Commercial Burglary/Stolen Vehicle: On May 26, 2016 at 6:34am an officer was dispatched to a construction site at the end of the John Muir extension for a burglary and auto theft report. The reporting party reported that sometime between 3:30pm yesterday and 12:30am this morning an unknown suspect stole a white 2003 Ford F250(98459J1), two air compressors, and one generator from their construction site.

Battery: On May 26, 2016 3:51pm officers were dispatched to the business in the 1500 block of Sycamore for a report of an unwanted subject. When officers arrived it was determined that 48 year old Ana Victoria Ponceram, of Pittsburg, entered the business and attacked the victim, hitting her two times. Ponceram was transported to the police department for booking and interviewing. Ponceram admitted she assaulted the victim after she saw a video of the victim vandalizing her vehicle, which was parked in Pittsburg. Ponceram was released with a citation out for battery.

Traffic Collision: On May 26, 2016 at 3:49pm a two car non-injury collision occurred on Sycamore Avenue and San Pablo Avenue. There was minor damage to both vehicle. One of the drivers had a suspended license, no proof of insurance, and was issued a citation for the violations.

Stolen Vehicle: On May 26, 2016 at 5:53pm an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Fawcett for a report of an auto theft. The victim reported that sometime within the past hour an unknown suspect stole his gold 1997 Honda Accord (7AIC594) from in front of his residence.

Attempted Residential Burglary: On May 26, 2016 at 10:28pm officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Santa Fe for a report of an audible alarm called in by a neighbor. The neighbor reporting seeing four males get into a vehicle and flee towards San Pablo Avenue. Officers arrived and found the side garage door had been forced open causing the door frame

to be cracked. Entry was not made due to the door being reinforced with an interior door bar.

Domestic Violence – Spousal Battery: On May 27, 2016 at 12:17am officers were dispatched to a family disturbance in the 1000 block of Sanderling Street. The reporting party stated his wife just slapped him and was throwing his things around the house. Officers arrived and contacted the 28 year old male victim. The victim told officers he and his ex-fiancé (mother of his daughter) got into a heated argument and she slapped him once on his left cheek. The 32 year old ex-fiancé told Officers that she slapped the victim because he yelled at her. The victim recently served suspect with child custody paperwork and is requesting equal custody of their daughter. The victim did not desire prosecution, but a case was taken and forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for review.

Lost Property – Wallet: On May 27, 2016 at 2:38am an online police report was submitted regarding a lost wallet that occurred in the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue on May 5, 2016 at 3:00pm. The victim reporting losing his Black Tommy Hilfiger wallet containing his Chase Bank Debit card, his Mobile Chase banking information, and the PIN code for his Debit card.

Commercial Burglary: On May 27, 2016, at approximately 9:39am, a Hercules Middle School administrator reported that an overhead projector valued at \$500.00 was taken from a classroom sometime between 1:30pm on May 25, 2016 and 8:00am on May 26, 2016. This case is under investigation.

Vandalism/ Criminal Threats: On May 27, 2016 at 3:53pm officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of San Pablo Avenue for a report of a male being chased into the parking lot by a white Hyundai SUV. Once in the parking lot the driver of the Hyundai, a WMA 5'8", 200lbs and wearing all black, got out of his vehicle and kicked the victim's truck twice. The WMA also made threats towards the victim. The WMA was last seen exiting onto Sycamore. This case is under investigation.

Domestic Battery: On May 28, 2016 at 11:59am officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of North Front for a report of a domestic disturbance. The victim reported her 36 year old husband had thrown her to the floor. The husband left the residence before officers arrived, but was later contacted at his mom's house. Information gathered during the investigation lead to the husband being arrested for domestic battery and interference with an emergency communication. The husband was transported the police department, interviewed, and transported to Martinez Detention Facility. The victim requested an Emergency Protective Order, which was granted by a judge.

Grand theft: On May 28, 2016 at 1:40pm an officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Victoria Park for a report of an auto burglary. The victim last saw her unlocked vehicle yesterday at 4:00pm. When she returned to it at 10:00am this morning she saw property was missing from inside the vehicle.

Battery with No Prosecution Desired: On May 28, 2016 at 2:23pm officers responded to the 800 block of Willow Avenue for report of a physical altercation. Dispatched advised that a group of about eight BMAs and BFAs, associated with at least two vehicles, were fighting in the parking lot. It was determined that the fight only involved three BFs and it was over social media postings. The father of one of the BFJs, who had responded to pick up his daughters, broke up the fight before officers arrived. After talking to all involved parties no one wanted prosecution. All parties were identified and released. At about 4:06pm, officers were dispatched to the residence of the father who broke up the fight for three unwanted BM's at his residence. The older brother of one of the BFs involved in the fight said he came to the residence to speak with the father, after his sister told him the father had intentionally hit her in the mouth during the fight causing a split lip. The case is under investigation.

Mental Health Evaluation: On May 28, 2016 at 6:53pm officers were dispatched to a physical fight on a bus, which was stopped on San Pablo Avenue at John Muir Parkway. Officers arrived and contacted 19 year old female from Bay Point. The female was immediately confrontational and hostile towards officers. The female was upset due to the bus being on a weekend schedule and became hostile with the bus driver and other passengers. Due to the female's behavior and statements made while officers were present, she was determined to be a danger to others. She was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance for a mental health evaluation.

Warrant Arrest: On May 28, 2016 at 9:01pm officers went to a residence in the 100 block of Sweet Gum Court to attempt to serve a felony arrest warrant for 42 year old Giovanni Fuentebella. Officers searched the residence and located Fuentebella hiding in a bedroom closet. He was arrested and transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Grand Theft (handgun and cell phone): On May 28, 2016 at 10:19pm an officer was dispatched to the police department lobby regarding a theft of a loaded handgun and a cell phone. The 26 year old victim, who resides in Richmond, came to the police department lobby to report his Glock handgun and Samsung cell phone were stolen. The victim said he went to a party the prior night in San Rafael and drank heavily. He slept in his

friend's unlocked car in the 2100 block of Tsushima and the gun and cell phone were in the passenger compartment of the car when he went to sleep. In the morning when he woke up he noticed the items were missing. Although the handgun belonged to the victim, it was possessed in violation of state law. This case is under investigation.

Commercial Burglary: On May 29, 2016 at 6:45pm officers responded to the Middle High School by school security for 5 BMJs riding three of the school's golf carts around the campus. When Officers arrived on scene the juveniles had already fled the area. While checking the school grounds it was determined that the juveniles had entered the cafeteria and removed the golf carts. The golf carts were recovered on campus, but one of the golf carts was damaged.

Mental Health Evaluation: On May 30, 2016, at 9:28am a resident in the 200 block of Bobolink reported his 33 year old son was punching holes in the walls and destroying items around the house. The subject was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance for a mental health evaluation. The subject's father asked for an Emergency Protective Order which a judge granted.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On May 30, 2016 at 11:01pm an officer stopped 22 year old Jaime Williams, from Oakland, on WB I-80 between Appian and Fitzgerald for speed and DUI indicators. A DUI investigation was conducted and Williams was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and was arrested. Williams submitted to a breath test with a result of .19bac. Williams was transported to Martinez Detention Facility and her vehicle was towed.

Mental Health Evaluation: On May 30, 2016 at 11:45pm officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Paradise for a verbal domestic. A 31 year old male had threatened to hurt himself with a knife and allegedly no longer had the knife. Officers contacted the subject's wife who stated that her husband threatened to stab himself over their marriage break up. The male was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance for a mental health evaluation.

Violation of a Court Order: On May 31, 2016 at 12:44am a resident called to report that his 33 year old son was in the backyard of his residence asking to let him in the house because he had nowhere to go. The son had been served with an Emergency Protective Order the previous day protecting the father and property.

Stolen Vehicle: On May 31, 2016 at 4:58am a resident from the 1200 block of Willow Avenue called to report that his 1998 Gold Nissan Maxima

LP# 7CQV355 was stolen last night, from the street in front of the condos. The theft occurred between 9:30pm and time of call.

Residential Burglary: On May 31, 2016, at 11:34am a resident in the 200 block of Agate reported her residence had been burglarized sometime this morning. The point of entry appeared to have been the rear slider which may have been left unlocked. Four ladies purses were missing.

Residential Burglary: On May 31, 2016, at 11:34am officers responded to the 200 block of Agate for a residence that had been burglarized. As an officer approached the residence, he noticed the side gate to the residence next door was open. Officers checked the rear of that residence and found a rear window shattered and the rear sliding door open. The homeowner arrived and said nothing appeared to be missing.

Violation of a Court Order: On May 31, 2016, at 12:18am a resident in the 200 block of Bobolink reported his 33 year old son was at his residence in violation of a court order issued yesterday. The subject was found asleep on the front porch, arrested, and transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Drunk in Public & Obstruction of Justice: On May 31, 2016, at 4:20pm a Hercules Library employee reported a subject had tied up a dog outside the library. When confronted about it by the employee the subject became belligerent. Officers responded and contacted 60 year old Donald Edwards, from Rodeo, who became belligerent and refused to comply with the officers' commands. He was arrested for being drunk in public and obstruction of justice. An Animal Control Officer took possession of Edwards' dog and Edwards was transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Obstruct and Resist Executive Officer and Assault w/Deadly Weapon on Police Officer: On May 31, 2016 at 10:53pm an officer located a silver Ford, which had possibly been involved in a short pursuit with Pinole Police, at the gas pumps in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. Pinole's pursuit was quickly cancelled due to safety reasons. A male was contacted after exiting the mini mart and starting to pump gas into the silver Ford. While pumping gas the male admitted he was involved in the pursuit and was distraught. After he was done pumping gas and as another officer arrived the male was asked for identification. The male turned to the driver's area and got in the seat. Officers attempted to detain the male and a struggle ensued. The male was able to get the car started and move 20 feet before the officer was able to get the vehicle into park while it was driving forward. 23 year old Miguel Colina, from Vallejo, was arrested and transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Driving Under the Influence: On June 1, 2016 at 6:30pm Pinole Police was dispatched to a report of a possible drunk driver seen driving W/B Pinole Valley Road in a silver GMC Envoy. The reporting party stated the male driver of the Envoy was weaving and almost not stopping at stop signs. Pinole's last update was the Envoy was seen getting onto E/B I-80. A Hercules officer got onto E/B I-80 at Willow Avenue and saw a silver '99 Isuzu Trooper with a similar license plate driving E/B I-80. The officer saw the Trooper weaving within its lane and did a traffic enforcement stop on the Trooper on the E/B I-80 Cumming Skyway off-ramp. The female driver was identified as 32 year old Melissa Gwin, from Napa. Gwin displayed objective signs and symptoms of being under the influence of a controlled substance. A DUI investigation was conducted and Gwin admitted to taking prescribed pain medication (Morphine) within the past 3 hours. Gwin was arrested for driving under the influence of drugs and transported to the police department for evidence collection. A search revealed bottles of prescription medication containing Oxycodone and Morphine. Gwin was later released with a citation.

Found Property: On June 1, 2016 at 7:16pm an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Iris Road to take a found property report. The reporting party said he found mail in his garbage cans. The officer collected two bags of mail addressed to two people from Pinole and Vallejo. The mail was collected and the investigation continues to determine what type of crime occurred.

Property Damage Only Vehicle Collision: On June 1, 2016 at 8:23pm officers responded to Willow Avenue at Hawthorne for a report of a vehicle collision with possible injuries. Officers located the collision and after an investigation determined it was a non-injury collision. Officers facilitated an exchange of information.

Lost Property: On June 2, 2016 at 10:38am, an officer was dispatched to the police department lobby for lost property. The subject reported that five (5) weeks ago he left a bag containing his laptop and his hearing aid inside the Starbucks at 3700 San Pablo Avenue.

Unauthorized use of an Access Card/Identity Theft: On June 2, 2016 at 9:04pm a resident submitted an online police report regarding fraudulent charges made using a debit card. The victim reported that on May 16, 2016 he was contacted by B of A regarding unusual activity on his checking account. He contacted B of A and was told there were four charges made using his checking account's debit card at the Nike Town store in downtown San Francisco, totaling \$900. The reporting party stated he was at work in Millbrae when the fraudulent charges were made using his debit card.

Domestic Violence – Domestic Battery/Felony & Misdemeanor

Vandalism: On June 2, 2016 at 10:55pm officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Florence Court for a report of a physical fight. A 23 year old female reported her 24 year old boyfriend, from Pittsburg, had just broken out all of her windows. Dispatch advised they could hear a struggle on the phone and the female said the male was chasing her. The female told Dispatch her boyfriend fled in his vehicle. An officer located the vehicle and made an enforcement stop and determined the driver was the boyfriend. The driver had visible injuries to his head and mouth and medical assistance was requested. Officers contacted the female who showed them her mother's condo, including broken windows and sliding glass doors. The boyfriend told officers he was dropping off the female at her mother's condo after they got into a verbal argument. The female broke off his rear view mirror and used it to hit the boyfriend in the face several times. She also removed the car stereo faceplate and threw it out the window. The boyfriend responded by exiting his car, chased the female as she went inside her mother's condo. He admitted to breaking out the front windows of the condo. Both involved parties wanted prosecution against each other and they were arrested. Medical personnel responded and recommended the boyfriend be transported to the hospital for stitches. The boyfriend was released for medical purposes and the female was transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Traffic Collision: On June 3, 2016 12:30pm a two car (complaint of pain) collision occurred on San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore Avenue. There was moderate damage to one of the vehicles. Two of the involved parties were treated by Paramedics at the scene. A collision report was taken.

Warrant Arrest: On June 3, 2016 at 8:13pm officers were advised by Dispatch that 33 year old Justin Kemal, from Hercules, was at the police department for a property release. Officers were aware Kemal had an outstanding misdemeanor arrest warrant for violating a court order. Kemal was arrested and transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On June 4, 2016 at 1:43am an officer located a recently reported stolen vehicle unoccupied to the rear of businesses, in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. The vehicle, a Gray '94 Honda Accord had been reported stolen within the past 30 minutes to another agency.

Vehicle Theft: On June 5, 2016, at approximately 9:56am an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Farragut Street for the report of a vehicle theft. Sometime between last night at 10:30pm and 8:30am a 1998 white Honda Civic four door, CA 7KAG279 was taken from in front of the residence. The vehicle is distinctive as it has a black hood.

Vehicle Theft: On June 5, 2016, at 5:31pm, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Newbury for the report of a vehicle theft. Sometime between June 4th at 08:00am and today at 10:00am a blue 2001 Dodge Dakota pick-up truck, CA license plate 6T10797 was taken from Oxford Street, just east of Newbury.
