Refugio Valley Tree Removal

The City's contractor has been working to remove trees along Refugio Valley this last week. These trees along the lower portion of Refugio were evaluated by an arborist and were either dead or in decline. The removal was preventative in advance of winter weather which could cause trees to fall and disrupt traffic or cause damage.

Transportation Enhancement Plan Approved

An updated Transportation Enhancement Plan (TEP) has been approved by the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) to guide upgrades and improvements to the County's transportation infrastructure into the future. The ability to fund these much needed improvements will be dependent upon what local dedicated revenues can be secured such as the sales tax measure to be considered by voters in Contra Costa County in November, which if approved, will also leverage federal, state, and other funds. AVENTINE PROGRESS CONTINUES

One hundred and twenty five (125) leases have been signed and 119 apartment units are occupied at the mixed use building on Sycamore Avenue (85% leased up, excluding the 10,000 square feet of commercial space that has not yet been rented out). Over the last week a slurry seal and new striping was laid down on Tsushima and South Front Streets, Sycamore Avenue, and the R-Alley surrounding the building. Next week Sycamore Avenue between San Pablo Avenue and South Front Street will be modified to remove one west bound travel lane to accommodate a new green bike lane and 25 on-street parking stalls and restricted use signage in order to implement the Aventine parking district (the City's 1st). Lastly, modifications will be made to San Pablo and Sycamore Avenue intersection to remove one of the northeast bound left turn lanes. It is so exciting to see this project quickly nearing full completion!!!

MUIR POINT MODEL HOMES UNDER CONSTRUCTION

The city is reviewing a batch of 30 building permits for the new Muir Pointe subdivision are under construction. Plans being built within this 144 single family detached home subdivision located on John Muir Parkway between Alfred Noble and Linus Pauling Drive by Taylor Morrison are on the City's website. It is anticipated that the models will be completed in about 3 months and sales should begin in about 45 days from a temporary trailer being setup on site. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They oversaw multiple maintenance repair contracts including sidewalk repairs throughout the City, rebuilding the Refugio Valley tennis court backboard, rewiring the traffic signals on John Muir Parkway that were vandalized by copper theft,

repairing 150 park and walkway lights in Victoria By the Bay, tree pruning and dead tree removal on Refugio Valley Road, and light replacements in the library.

Engineering – Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is well underway. The contractor is completing Bayfront Bridge which will span over Refugio Creek, the rechanneling Refugio Creek, and waterline installation. The Bay Trail West segment is under design and slated for construction Summer 2017. The developer for the Muir Pointe residential development completed the public waterline installation on Muir Point Boulevard and is installing the underground utilities on-site. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. Construction on the \$1.1M Refugio Valley Road Rehabilitation is substantially complete while construction is underway on the public improvements for Aventine. Lastly, the annual storm water report was completed and sent to the Water Board.



HERCULES POLICE DEPARTMENT

Patrol & Investigations Priority Calls

Search Warrants: On September 14, 2016, HPD executed two search warrants. One in the 300 block of North Wildwood and the second one in the 2400 block of Groveview Court in Richmond. This incident is still an ongoing investigation.

Auto Burglary: On September 14, 2016 at 2:17pm, a Victim reported that their vehicle had been parked in the 1500 block of Sycamore when the window was shattered and packages were stolen. Prior to the burglary the victim observed 3 suspicious black males on foot near his vehicle. It's unknown if they were involved.

Identity Theft On September 14, 2016 at approximately 7:50pm, an Officer responded to the lobby of the Police Department to contact the victim of an identity theft. The victim stated she received notice that two student loans were being sent to collections that she had not applied for. No suspect information available at the time of the report.

Stolen Vehicle On September 14, 2016 at approximately 11:36pm, an Officer responded to the 100 block of Paradise Drive for a stolen vehicle report. The victim stated a family member was responsible. The officer attempted to make contact with the suspect but was unsuccessful.

Petty Theft from a Vehicle: On September 15, 2016 at 8:32am, an Officer responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue to investigate a theft. The RP/V reported that sometime after 8:00am this morning, an unknown suspect entered his unlocked work truck and stole his backpack. Inside the backpack was the RP/V's driver's license, credit cards, work boots, and car keys. There are no suspect(s) or witnesses at this time.

Suspected Child Abuse: On September 15, 2016 at 9:21am, an Officer responded to the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Road to investigate a child abuse incident. A female juvenile reported that her mother assaulted her last night. The victim had minor injuries to her arm. CPS was notified. The suspect was contacted. The suspect told the officer that the juvenile had been disciplined for being disrespectful. After all parties were interviewed the victim was allowed to return home.

Identity Theft: On September 15, 2016 at 11:15am, an Officer responded to the Police Department for a lobby detail. The victim reported that an unknown suspect opened a Verizon account using his personal information.

Shoplifting/Possession on a Controlled Substance: On September 15, 2016 at 3:47pm, an Officer contacted (S) Darrell Williams in the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue. During a probation compliance search, a small amount of a control substance was located on Williams' person. Items stolen from a nearby store were located in William's backpack. Williams was arrested and cited out from the Hercules Police Department.

Restraining Order Violation: On September 15, 2016 at 6:23pm, Officers responded to the 1200 block of Canterbury for a report of an altercation between mother and son. Upon arrival, the son was no longer at the residence. The mother reported that the altercation was not physical. The son is the restrained person in a domestic protection order. The mother is the protected person. An area check was conducted with negative results.

Stolen Vehicle Report On September 15th 2016 at approximately 7:16pm, an Officer was dispatched to Amber Court for a stolen vehicle report. The victim reported her silver 2000 Volkswagen Jetta missing. Pinole PD advised that they had checked on that vehicle in the area of Monte Vista Drive and Alhambra earlier during the day and it was unoccupied. Pinole PD responded to the same area and recovered the vehicle. No suspect information available at this time.

Auto Burglary: On September 16, 2016 at 12:00pm, an Officer responded to the 3600 San Pablo Avenue for a report of vandalism. The victim stated he parked his vehicle in front of Chase Bank and went inside. The victim heard his car alarm activate but thought he accidentally activated it. When he got back to his vehicle, he saw that his rear passenger side window was smashed. There were two bags inside the vehicle in plain view but were not taken. The victim initially told officers that nothing was stolen from his vehicle. The victim called HPD later and said he forgot that his laptop and boxing shoes were in the backseat of his vehicle and were stolen.

Petty Theft: On September 16, 2016 at 4:43pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 1500 block of Sycamore Avenue for a theft that occurred forty minutes earlier. The habitual suspect was described as a light skinned black female adult, in her 20's, 5 feet tall, black hair and wearing a gray shirt with a pink scarf. No suspect vehicle seen. The take was about \$150 in cosmetics.

Injury Collision On September 16th 2016 at approximately 8:13pm, Officers responded to the area of the W/B I-80 on ramp from Willow Avenue for an unknown medical issue. Upon arrival it was determined to be a two vehicle injury collision. A 32 year old male driver of Richmond was traveling northbound on Willow Avenue and attempted to enter the W/B I-80 on-ramp. He did not yield the right of way to a vehicle that was traveling southbound on Willow Avenue and caused

the collision. The driver of the second vehicle, a 40 year old male adult of Brentwood complained of pain this head/neck/chest/shoulder and was subsequently transported to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center. The other party was transported to John Muir Medical Center. Witnesses stated that the first vehicle was driving erratically prior to causing the collision.

Battery: On September 17, 2016 at 9:06pm, Officers responded to the 100 block of Dunham Court for a report of an adult female being hit by another adult female who was family member. The victim said her and her daughter-in-law got in to a verbal argument and the daughter pushed her. The daughter-in-law stated her and her husband were arguing. She called her brother to pick her up. When her mother-in-law saw she was on the phone, she slapped the phone out of her hand. Both parties declined prosecution. The mother-in-law wanted the incident documented.

Evading a Peace Officer/Warrant Arrest/Suspended DL: On September 17th 2016 at approximately 1:23am, an Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a black 1988 Ford Mustang in the area of San Pablo Avenue and Victoria Crescent West. The vehicle failed to yield and a short vehicle pursuit was initiated. The driver lost control of the vehicle on Paradise Drive and attempted to flee on foot. He was taken into custody at the conclusion of a foot pursuit as he tried to enter an apartment (later determined to be his residence). The subject was identified as 39 year old Charles Kente Williams of Hercules. Williams is a well-known Bay Area rapper known as Keak da Sneak. Williams had an outstanding warrant out for his arrest for a probation violation and was driving on a suspended driver's license. Williams was transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

DUI: On September 18th 2016 at approximately 2:19am, an Officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of W/B I-80 and Appian Way. The driver, 23 year old Cesar Felix Hernandez of Richmond, displayed the objective symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. Hernandez was subsequently placed under arrest for suspicion of driving under the influence of alcohol. The subject was transported to the Police Department where he was cite/released at the conclusion of a blood draw.

DUI/Towed Vehicle: On September 18, 2016 at 4:28pm, an Officer checked on an occupied suspicious silver Ford Expedition (engine running) parked E/B John Muir Parkway East of Tsushima Street (Bridge). The vehicle was occupied by a white female adult driver. The officer contacted the driver and identified her as 41 year old Tami McHenry of Discovery Bay. McHenry had fresh vomit outside of her driver's door and on her driver's side running board. She also displayed objective signs and symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. The right side of the Expedition also had fresh sideswipe damage (unknown where it occurred). McHenry told the officer she left Discovery Bay and was on her way to Santa Rosa. McHenry was arrested and transported to Pinole P.D. for a breath test. McHenry was later cited and released to her Father.

Vandalism PC 594: On September 18, 2016 at 8:10pm, Officers responded to the 100 block of Juniper Court for a vandalism that had just occurred. The suspect was reported to be leaving the area in a silver cop type vehicle. Upon arrival, the officer contacted the victim and determined the suspect is her ex-boyfriend and her child's father, a 27 year old out of San Leandro. They argued tonight over the amount of time he was spending with his child and when the victim told him the leave the house, he told her he was going to key her car. When she exited the house she saw that her car had two new scratches on the hood. An area check was conducted for the suspect with

negative results.

Auto Burglary: On September 19, 2016 at 7:03am, an Officer responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Avenue to take a report for an auto burglary. The victim stated she parked her vehicle, went in to the store and when she returned she found her left rear passenger window shattered and her Dell laptop computer missing from the left rear passenger floorboard. There is no suspect or suspect vehicle description in this auto burglary.

Auto Burglary: On September 19, 2016 at 7:18am, an Officer responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Avenue to take a report for an auto burglary. The victim stated she parked her vehicle, went into the store and when she returned she found her right rear passenger window shattered and a white bag with paperwork missing from the right rear passenger seat. The white bag with paperwork was later recovered by a citizen on the E/B I-80 Willow Avenue off-ramp and returned to the victim. There is no suspect or suspect vehicle description in this auto burglary.

Homeless Encampment – BNSF Police notified: On September 19, 2016 at 8:07am, an Officer conducted a pedestrian stop on a 30 year old male transient as he was pushing a loaded shopping cart on Sycamore Avenue under I-80 East of Willow Avenue. The subject was found to have occupied the homeless encampment in the trees near the railroad tracks (BNSF property) that was previously occupied by another frequent male transient. The encampment has been built up with new wooden structures/tents and there is quite a bit of personal property there. The officer took photos of the encampment and told the subject he had until the end of today to vacate the property. The officer also contacted BNSF Police to notify them of the new encampment on their property. Photos were taken of the encampment and forwarded to a BNSF agent and requested they have their Public Works respond to clean up the encampment

Miscellaneous information: On September 19, 2016 at 12:33pm, an Officer responded to the 700 block of Alfred Nobel and contacted a 28 year old female who stated her father had hit her recently and in the past. The suspect was contacted and denied all accusations. The victim left the residence to stay with another family member.

Theft by False Pretenses: On September 19, 2016 at 5:06pm, an Officer handled an online police report regarding a phone scam theft. The victim stated he has been receiving harassing phone calls from an unknown person claiming to be an employee of Dell Computers. The suspect instructed the victim to purchase a \$150 iTunes gift card and to provide him the activation code which the victim did.

Misc. investigation: On September 19, 2016 at 6:56pm, Officers responded to the 100 block of Paradise for a male and female in an altercation and that male was reported to have a firearm. As units arrived on scene, dispatch advised the subjects were leaving the area in a Toyota. The vehicle was located as it exited onto Victoria Crescent with a female driving and a male in the passenger seat. A high risk stop was conducted. A 25 year old female of Hercules and a 27 year old male subject were detained in handcuffs. The officers informed the subjects that they were being detained until the vehicle could be checked for firearms. Once it was determined that there was no firearm both were un-handcuffed and asked about the dispute. Both stated that it was verbal only. Both were released on scene. The witness was contacted and stated she heard the male subject say he had a gun. No gun was actually seen.

Solo- vehicle accident: On September 20, 2016 at 1:10am, Officers responded to a solo vehicle turnover in the 300 block of Violet Road. Upon arrival, Officers located a 2016 Subaru overturned in the street with a 55 year old female driver still seat belted in the vehicle. Once RHFD arrived on scene, the victim was removed from the vehicle and transported to Vallejo Kaiser as she complained of head pain. It was determined that the driver had fallen asleep at the wheel while driving home from work and hit a parked car. The parked car was then pushed into the parked car in front of it.
