THE FOLLOWING CASES ONLY REFLECT A PARTIAL LIST OF ACTUAL CASES TAKEN. CALLS FOR SERVICE NOT GENERATING WRITTEN REPORTS ARE NOT USUALLY LISTED.

Identity Theft (Bobcop): On September 27, 2016 at 11:54 a.m. a supervisor handled an online report regarding an identity theft. The Hercules resident stated an unknown suspect gained access to her credit card account information and used it to make fraudulent charges, between July 27, 2016 and August 23, 2016.

Assault with a Deadly Weapon: On September 27, 2016 at 11:55 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to Amber Ct. for a report of the front door being kicked in within the past five minutes. Witnesses said a subject, known to them, had just kicked in the front door regarding a dispute over a vehicle wheel. While Officers were looking for the subject, who kicked the door, he called dispatch and stated the resident (suspect) of the apartment pulled a gun on him. The witnesses stated they saw the victim being forced away, at gunpoint from the front door area, by the apartment resident. They saw the suspect appear to pistol whip the victim before the victim fled in the 98 tan Camry. Officers checked the suspect's front door (metal door) and it appeared to have a small shoe print and the door frame was broken. Officers contacted the victim via phone and he told Officers he had an injury to the back of his neck, where he was hit with the gun. He also stated was willing to sign a Complainant's Arrest form and respond to HPD for an interview. Officers obtained consent to search the home on Amber Ct. and found a Black CO2 Airsoft pistol concealed under a table in the living room. It was collected that as evidence. The victim did not show up until approximately 5:00 p.m. to be interviewed. He did have injuries to his back/neck area consistent with being pistol whipped by a small caliber pistol. The victim was shown the Black CO2 Airsoft pistol and stated that wasn't the small Black pistol used by the suspect. The victim was released pending further investigation.

Stolen License Plates: On September 27, 2016 at 4:09 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail to take a report for a theft of two license

plates. The reporting said he parked his Wife's Red '02 Ford Focus in the parking lot of Big Lots at 4:50 a.m. this morning. When he returned to the vehicle at 4:00 p.m. this afternoon he found both license plates missing/stolen.

Coroners Case: On September 27, 2016 at 7:01 PM Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Violet for a male subject in cardiac arrest. Officers located a 90 year old male, without a pulse or breathing. An Officer started CPR but was cancelled when fire arrived. The male was pronounced deceased at 7:15 PM. The male was under a doctor's care and had numerous medical issues. No signs of foul play were present so the coroner released Singh to the family.

Residential Burglary PC 459: On September 27, 2016 at 8:21 PM Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Swallow for a residential alarm activated by a living room motion activation. The resident arrived and provided the Officers with keys. Officers conducted an interior check and located a shattered window next to the glass slider. A check of the residence was completed and no suspects were located. Home owner stated nothing appeared disturbed. A neighbor stated they drove up at approximately the same time as the alarm activation and saw a subject on a bike in front of the victim's house. The witness was unable to provide any other details regarding the rider.

Possession of a Controlled Substance: On September 28, 2016 at 1:25 AM an officer located a 1999 Honda parked in a handicapped stall at the Franklin Canyon. The vehicle was occupied by two adult males, of Oakley. While talking to the males the officer saw a black gun tucked under the front edge of the seat. A search of the vehicle revealed the handgun was an H&K replica BB gun. Located under the front edge of the passenger seat was a pipe, used to smoke narcotics. The officer also located in a bag, containing a substance believed to be a narcotic, in the rear seat. 38 year old Aracili Valadez was arrested for Possession of a Controlled Substance. She was then cited out from HPD.

Poss. of a Controlled Substance: On September 28, 2016 at 3:19 AM an officer located a blue Ford Focus with right front damage, and the driver slumped over, in the parking lot of the 800 block of Willow Ave. While checking on the subject the officer saw a folded up piece of aluminum foil with burn marks. Items of this type are often used for preparing, and using narcotics. The driver was identified as 32 year old Michael Brodeur of San Bruno. The subject attempted to conceal the burnt aluminum, so the officer had him step out of the vehicle. The officer located plastic bags; 1 containing a substance believed to be methamphetamine; 1 containing a substance believed to be heroin; and a 1 containing numerous pills

identified as methadone. Broder was subsequently arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.
