Auto Burglary: On September 19, 2016 at 7:03 a.m. An officer responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Ave. to take a report for an auto burglary. The victim stated she parked her vehicle, went in to the store and when she returned she found her left rear passenger window shattered and her Dell laptop computer missing from the left rear passenger floorboard. There is no suspect or suspect vehicle description in this auto burglary.

Auto Burglary: On September 19, 2016 at 7:18 a.m. an officer responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Ave. to take a report for an auto burglary. The victim stated she parked her vehicle, went in to the store and when she returned she found her right rear passenger window shattered and a white bag with paperwork missing from the right rear passenger seat. The white bag with paperwork was later recovered by a citizen on the E/B I-80 Willow Ave. off-ramp and returned to the victim. There is no suspect or suspect vehicle description in this auto burglary.

Homeless Encampment – BNSF Police notified: On September 19, 2016 at 8:07 a.m. an officer conducted a pedestrian stop on a 30 year old male transient as he was pushing a loaded shopping cart on Sycamore Ave. under I-80 East of Willow Ave. The subject was found to have occupied the homeless encampment in the trees near the railroad tracks (BNSF property) that was previously occupied by another frequent male transient. The encampment has been built up with new wooden structures/tents and there is quite a bit of personal property there. The officer took photos of the encampment and told the subject he had until the end of today to vacate the property. The officer also contacted BNSF Police to notify them of the new encampment on their property. Photos were taken of the encampment and forwarded to a BNSF agent and requested they have their Public Works respond to clean up the encampment

Miscellaneous information: On September 19, 2016 at 12:33 p.m. an officer responded to the 700 block of Alfred Nobel and contacted a 28 year old female who stated her father has hit her recently and in the past. The suspect was contacted and denied all accusations. The victim left the residence to stay with another family member.

Theft by False Pretenses: On September 19, 2016 at 5:06 p.m. an officer handled an online police report regarding a phone scam theft. The victim stated he has been receiving harassing phone calls from an unknown person claiming to be an employee of Dell Computers. The suspect instructed the victim to purchase a \$150 iTunes gift card and to provide him the activation code which the victim did.

Misc. investigation: On September 19, 2016 at 6:56 PM officers responded to the 100 block of Paradise for a male and female in an altercation and that male was reported to have a firearm. As units arrived on scene, dispatch advised the subjects were leaving the area in a Toyota. The vehicle was located as it exited onto Victoria Crescent with a female driving and a male in the passenger seat. A high risk stop was conducted. A 25 year old female of Hercules and a 27 year old male subject were detained in handcuffs. The officers informed the subjects that they were being detained until the vehicle could be checked for firearms. Once it was determined that there was no firearm both were un-handcuffed and asked about the dispute. Both stated that it was verbal only. Both were released on scene. The witness was contacted and stated she heard the male subject say he had a gun. No gun was actually seen.

Solo- vehicle accident: On September 20, 2016 at 1:10 Am officers responded to a solo vehicle turnover in the 300 block of Violet Rd. Upon arrival officers located a 2016 Subaru overturned in the street with a 55 year old female driver still seat belted in the vehicle. Once RHFD arrived on scene the victim was removed from the vehicle and transported to Vallejo Kaiser as she complained of head pain. It was determined that the driver had fallen asleep at the wheel while driving home from work and hit a parked car. The parked car was then pushed into the parked car in front of it.
