Hit and Run Vehicle Collision: On October 5, 2016 at 11:18 a.m. officers were dispatched to a report of a hit and run vehicle collision that just occurred in the 3900 block of San Pablo Ave. The reporting party advised a Black Nissan had just collided with a building leaving a hole in the structure. The Nissan fled the scene turning right onto Sycamore Ave. Officers checked the area but didn't locate the vehicle. A license plate on the vehicle was obtained which showed registered out of Fairfield. The officer contacted the registered owner and she told him her son was supposed to have the Maxima. When officers contacted the owner's son he stated he loaned the vehicle to a friend. The friend was contacted by officers, a 17 year old female out of Fairfield. The suspect agreed to come back to Hercules. She was found to be an unlicensed driver. When interviewed she stated she was driving South near the intersection of San Pablo Ave and Sycamore when she swerved to avoid another car speeding towards her. This caused her to collide into the building. The suspect was released and the Maxima was parked which was later returned to the registered owner.

Petty Theft: On October 5, 2016 at 12:12 p.m. an officer responded to the 1000 block of Crepe Myrtle Drive to take a report for a mail theft. The victim stated she received a phone call from Petaluma P.D. yesterday. They informed her they had two suspects in custody who were in possession of her mail.

Vandalism: An officer was dispatched to the 3700 block of San Pablo Ave for an auto burglary report. The victim of Richmond, said she parked her vehicle in the parking lot while she went in to a store. Upon returning to her vehicle she saw the vehicle's driver side rear window smashed, but no items were missing from inside the vehicle. There were several back packs lying on the backseat, but no items were moved. There is no suspect information.

Runaway juvenile: An officer responded to the 3100 block of South Front for a runaway juvenile report. The reporting party stated his 15 year old daughter had left the residence without permission. She is a habitual runaway and usually goes to a friend's house in Richmond. Officers checked the area but did not locate her. The juvenile returned home later that night.
