Tennis Court Practice Wall Rebuild

The rebuild of the practice wall at the Refugio Valley Park tennis courts is substantially complete. This project was funded by Landscape & Lighting District monies allocated by the City Council. The project was completed as a design/build project by Reed Co, which means that the City did not provide any plans or specs and the selected contractor designed the project and constructed it based on their design as approved by the City and the County.

Movies in the Park

The second of this year's new Movies in the Park took place on Saturday evening last week. A crowd of a couple of hundred people enjoyed Hotel Transylvania 2 which was a fitting genre as we head into Halloween season. Special thanks go to our Parks & Red crew and Recreation Coordinator Allie Ikeda for pulling together our September and October Movies in the Park.

Neighborhood Improvements

The City recently completed its annual sidewalk repair program at critical spots throughout the City. The work totaled \$65,000 and was undertaken by local contractor Larios and Sons at 21 locations throughout the City. Also, repairs are nearly complete on over 250 pathway and park lights in the Victoria by the Bay neighborhood.

Commission Vacancies

The terms of three members of the City's Finance Commission will be ending in December, 2016. The five member Finance Commission serves in an advisory role for the City regarding the City's finances and provides oversight for the City's two local tax measures. In addition, one seat on the Planning Commission is available due to the resignation of a current member. The City is currently accepting applications from Hercules residents 18 year of age or older for these upcoming vacancies which will be filled by the City Council. Sycamore Crossing Site Sold

The City, acting as the Successor to the Hercules Redevelopment Agency, closed escrow on today on the sale of the Sycamore Crossing site to Sycamore Crossing Land Developer, LLC, an affiliate of Lewis Management Corp. This site is bounded by San Pablo, Sycamore and Tsushima. The property sold for \$3.075 million and is the last of the former Redevelopment Agency properties. The developer expects to come in shortly with applications to develop the property with a mix of retail and other uses.

Aventine in Demand

The new Aventine Apartment building on Sycamore is now at 90% occupancy with just 15 units left for rent. The quick lease up of this market-rate project shows that Hercules remains a very desirable community for people to live. The developer is completing their final punch list items in addition to having recently completed the street work and striping around the project, including a new bike lane on a portion of Sycamore.

Muir Pointe Update

AVENTINE MIXED-USE BUILDING PROGRESS CONTINUES

One hundred and thirty two (132) leases have been signed and 122 apartment units are occupied at the mixed use building on Sycamore Avenue (90% leased up, excluding the 10,000 square feet of commercial space that has not yet been rented out). Last Saturday, the City's first green bike lane went down along Sycamore Avenue west bound travel lane to accommodate an improved bike lane and provide for 25 on-street parking stalls in order to implement the City first parking district for the mixed-use building. The district should be up in running in about a week as this project quickly nears full completion!!!

There is 1 studio unit at \$2,250 per month, 5 one-bedroom units at \$2,625 per month, and 9 two-bedroom units at \$2,840 per month remaining. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They oversaw multiple maintenance repair contracts including sidewalk repairs throughout the City, rebuilding the Refugio Valley tennis court backboard, rewiring the traffic signals on John Muir Parkway that were vandalized by copper theft, repairing 150 park and walkway lights in Victoria By the Bay, tree pruning and dead tree removal on Refugio Valley Road, and light replacements in the library. They also replaced stop signs, oversaw the Civic Corps maintenance in creeks, had the fountain and dome lights repaired in Refugio Valley Lake.

Engineering –Construction on the \$11.7M Path To Transit phase of the Regional Intermodal Transit Center is well underway. The contractor is completing Bayfront Bridge which will span over Refugio Creek, the rechanneling Refugio Creek, and joint trench installation. The Bay Trail West segment is under design and slated for construction Summer 2017. The developer for the

Muir Pointe residential development completed the public waterline installation on Muir Point Boulevard and is installing the underground utilities on-site. The \$46M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is moving forward, the contractor is constructing the new headworks facility and solid waste handling facility. The public improvements for Aventine were completed and the update to the City's pavement management program is scheduled to be completed at the end of the month.



AQUATICS:

Fall Swim Hours:

The Hercules Swim Center is now on its fall schedule! Lap swimming is available on Monday and Wednesday from 7:00-8:00 p.m., and Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 6:00-7:00 p.m. Participants must be 14 years and older to participate. The drop in rate per visit is as follows: Adults = \$5 residents / \$6 non-residents, and Youth 14 to 17 years = \$4 residents / \$5 non-residents.

Swim Teams:

The Hercules East Bay Silver Dolphins are now taking registration for their year round swim program from October 2016 to September 2017. To join the team, swimmers must be able to swim 25 yards unassisted; swim practices are based on the swimmer's swimming ability which is determined by the coaching staff. Beginners are classified as Spinners (\$80 per month), intermediate swimmers are classified as Age Group (\$86 per month), and the advanced swimmers are the Advance Group (\$96 per month). At the time of registration, the swimmer's first (October 2016) and last (September 2017) months dues are paid in full, as well as a USA swimmer fee of \$80. The City of Hercules has purchased a Radar Speed Trailer, which is equipped with a radar, vehicle speed display, and a speed limit sign. The trailer will be utilized to help educate drivers of their speed to assist in slowing traffic down. Speed radar display signs have been shown to slow drivers down and is more cost effective than stationing an officer to monitor speed for an entire shift. The radar speed trailer will be deployed in areas where there is a tendency for increased speeds and areas where speed complaints are received. The device also has the ability to provide analytical data for traffic flow and speed.

Auto Burglary: On September 29, 2016 at 3:18pm, an Officer responded to the 3900 block of San Pablo Avenue for a report of an auto burglary. The victim stated he parked his vehicle and went in to a store. Upon returning to his vehicle he saw that his rear driver side window was broken. Upon further inspection, the victim noticed a black computer bag containing his work issued laptop was missing. The victim later received a call from a Contra Costa County Deputy Sheriff who told him they had just located his empty computer bag.

The driver, 27 year old Vanessa Mercado of Hercules, displayed the objective symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. Coroner's Case (Natural): On October 1, 2016 at 8:48am, Officers responded to the 1100 block of Canterbury for a report unresponsive male. Officers arrived and located a 92 year old male on the floor receiving CPR from family members. The male was pronounced deceased at 9:00am by Paramedics.

Suspected Abuse: On October 1, 2016 at 1:09pm, Officers responded to the 100 block of Paradise to investigate a report of an assault. This is still an ongoing investigation.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On October 2, 2016 at 7:59am, an Officer received a LoJack notification in his patrol car regarding an outstanding stolen vehicle. The officer was notified by dispatch the LoJack hit was regarding a White '97 Honda Civic that was reported as a stolen vehicle to San Rafael P.D. The officer located the Civic parked unoccupied in the 900 block of Seascape Circle in Rodeo. The Civic appeared to have been parked there all night and a neighbor saw it parked there yesterday.

Theft by False Pretenses: On October 2, 2016 at 2:45pm, an Officer responded to the Police Department lobby detail regarding a theft. The victim stated she believes she was scammed out of \$770. The victim stated she received a phone call this past Thursday, September 29, 2016 from an unknown suspect. She was told that as a good citizen the Government wanted to give her \$9,000 but she needed to send in \$800 first. The suspect instructed the victim to purchase Apple iTunes gift cards and to provide him with the serial number from the back of the gift cards. The victim did as she was instructed and purchased the gift cards. She then called the suspect back and provided the serial numbers. She was told she would hear back from the Government regarding the \$9,000 by Saturday, October 1st. The victim didn't hear back from the suspect and called him back. She was then told she needed to provide another \$900 to get the \$9,000. This is when the victim realized she was the victim of a scam.

Identity Theft (BobCop): On October 3, 2016 at 12:19pm, a Supervisor processed an online report regarding an identity theft. The Hercules resident stated she received a letter in the mail from PayPal Credit advising they detected suspicious activity on her account. The reporting party has never opened a PayPal account nor did she authorize anyone to do so on her behalf. PayPal Credit said an unknown suspect opened the account using her name and personal identifying

information.

Ammunition turned in for destruction: On October 3, 2016 at 2:30pm, an Officer handled a lobby detail. The citizen turned in Shotgun shells, and rifle rounds for destruction.

The reporting party stated unknown suspect shattered the left rear window of the Matrix and removed a black suitcase containing his clothing.
