Recovered stolen vehicle: On June 7, 2016 at 5:05am an officer located a 2007 Silver Toyota Camry LP# 5UNK080, unoccupied on Heather at Lotus. The vehicle was reported stolen to Walnut Creek Police on June 2, 2016 by Walnut Creek Toyota. Located in the vehicle was 41 year old Alfred Henderson's California ID card, as well as other personal property. The vehicle was also parked across the street from Henderson's sister's address. Henderson's sister said he was not at her residence, but was not cooperative with the investigation. Henderson is on probation and has a listed Benicia address. The vehicle was recovered and processed for evidence.

Mental Health Evaluation: On June 7, 2016, at 11:29am officers responded to the 3000 block of South Front for a female runaway who was acting out. Officers arrived and determined the 15 year old juvenile was in need of a mental health evaluation and she was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance.

Felony Evading/Probation Violation/Driving Unlicensed: On June 7, 2016 at 12:37pm officers were dispatched to Thistle Court for a disturbance between a male and female. While officers were responding the female reported the male was leaving in a car. The male was determined, through previous contacts, to be 25 year old Brandon Jackson. An officer observed a vehicle leaving the area at a high rate of speed and drive through a posted stop sign. A short vehicle pursuit ensued with Jackson drive into oncoming traffic and breaking several traffic violations. Jackson ultimately drove back to Thistle and submitted to arrest. He was transported to Martinez Detention Facility. Jackson is on two different misdemeanor probations in Contra Costa County.

Auto Burglary: On June 7, 2016 at 1:39 pm a victim came to the police department to report her vehicle was burglarized, when it was parked in a

Park & Ride lot located in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. Sometime between 6:30am and 9:00am someone gained access into the vehicle and took a backpack out of the rear trunk of the vehicle. Inside the back pack was a computer and \$5,000.00 in US Currency. There were no signs of forced entry into the vehicle.

Theft by False Pretense: On June 7, 2016 at 5:09pm an officer was dispatched to the 3000 block of San Pablo Avenue for a suspicious circumstance. The victim, a 63 year old male told the officer he met a BMA in his late 40's (unknown name) as he exited Costco in Richmond. The unnamed male told the victim he wanted to donate \$90,000.00 to a church, and he wanted to give the victim the money to donate. The unknown male said he needed to make sure the victim had money first, so the victim did not take the money for himself. The victim gave the male a ride to a church in Richmond where they picked up another BMA, who went by "John". The victim drove the suspect and "John" to a Bank of America in Richmond where "John" went inside and came back out with some gold coins. "John" gave the gold coins to the suspect. The victim then drove both males to Shell in Hercules and then left them at Shell. The victim drove to his home and brought back \$15,000.00 in US Currency, and approximately \$25,000.00 in jewelry. The victim gave his money and jewelry to the suspect, and the suspect put it into a green bandana. The suspect then gave a bandana, which looked exactly like the one the victim saw the suspect put his money and jewelry into, back to the victim. The victim took the filled bandana and when he got home he discovered there was only shredded newspapers in the bandana.

Note: This unfortunately is a common scam where two individuals work together to gain the confidence of the victim and trick him/her out of money. If it seems too good to be true.....IT IS.

Warrant Arrest: On June 7, 2016 at 8:03pm officers responded to a residence in the 100 block of Walnut to attempt to serve an arrest warrant. Officers contacted 21 year old Brian Veneros and issued him a citation for his cite releasable \$5000 misdemeanor warrant.

Warrant Arrest: On June 7, 2016 at 8:09pm officers responded to a residence in the 100 block of Walnut to attempt to serve an arrest warrant. Officers contacted 42 year old Jesus Mejia and issued him a citation for his cite releasable \$5000 misdemeanor warrant.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On June 7, 2016 at 10:11pm officers were dispatched to O'Neil Circle for a vehicle circling the block several times, with a flat tire. Officers located the vehicle still driving on the flat tire and conducted an enforcement stop. The solo driver was identified as 61 year old Mark Klescewski from Benicia. A DUI investigation was

conducted, which resulted in Klescewski being arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol and his company vehicle was towed. After evidence was collected Klescewski was transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft: On June 7, 2016 an online report was retrieved for identity theft. The Hercules resident reported that on May 2, 2016 there was an attempted purchase through PayPal for \$574 which was declined, however then a purchase through Ebay was completed. The victim was notified the purchased item was sent to the City of Bear, in Delaware.

Mental Health Evaluation: On June 8, 2016 at 5:43am officers were dispatched to Thrush Court for a 28 year old male who had self-inflicted wounds. Officers determined the male to be in need of a mental health evaluation and he was transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center by ambulance.
