Attempted Residential Burglary x 2/Probation Violation: On November 28, 2016 at 10:19 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to a suspicious subject in the 1000 block of Victoria Park. The reporting party stated the saw an African American adult male, 5-7 to 5-8; wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and dark colored pants, in his neighbors back yard. The reporting party stated he last saw the subject walking towards N. Shelter Bay. Officers were circulating the area when they received a call from a resident in the 1000 block of Regatta Point. The caller stated a subject, matching the original description, was walking in the greenbelt to the rear of their house. The subject was last seen running towards the waterfront. An officer located an attempted residential burglary (window pry) at a residence in the 1000 block of N. Shelter Bay. Another caller, from the 1000 block of N. Shelter Bay, saw the subject running to the north. Officers continued to circulate the area to attempt to locate the subject. Two callers, from Harris St. in Rodeo, reported seeing the subject running to the North. An Officer located a subject, matching the description of the suspect, on 3rd St. near Harris St. in Rodeo. 24 year old Rashaan Wadley was positively identified, by two witnesses, as the person seen in the back yard on Victoria Park, and jumping fences on Harris. Wadley was arrested for two counts of attempt residential burglary, and probation violation. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Stolen Vehicle: On November 28, 2016 at 11:32 a.m. an officer responded to Ben Lomond St. to take a stolen vehicle report. The reporting party said an unknown suspect stole her Silver '99 Honda Civic sometime between 9:00 a.m. yesterday and 10:30 a.m. this morning. A neighbor had surveillance video showing the auto theft of Civic. The video shows a

Black Honda drive onto Ben Lomond, and back in next to the Civic, at 3:51 a.m. A subject exits the Black Honda and gets into the Civic. The Black Honda and the Civic then drive off.

Auto Burglary x 4: On November 28, 2016 at 1:15 p.m. an officer was dispatched to Franklin Canyon Golf Course, 3500 Franklin Canyon Rd. to take an auto burglary report for two vehicles. The officer located a total of four auto burglaries. All four vehicles were parked at the end of the lower parking lot (to the right of entrance). Two of the vehicles had the right front passenger windows shattered. An iPad was taken from one of those two vehicles. A jacket was taken from the second of those two vehicles. The other two vehicles had the driver's windows shattered.

Unauthorized use of an Access card: On November 28, 2016 at 11:55 a.m. an officer handled a lobby detail regarding an unauthorized use of an access card. A Hercules resident reported finding one unauthorized charge made to her Credit Union Visa credit card. An unknown suspect purchased items in New Jersey.

Suspicious Circumstance: On November 28, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. an Officer handled a lobby detail regarding a suspicious circumstance. The reporting party said her 12 year old daughter was approached by a Asian adult male, in his 50's, at the Hercules Library on November 23, 2016 at approximately 2:50 p.m. The male asked her daughter, if she had money to give him so he could catch a bus. When said she didn't have any money the male asked her if she wanted to go to his car and see his PS4 gaming system. The juvenile refused and went inside the Hercules Library.

Identity Theft : On November 28, 2016 a Hercules resident submitted a on line report for Identity Theft. A number of accounts were opened in her name without her permission. An officer contacted the victim to complete a more thorough report. The reporting party said she was notified, by Synchony Bank, that 4 credit cards were opened in her name. She was also contacted by Nordstrom regarding suspicious charges on that account.

Domestic battery Criminal threats: On November 28, 2016 at 8:39 PM a 21 year old Vallejo resident reported her 20 year old boyfriend, who lives in the 1000 block Chelsea, pushed her. The victim did not suffer any visible injury. The victim left the residence and went home to Vallejo. The suspect sent a text to the victim threatening her. The officer contacted the Deangelo Hernandez, at his residence in the 1000 block of Chelsea. Hernandez was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Non-Injury Vehicle Collision: On November 29, 2016 at 8:09 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Starling Way for a report of a vehicle collision involving a parked vehicle. Officers located a Tan '02 Mitsubishi Diamante, with major front end damage. The Mitsubishi collided into the left rear quarter panel of a parked Black '07 Honda Accord). The 76 year old male driver told Officers the collision was a result of having trouble seeing due to the morning Sun being in his eyes.

Cultivation of Marijuana/Grand Theft: On November 29, 2016 at 3:28 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block Swallow Way. The owner of the house said she was renting to some people who recently moved out and she thinks it was a Marijuana grow house, based on the damage inside. Officers were already familiar with this location as a possible Marijuana grow house. The reporting party said on November 3, 2016 she drove by her rental house and saw the front windows were blocked off in violation of her rental agreement. The reporting party/owner made contact at the house was met by a male, not the renter. The male refused to let owner inside the house for an inspection. The owner returned the next day with a notification of inspection but no one answered the front door. The owner mailed the legal notice of inspection. On November 9, 2016 the owner returned for the noticed inspection. Upon entry she observed extensive damaged to the interior. False walls had been put up, and there were holes in the ceilings/walls. Officers observed water damage to the bedroom floors; holes in the ceiling where grown lights had been hung; and black mold throughout some of the bedrooms. The unknown suspects also removed and stole the home's washer & dryer.

Identity Theft (BobCop): On November 29, 2016 at 6:07 p.m. a supervisor handled an online police report regarding an identity theft. The Hercules resident stated that she was checking her Savings account, online, and she noticed some fraudulent activity that occurred on November 25th, and 28th.
