WATCH COMMANDER'S SHIFT REPORT

THE FOLLOWING CASES ONLY REFLECT A PARTIAL LIST OF ACTUAL CASES TAKEN. CALLS FOR SERVICE NOT GENERATING WRITTEN REPORTS ARE NOT USUALLY LISTED.

Interrupted Residential Burglary: On June 9, 2016 at 1:12pm, officers were dispatched to the 300 block of Carson for a report of an interrupted burglary. The resident came home for lunch and noticed his front door was open. As he entered his house, he confronted a WMA, about 6'3" with short blondish hair, wearing a blue top and white pants. The WMA dropped two pillow cases filled with the resident's property at the front door and walked past the resident. The resident called 911 and began following the WMA on foot northbound on Carson. It was later determined that the WMA was associated with a dark colored, possible gray Scion. The WMA was last seen getting into the Scion near Raleigh Court. The unknown driver then drove northbound on Carson. Entry was made by forcing the front door open. The only known take at this time is a cellphone. The residence was processed for evidence and the investigation continues.

NOTE: When calling 911 on a cell phone the call initially goes to CHP, before being transferred to our local dispatch. For emergency calls in Hercules, from a cell phone, it is recommended to call our dispatch services directly at (510) 724-1111. Plan for this type of emergency by programming dispatch's number into your personal directory where it can be quickly accessed.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On June 9, 2016 at 3:30pm, officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue for a disturbance. The owner of the Metro PCS store stated an unhappy customer threatened to beat him up and was possibly armed with a gun. The customer was contacted and he said he was at Metro PCS to see why his recently purchased phone was not working. He got into a verbal argument with the owner and left the store. The Metro PCS store owner followed him to the parking lot and challenged him to a fight. The customer got into his vehicle and drove home.

Identity Theft: On June 9, 2016 an online report was submitted for a fraudulent credit card application. The victim reported receiving a letter that a recent application was made for a PINK (Victoria Secret's) credit card. The victim notified the bank who issued the credit card to inform them of the fraudulent credit card application.

Hit and Run Collision: On June 9, 2016 at 4:59pm an officer was dispatched to the 3000 block San Pablo Avenue for a hit and run collision report. The victim reported she parked at the gas pumps when another vehicle scrubbed against her left front bumper with his vehicle. The driver did not stop his vehicle and left the area. This case is under investigation.

Mental Health Evaluation: On June 9, 2016 at 9:00pm officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Daisy for a report of a 19 year old male running around the house with a hammer and had broken the TV. The male was determined to be in need of mental health assistance and was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and Resisting, Delaying, Obstructing a Police Officer: On June 9, 2016 at 11:49pm an officer did a traffic enforcement stop on a gray 2001 Toyota Camry on Sycamore Avenue at Refugio Valley Road. The driver of the Camry immediately exited the vehicle and approached the officer on foot with an unknown object (later determined to be a cell phone) in his hands, failing to comply with commands.

The officer was able to detain the driver, who was determined to be heavily intoxicated and didn't speak English. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the police station for evidence collection. Through the use of an interpreter, the driver was identified as 39 year old Shavkat Jovmirzaey from Pinole. After an investigation and evidence collection was completed Jovmirzaey was released with a citation, to his brother-in-law.

Stolen Vehicle: On June 10, 2016 at 7:46am an officer was dispatched to the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Road for a theft report. The reporting party reported that sometime last night, unknown suspect(s) stole two golf carts from the school's cafeteria. The carts were later located near the creek in Refugio Valley Park. School personnel arrived and recovered the carts.

Identity Theft: On June 10, 2016 at 9:37am, an officer was dispatched to the police department lobby for a resident reporting identity theft. The victim reported his identifying information was being used without his permission to obtain credit.

Hit and Run Collision: On June 10, 2016 12:04pm an officer was dispatched to Turquoise and Sycamore for a report of a non-injury hit and

run collision. The victim reported her vehicle was rear-ended by the driver of dark gray or black sedan. The victim said the driver of the suspect vehicle failed to stop so she followed it and took photos of the alleged suspect's vehicle. This case is still under investigation.

Vandalism: On June 10, 2016 at 2:23pm an officer was dispatched to the police department lobby for a vandalism report. The victim is the owner of a business in the 200 block of Linus Pauling and showed the officer video surveillance from 6:00pm last night, where two male juveniles vandalizing one of the statues in front of the business. The juveniles were identified, parental contact was made, and the business owner decided to handle the vandalism as a civil matter.

Petty Theft: On June 11, 2016 at 6:17am a resident from the 100 block of Zircon submitted an online police report regarding the theft of political campaign signs from their front yard. The victim reported that on June 7, 2016 between 2:00pm – 3:00pm an unknown suspect stole a “Donald Trump for President” campaign sign from her front yard as well as 25 “Donald Trump for President” campaign signs from the front porch.

Vandalism: On June 11, 2016 at 12:43pm an officer was dispatched to Crystal Circle for a vandalism report. The victim reported that sometime today between 10:00am and noon an unknown suspect shattered the right rear window of his 2015 Chevy rental car with a BB/pellet gun.

Arson: On June 11, 2016 at 11:30pm officers were dispatched to Lookout Court for a report of a car fire. Officers located a black 2012 Honda Crosstour parked in a driveway with fire damage to the front grill and front bumper. A neighbor told officers he looked outside and saw the car on fire. The neighbor went over to the driveway and used a garden hose to put out the car fire, while his wife called 911. Officers found burnt rags soaked in gasoline and a burnt small red plastic gas can in front of the bumper of the Honda. The resident, where the Honda was parked, reported having problems with her ex-girlfriend and her ex-girlfriend's father. Leads are being investigated.

Possession of Ammunition by a Convicted Felon, Possession of a Controlled Substance (Cocaine), Possession of a Controlled Substance for Sales, Transportation of a Controlled Substance, Felony Probation Violation & Driving with a Suspended License: On June 12, 2016 at 2:50pm an officer stopped a vehicle in the 1300 block of Willow. The driver, 37 year old Lamont Robinson from Oakland, was determined to be on felony probation for burglary. A search of his vehicle was conducted and five rounds of ammunition in different calibers were located, as well as twenty small baggies containing crack cocaine (total

weight of 6.7 grams), and \$304 in currency. Robinson was arrested, interviewed, and transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft: On June 12, 2016 at 4:44pm a citizen reported, via the online reporting system, someone used his personal information to obtain an ATM card.
