Sycamore Crossing Site Update

As previously shared, the City has entered into an agreement to sell the former Redevelopment Agency property known as Sycamore Crossing to an affiliate of Lewis Management Corporation. Just this week all of the conditions precedent to the sale closing have been satisfied and the sale should close in the next 30 days. Lewis will then embark on the development of their plans for the site and will commence the formal entitlement process.

Additional Police Officers

Assembly Member Tony Thurmond was successful in securing a one-time grant of \$600,000 to be used over two years for the City to hire two (2) additional Police Officers. This week the City Council approved the grant and appropriated the funds for the 2016/17. We are now in the process of hiring two additional officers to help protect the Hercules community.

Safeway Update

The proposed Safeway on the Market Hall site at San Pablo and Sycamore is moving ahead. The developer and their architect, together with Safeway, have previewed their revised plans with City

staff. An application for the initial design review by the Planning Commission is expected to be submitted shortly with a target date for that review in October.

Muir Pointe Project

The models are now under construction for the 144 unit Muir Pointe project on John Muir Parkway. The developer is Taylor Morrison and more information on Muir Pointe can be found at [Taylor Morrison Muir Pointe](#).

Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Approved

The proposed restoration of the Chelsea Wetlands at Railroad and Santa Fe Avenues by Ducks Unlimited was approved by the City Council on Tuesday evening this week. The City Council considered an environmental review of the proposed restoration of the 12 acre site back into a tidally influenced wetlands. With this approval, the final permits for this grant funded project can be secured to allow construction to start in May or June of 2017.

New Parks & Recreation Director Starts

In August, new Parks & Recreation Director Christopher Roke started work here in Hercules. Christopher comes to us from the City of Concord and worked previously for two other cities. He has also worked in collegiate athletics. With degrees from UCLA and the University of San Francisco, Christopher is well equipped to lead our Parks & Recreation programs. Unauthorized use of an Access Card: On August 29, 2016 at 8:36am, an Officer responded to the Police Department lobby to take a report for an unauthorized use of an access card. The victim, a resident of Hercules, stated she was contacted by her bank regarding fraudulent activity on her account. The victim did further checking and discovered that an unknown suspect stole a new Debit card that was mailed to her house.

A consent search of the motorhome was done, but no illegal contraband was found. The driver of the motorhome was cited for several vehicle code violations and released. When Officers arrived, it was determined an unknown female suspect entered the victim's apartment via an unlocked front door and took two iPhone 6 cases. Attempt Stolen Vehicle/Vandalism: On September 1, 2016 at 4:44pm, an Officer responded to the 900 block of Valley Run for a report of a vandalism. The victim reported that her vehicle had been moved slightly and the rear window shattered.

Carjacking: On September 3, 2016, at approximately 12:28am, Officers responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue. The victim was sitting parked in his vehicle when he was approached by 2 unknown black male adults in their 20's. One suspect described as light skinned, 6'2, tall heavy build, with short hair, wearing a blue jacket, khaki pants, and white shoes. Suspect 2 described as dark skinned, 5'9, medium build, short hair and a goatee, wearing a long sleeve pink shirt with a white tee-shirt underneath, and white shoes. The victim stated that both suspect's

approached him, told him they had a gun, this was a robbery and to get out of the vehicle. The victim stated he never saw a gun. The suspect's drove away in the victim's vehicle.

Public Intoxication: On September 3, 2016, at about 8:16pm, Officers responded to the area of Hercules Avenue and San Pablo Avenue for a report of a male subject, wearing white clothing, acting suspiciously. The subject was located in the area of Hercules Avenue and Santa Fe and identified as 51 year old John Overdorf of Hayward. Overdorf exhibited signs of being heavily intoxicated. Overdorf was placed under arrest for Public Intoxication and transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Property Damage Only Vehicle Collision: On September 4, 2016 at 6:41 am, Officers responded to the area of Bayfront Boulevard at Railroad Avenue for a report of a vehicle collision. As a precaution fire and ambulance were also dispatched. The victim was checked for injuries and released to family at the scene.

Victim stated suspect, 35 year old Michael Mori, had slashed her vehicle tires. There was a brief struggle between the victim and Mori during which Mori threatened the victim with the knife. A Hercules officer located a vehicle that Mori was a passenger in. The officer stopped the vehicle and took Mori in to custody. Mori was interviewed at the Hercules Police Department before being transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Warrant Arrest: On September 4, 2016 at 4:20pm, an Officer observed William Brossard of Hercules in the 1200 block of Canterbury Street. Brossard had an outstanding cite releasable Misdemeanor Warrant. Brossard was arrested and cited out on the warrant.

Kidnapping/Domestic Violence – Spousal Battery: On September 7, 2016 at 4:31pm, Hercules Police Department Investigations was notified by Berkeley P.D. that they were out with a victim of a kidnapping that occurred in Hercules. The victim stated she was kidnapped from a residence in Victoria Crescent West. Suspect was the victim's boyfriend identified as a 20 year old male adult of San Francisco. The boyfriend drove the victim to a location in Berkeley where she was able to contact Berkeley PD. Through further investigation it was determined that there was no kidnapping. This incident is still an active investigation and the suspect is not in custody.

Suspicious Circumstance: On September 7, 2016 at 4:49pm, an Officer responded to the 1200 block of Earnest Street to investigate a suspicious circumstance. The victim stated they have noticed water in their backyard as if someone has been turning on and using their water spigot at night. They also noticed several items moved and believe an unknown homeless person is possibly responsible.

Supplement warrant Arrest: On September 7, 2016 at 10:02pm, the East Bay Regional Parks Police arrested 52 year old James Kinslow of Vallejo on our warrant. They transported Kinslow to the Hercules Police Department where he was interviewed by a Hercules officer and transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Auto Burglary: On September 8, 2016 at 1:32pm, an Officer responded to the 3600 block of San Pablo Avenue for a report of two auto burglaries which occurred within the past 15 minutes. An unknown suspect shattered the windows of both vehicles and miscellaneous items were taken. There were no witnesses or suspect information.

Resisting, Delaying or Obstructing a Peace Officer/ Possession of Marijuana in a vehicle while driving: On September 8, 2016, at 9:11pm, an Officer stopped a vehicle on highway 4 east bound just prior to Sycamore Exit for a moving violation. The driver, 22 year old Adam Kodzis of Pinole, kept reaching around in the vehicle after being instructed not to do so by officers. Kodzis was taken into custody without further incident. There was a small amount of an illegal substance located inside the car. Kodzis was arrested and cite released.

Mental Health Evaluation/Possession of Methamphetamine: On September 8, 2016, at approximately 11:10pm, an Officer observed two vehicles blocking the number 2 lane of east bound Sycamore Avenue just prior to Palm Avenue. At the same time dispatch was taking a call for a 49 year old female "freaking out", and thinking someone was out to get her. She was determined to be a danger to herself, and others and placed on a mental health hold. During the contact she was found to have a small amount of Methamphetamine on her person. She was transported to CCRMC by AMR, and a case was forwarded to the DA's office for possession of Methamphetamine.

Mental Health Evaluation: On September 9, 2016, at approximately 12:14am, Officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Redwood, a care facility, for 78 year old a dementia patient who had locked herself in her room, and was refusing to take her medications. Officers were able to calm her down, and she went to bed for the night. At approximately 6:19 am, Officers were dispatched back out to the care facility because she had locked herself in the bathroom, and would not open the door. She was determined to be a danger to herself, and was placed on a mental health hold. She was transported CCRMC by AMR.

Commercial Burglary: On September 9, 2016, an Officer responded to the 2000 block of Refugio Valley Road for a burglary. The reporting party stated when he arrived at work today at about 6:00am, he noticed the service window to the cafeteria was open. When he entered the cafeteria, he saw two office doors had been pried open. There was also damage to one of the cafeteria's cash registers. At this time the actual take is unknown.

Court Order Violation: On September 9, 2016 at 10:41am, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Paradise for a court order violation. The juvenile RP reported that the restrained party of a served protection order communicated with her in violation of the order. The restrained party was contacted and denied the allegations. There was no witnesses to this incident. A case was taken and forwarded to DA's office. This is an ongoing issue between the residents.

Mail Theft: On September 9, 2016 at 10:48am, an Officer responded to the 2100 block of Lewis for a report of stolen mail. The victim stated that an unknown suspect opened her mail and took the contents.

Hit and Run Traffic Collision: On September 9, 2016 at 10:19am, an Officer was dispatched to the Hercules Police Department lobby for a detail regarding a hit and run collision that occurred on Sycamore Avenue at Refugio Valley Road on September 1, 2016. A case was taken for investigation.

Residential Burglary/Vacant Property: On September 9, 2016 at 2:27pm, an Officer responded to the 200 block of Iris for a report of a burglary. The reporting party stated that an unknown suspect entered the residence and vandalized the entire house. The scene was processed for physical evidence.

72 Hour Psychiatric Hold: On September 11, 2016 at 7:19am, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of Pheasant Drive for a report of a disturbance. A citizen reporting party saw a female across the street who stated she needed the Police because her husband injured her hand. Officers arrived and contacted a 66 year old female of Virginia Beach, VA. She was standing on the corner of Pheasant Drive at Sparrow Drive and appeared disoriented. She had some cuts/scratches to her left hand. Officers contacted her 76 year old husband, of Virginia Beach, VA. He told Officers he and his wife have been arguing while they're visiting family on Pheasant Drive. He further stated his wife was upset and has not eaten or taken her medication for the past two days. He stated his wife was trying to walk away and leave this morning and he grabbed her to stop her. His nails were long and caused the scratches to her left hand. Officers spoke to the

wife and she also told us she hasn't eaten in two days nor has she taken her Diabetes medications. She was transported to CCRMC by AMR on a 72 hour psychiatric hold. He was given a courtesy ride to a hotel in Richmond.

Stolen Vehicle: On September 11, 2016 at 8:25am, an Officer was dispatched to the 2100 block of Redwood Road to take a stolen vehicle report. The victim checked her home's video surveillance camera footage and saw two unknown male suspects enter her vehicle and drive off the early morning. An area check was done for the victim's vehicle with negative results.

The unknown suspect also pried open the mailbox clusters inside the laundry room.
