Miscellaneous: On December 8, 2016 at 1:17pm, an officer responded to the Police Department lobby detail regarding stolen property. The victim reported items are missing from his deceased brother's home on Glasgow Court.

Strong Arm Robbery: On December 8, 2016 at 1:20pm, officers responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Ave for an in-progress robbery. The victim reported that an African American male in his mid 20's, 6'3", with an afro, wearing a black hoodie, walk up to her and took a Macbook Air laptop out of her hands. The suspect ran to a gold Nissan Maxima and got into the passenger's seat. The Maxima was last seen eastbound on Sycamore Ave. towards Lucky. An area check was done with negative results.

Resisting/Obstructing an Officer/Battery on an Officer: On December 8, 2016 at 3:03pm officers made contact with a disruptive juvenile in the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Road. The juvenile became combative with an officer and was taken in to custody and transported to Juvenile Hall.

Theft: On December 8, 2016 at 3:39pm, officers responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Drive for a fraud in progress. The caller stated there was a customer inside the store trying to cash a fraudulent check and attempting to use an expired credit card. It was later determined that a theft had occurred. The suspect was described as a heavy set African American female with short hair. The subject fled prior to the officer's arrival driving a gold Honda Accord.

Found Property: On December 8, 2016 at 4:38pm, an officer took a report for a found ID card.

Miscellaneous Investigation: On December 9, 2016 at 11:12am, officers responded to the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Road for a report of a physical altercation between a male and female. Both parties were contacted and it was determined that no crime occurred.

Non-Injury Collision: On December 9, 2016 at 5:58pm, officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave for a three car traffic collision. There were no visible injuries and no complaint of pain. The collision caused minor to moderate damage to all three vehicles.

Lost Passport: On December 10, 2016 at 2:12pm, an officer responded to the 2100 block of Railroad Avenue for a report of a missing passport.

Driving Under the Influence: On December 10, 2016, at approximately 10:15pm an officer conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle in the 4000 block of San Pablo Avenue. The driver, 49 year old Ralph Short of Hercules, displayed the objective symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol. Short was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI, transported to the Police Department and cite released to a relative.

Auto Burglary: On December 11, 2016, at approximately 3:19am, officers responded to the area of Hercules Ave and Titan Way for a report of a suspicious vehicle. When officers arrived they contacted the owner of the vehicle who stated she parked her vehicle on the street. Upon returning to her vehicle she found that the front windows had been smashed out and her trunk open. A Michael Kors purse, a bag full of clothing and miscellaneous cash were missing from the vehicle. There is no suspect information available at this time.

Auto Burglary: On December 11, 2016, at approximately 6:45am, officers responded for an auto burglary in the 3700 block of San Pablo Avenue. When the victim returned to her vehicle she found the vehicle window smashed, her Louis Vuitton purse and wallet missing. There is no suspect information.

Petty Theft: On December 11, 2016 at 7:27 a.m. officers responded to the 100 block of Hidden Cove for a report of an auto burglary that had just occurred. The reporting party stated they had video surveillance camera footage of a suspect trying to break into her father's vehicle. The suspect was described as a Caucasian or Hispanic male in his 30's, 6'0, wearing a white sleeveless shirt, white shorts and white shoes, driving a small black

vehicle similar to an early '00's Chrysler Sebring. The victim stated the suspect opened her father's truck bed cover and removed an extension cord. Officers arrived and conducted an area check with negative results. Officers arrived and did an area check but didn't locate the suspect vehicle.

Prowling: On December 11, 2016 at 10:10 a.m. officers responded to the 1000 block of Regatta Point for a report of a suspicious event. The resident reported watching his video surveillance camera footage and observed an African American male open his front yard's gate to enter his front porch area, walk up to his front door and look at a package. The suspect then walked away from the front door and left the front yard in an unknown direction. The suspect was further described as being approximately 5'10", with some stubble on his face, and wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt. Officers checked the area, but didn't locate the suspect.

Auto Burglary/Vehicle Tampering: On December 11, 2016 at 1:56pm an officer responded to the Police Department lobby for a report of an auto burglary and vehicle tampering that occurred in the 400 block of Weymouth. The victim stated an unknown suspect forced entry to the rear door lock on her parked vehicle.

Unauthorized Use of an Access Card: On December 11, 2016 at 5:07 p.m. an officer handled an online police report regarding unauthorized charges on the victim's credit card. The victim of Port Hueneme, CA. stated she was notified by her credit card's fraud department of two possible fraudulent charges that occurred in the 1500 block of Sycamore Drive in Hercules.

Auto Burglary: On December 12, 2016 at 6:16am officers responded to the 3700 block of San Pablo Ave for an auto burglary that had just occurred. The suspect vehicle was described as a newer gray Nissan driven by an African American male. The victim stated the suspect smashed both passenger side windows of his vehicle and stole his galaxy S7 and backpack containing prescription medication.
