult male suspects bailed out of the car, in the 100 block of Manzanita Place. Hercules Officers arrived in the area, with additional units from CHP, Pinole, and CCCSO. Hercules officers set up a perimeter. The officer determined earlier today two female juveniles were involved in a fight, at their high school, in Rodeo. This evening one of the juveniles came to Coventry, with her mother and some other friends. During the confrontation the mother struck the 17 year old juvenile (resident of the Coventry address) knocking the juvenile to the ground. The other mother desires prosecution on the battery of her daughter. They had no visible injuries.

Copenhagen stated he had left his 5 year old son at home, alone, while he went to Casino San Pablo, and his wife was out of town. Brentwood PD conducted a welfare check, at the residence, and found the child home alone but safe. The child was released to a neighbor, with the consent of both parents. Brentwood PD will conduct the felony child endangerment investigation and add any appropriate charges. Copenhagen was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Court Order Violation: On April 25, 2016, at 10:16am, an Officer was dispatched to a Lobby Detail, regarding a court order violation. The reporting party said his ex-girlfriend (and mother of his child) is harassing him. The reporting party has an active Restraining Order against his ex, keeping her away from him and his two daughters. The reporting party stated the suspect is accessing his social media sights, without permission, which is a violation of the Restraining Order.

Evidence of cultivation of marijuana and cash was located at the Garvin Ave. address. In total, approximately 1000 marijuana plants, in various stages of growth, were recovered from both residence. Also located in the one of the bedrooms at the Crane Court house was approximately five pounds of trimmed marijuana.

Impound Vehicle: On April 27, 2016 at 3:05pm, an Officer towed a black 2002 Infinity I35 (7CHZ708) from IFO 2009 Tsushima for expired registration over six months and for parked over 72-hours without moving. The Infinity was towed by Oliver's.
