ULI Technical Assistance Panel

A video of the presentation made by the Urban Land Institute Technical Assistance Panel on Friday, January 23rd is now available on the City's website together with the power point presentation made as part of the report. The Panel made numerous suggestions for moving development on the Bayfront forward in a manner which will help ensure the achievement of the long held vision for the area.

Town Centrale Update

Full construction should start soon on the completion of the long-stalled four story mixed use building on Sycamore now known as Town Centrale. Last week the construction plans were finally approved and the developer was able to pull their building permits and paid all of the building permit fees.

Alexandria at Victoria by the Bay

I had a chance to preview the model home under construction at Hercules's newest residential community – Alexandria at Victoria by the Bay. The model is expected to open at the end of February and the developer reports tremendous interest in these 43 new homes at San Pablo and Victoria Crescent East with some already reserved. Queen Anne House

Hercules has a very unique history as a company town and efforts are underway to try to preserve the few remaining historic buildings which we have in town. The City Council recently discussed the remaining historic buildings which are in need of restoration and reuse and some goals have been set for those privately owned properties to be addressed. The City owns one building, the Queen Anne House, which is temporarily stored on the City's Corporation Yard site. The City is hoping that some interested citizens or local groups might step up to get the house moved to its permanent site in Duck Pond Park where a pad has been prepared and that the restoration could be a community led effort. If you know anyone who folks or groups that might be interested in stepping up to lead this effort, please let me know.

Muir Pointe

The engineering and site development plans for the 144 unit Muir Pointe development on John Muir Parkway are being reviewed by the City and our consulting engineers. Lewis Operating Companies is looking to start their site preparation and utility work in the summer and plan to have their model homes completed just after the first of the year in early 2016.

SHARE YOUR IDEAS for a portion of the San Francisco (SF) Bay Trail in Hercules Field Meeting on Tuesday February 17, 2015 at 4:00 pm

As mentioned in the October City Manager's Newsletter, the East Bay Regional Park District has received Measure J maintenance grant funds for a 2,400' portion of the SF Trail in Hercules north east of the Pinole Creek bridge (as highlighted in the dashed area below). Work includes 1) putting crack and slurry seals over the existing paved trail 2) removal and/or thinning of non-native Eucalyptus and Cypress trees that are overhanging or becoming a long term nuisance to the trail and 3) planting of new trees. The Park District and the City would like to meet at the corner of Railroad and Santa Fe Avenues to gather additional community input before finalizing the project specifics. Hope to see adjacent residents, trail users and interested community members in your walking shoes before the sun goes down, because your voice counts!

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations – In addition to completing regularly scheduled janitorial and other facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings, field staff repaired lights and power-washed concrete at the Grand Staircase at Victoria By the Bay, repaired streetlights at miscellaneous locations throughout town, cleared a clogged sewer line at the Community Center, and beautified the grounds around the Community Center with mulch recycled from trees damaged by the last storm. Most recently, staff cleared debris and leaves from drain pipes and inlets in preparation for the coming storm. Additional sandbags and sand were also stockpiled at City Hall and the Community Center.

Engineering – Construction on the \$6M Bay Trail phase of the Intermodal Transit Center continues and is approximately 50% complete. 95% plans for the Path to Transit phase were completed and staff is working with the environmental regulatory agencies to secure the permits on this project. Construction is in progress on the Victoria Crescent residential development and sidewalk repairs along Sycamore Avenue are being completed in front of the Creekside Center by Depot/Creekside Center. Grading and improvements plans for the Muir Pointe residential development are being reviewed and plans for the public improvements for Sycamore Crossing were submitted.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Records Division serves as the central repository for official police reports generated by calls for service made to the department.

Location/Hours of Operation:

Located at 111 Civic Drive. Hours of operation are 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Thursday, furloughed on Friday and closed on all city observed holidays.

To Obtain Copies of Police Reports and Traffic Accident Reports:

Police reports may be obtained in person or by mail by completing a public records request. Please see below for the Request Process and Schedule of Fees. Victims of domestic violence or identity theft may receive one free copy of a report in which they are listed as the victim (this does not include video/audio tapes or photos). *A victim is described as a person against whom the criminal offense has been committed, or if the person is killed or incapacitated, the person's spouse, parent, child or other lawful representative, except if the person is in custody for the offense or is accused.*

Request Process:

Requests for all Public Records may be made in person at the Police Department main lobby or you may use the Public Records Request form provided below for mail-in requests. (Electronic, telephonic or fax requests are not accepted.) Mail-in requests should be addressed: Hercules Police Department, Records Division, 111 Civic Drive, Hercules, California 94547; checks made payable to the City of Hercules. Please provide as much information as possible, i.e. type of record, report number (if available), date, time, location of the incident, name(s) of the person(s) involved, etc. Reports are 25 cents per page. Once you turn in your request to the records department, your request will be processed and you will hear from our department within 10 days of the date of request if your report was approved or denied for release. If your report is approved for release, please make sure you bring your ID and payment with you on the date of pick up.

Patrol Highlights

Possession Of Stolen Property/Conspiracy/ Probation Violation Vehicle Theft/Possession Burglary Tools: On January 22, 2015 at 4:02 p.m. an officer observed 45 year old male sitting in 2004 GMC pickup, for an extended period of time, in the Home Depot parking lot. A second occupant, a 48 year old male, was sitting in the pickup truck. The second male, was observed entering a vehicle (Lincoln) which was parked next to the pickup. The second male returned to the pickup and both subject drove out of the parking lot, in the pickup. The officer observed the pickup's third stop lamp was inoperable. The officer conducted a vehicle enforcement stop, on the pickup for an equipment violation. A records check revealed both males were on searchable probation for out of Alameda County. Officers checked the Lincoln, still parked in the Home

Depot parking lot. The Lincoln had been stolen, earlier today during a residential burglary in Fairfield; and the vehicle keys were also missing. A vehicle key, and key fob for a Lincoln, was observed on the second males lap. The key started the Lincoln. The investigation showed the victim (a Fairfield Resident) had his vehicle burglarized, while he was in Suisun, earlier in the day. Part of the loss, from the vehicle was the garage door opener, and vehicle registration showing the victim's home address. The suspects went to Fairfield and burglarized the victim's home. The suspects gained entry, to the house, with the stolen garage door opener. The suspects stole the victim's second vehicle, from inside the garage (the Lincoln recovered in Hercules). The vehicle's key was stolen from inside the house. A search of the pickup revealed all of the stolen items from the vehicle burglary, and registration papers from the stolen Lincoln. Officers also found several tools commonly used to commit vehicle/residential burglaries. Both suspects were transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On January 24, 2015 at 8:09 a.m. an officer located a reported stolen 1996 green Honda Accord in the 200 block of Cardinal. The Honda was reported stolen to Vallejo PD on January 16, 2015.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On January 24, 2015 at 4:55 p.m. an officer located a reported stolen 1995 Tan Toyota Camry on Daisy at Poppy. The Camry was reported stolen to CHP Oakland on January 24, 2015.

Counterfeit Bills Passed: On January 25, 2015 at 9:48 a.m. an officer was flagged down by the Manager at Starbuck's, 3700 San Pablo Ave. regarding counterfeit bills. The Manager, said she wanted to report two counterfeit bills (\$50.00 bill and \$20.00 bill) were discovered when she took a bank deposit to the bank this past Friday, 01/23/15. The manager stated both counterfeit bills were passed between 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, 01/22/15 and 2:30 p.m. on Friday, 01/23/15.

Driving on a Suspended Driver's License/Warrant Arrest/Towed Vehicle: On January 25, 2015 at 10:02 a.m. an officer did a traffic stop on a Black '00 Buick Le Sabre. The 34 year old male driver was from Crockett. The male was driving on a suspended or revoked driver's license. He also had an outstanding Misdemeanor Warrant out of Solano County Sheriff's Office, issued 06/20/2012. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft: On January 26, 2015 at 2:43 p.m. an officer was dispatched, to the 100 block of Scotts Valley, to take a report for an identity theft. The victim said she received a bill in the mail from "giinnys.com". The bill stated she owed approximately \$600.00 for two charges that were completed on an unauthorized credit account opened in her name. Both items were shipped to an address in Richmond. The victim stated she did not open the credit account, nor did she authorize anyone to open the account on her behalf. The company provided the victim with the name, and the Richmond, CA address, where the items were sent. The 46 year old female resident was found to be on Felony Probation. A Detective did a Probation Search at the Richmond address, and located stolen mail. The female was arrested for Identity Theft.

Residential Burglary: On January 26, 2015 at 5:16 p.m. an officer was dispatched, to the 700 block of Windsor, to take a report for a residential burglary. The victim said she arrived home to find her condo had been burglarized by an unknown suspect. The burglary occurred sometime between 10:00 p.m. last night and her arrival home at 5:00 p.m. this evening. The unknown suspect shattered the glass door that leads to the master bedroom. The loss included Jewelry, cash, and personal paperwork.

Driving under the influence: On January 26, 2015 at 8:34 PM Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of 1000 Tugboat Lane for damaged van possibly driven by an impaired driver. An officer located the damaged Toyota Sienna parked at the curb. The 61 year old male driver, of the van, was sitting across the street in a white Mercedes. A witness confirmed the identity of the driver of the van. The subject stated he was driving home from a friend's house, in Oakland, and he hit an unknown object on the freeway. Due to medical issues the subject was unable to perform the Standard Field Sobriety Test. He was able to complete the Preliminary Alcohol Screening (PAS). The subject was determined to be under the influence of alcohol, for the purposes of driving. The male was cited and released to a responsible party.

Residential Burglary: On January 27, 2015 at 11:46 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Swallow Way for a residential burglary report. The victim stated she left at 8:30 a.m. this morning and returned at time of call to find her bedrooms had been ransacked. The point of entry was a bedroom window (window smash). The loss included jewelry, electronics, and household items.

Possession of Marijuana for Sale (Edible Chocolate Chip Cookies) and Child Endangerment: On January 27, 2015 at 1:40 p.m. a School Resource Officer received information that a 16 year old male student had Marijuana laced chocolate chip cookies for sale. The Officer contacted the student and found a plastic Tupperware container in his possession. Inside the container were 17 individually wrapped chocolate chip cookies. The student also had a cookie in his pocket. The officer conducted a "presumptive test", for a controlled substance, on one of the cookies. The cookie tested presumptive positive for the presence of THC (Marijuana). The student also had \$44.00 in cash (ones and fives) in his possession. The student was arrested for Possession of Marijuana for Sale and Child Endangerment. He was transported to the Contra Costa County Juvenile Hall. The Officer was not able to determine if any of the chocolate chip cookies were actually sold to any students. There are no reported incidents of illness at this time. The school is notifying the parents of all the students.

Stolen Vehicle Recovery: On January 30, 2015, at approximately 9:32 p.m., an officer ran the license plate on a 2014 Ford Explorer. The vehicle was exiting the shopping center of 844 Willow. The vehicle was reported stolen to SFPD today. A felony stop was conducted and the driver was detained without incident. The driver turned out to be the registered owner of the vehicle. The driver reported his vehicle stolen to SFPD, today, because his son had taken the vehicle without his permission. The owner recovered his own vehicle, but did not report the recovery to the police department. The owner did not wish prosecution against his son, and only reported his vehicle stolen to teach his son a lesson.

Interrupted auto burglary/attempt vehicle theft: On January 31, 2015 at 5:21a.m. a citizen, walking their dog, came across a male subject possibly burglarizing a parked vehicle. The vehicle was parked in the 100 block of Fawcett. The subject was described as an unknown race male; 6 feet tall; and wearing a black hoodie and dark blue jean. The suspect was last seen running on foot up Santa Fe from Fawcett. An officer confirmed an auto burglary had taken place with a loss of approximately \$700 in tools. The vehicle also had fresh ignition damage and it appears the suspect also attempted to steal the vehicle.

Petty Theft: On January 31, 2015 5:21 p.m. a resident, from the 200 block of Brighton, came to HPD to report a theft. The reporting party said, sometime yesterday, someone stole her purse from her unlocked vehicle.

Winter Storm Watch

The National Weather Service has advised the following: “A significant winter storm is expected to bring rain, high winds and associated hazards to the Bay Area. The storm will cause travel difficulties, dangerous conditions on the area waters, the potential for flooding, and downed trees and power lines across the Bay Area.”

The City of Hercules suggests all residents take reasonable precautions to prepare for this storm. For more information please go to the Hercules Police Department website and click on Emergency Preparedness.

- 1) Have plenty of flashlights and batteries on hand (candles are not recommended)
- 2) Make sure your cell phone (and standby battery) is fully charged at all times
- 3) Have food sources which can be consumed without cooking
- 4) Have blankets and warm clothing available
- 5) Do not use BBQ's, or propane cooking (or heating) devices inside the home
- 6) Stay off the roads when possible
- 7) Do not drive through standing water, you never know how deep it really is
- 8) Be careful of downed trees and power lines and do not touch any downed wires
- 9) Clear away any and all debris around sewer drains
- 10) If you have had previous flooding, or are in a low lying area, have sand bags available
- 11) Avoid driving through large bodies of water or fast moving water. If you see a road blocked by barricades or the police do not attempt to drive around.
- 12) Know alternate routes to and from your residence.

City of Hercules Sand Bag Location Information

During rainy months, sandbag stations are available at City Hall and the Hercules Community Center. These locations are stocked with sand, a shovel, and empty sandbags. The "fill-your-own" sandbag station is located at:

- City Hall (111 Civic Drive, Hercules, California), located in the City Hall parking lot.
- Hercules Community Center (2001 Refugio Valley Road, Hercules, California), located in the parking lot.

Residents must provide their own transportation. The winter storms are here! **BE PREPARED!**

How to Use Sandbags

- Fill sandbags one-half full. Fold the top of the sandbag down and rest the bag on its folded top. Sandbags should be placed tightly together and tamped down to ensure they are firm.
- Free standing barriers should be limited to three layers of sandbags, and each layer should be stacked so that the sandbags are offset from the layer below it. If there is water flow, the folded end of the sandbag should be placed towards the direction of the water flow so that the sand will not leach out.
- If the sandbag barrier is adjacent to a building, lay a plastic sheet between the building and the sandbag barrier. The plastic sheet should be placed underneath the bottom row of the sandbag barrier and extend behind the barrier and up the wall or door. Since the sandbag barrier is against a solid surface, it can be built up to two feet high. As mentioned above, sandbags should be placed tightly together and tamped into place with off-setting rows. The sandbag barrier should also extend on both sides beyond the area you are protecting.
- In preparation to the predicted storm event, Public Works crews have been cleaning catch basins and storm culverts over the last several days. They are prepared to respond to emergencies during non-working hours if needed and will be monitoring areas that have been prone to flooding in the past.

The City of Hercules Emergency Operations Division is prepared to respond to any and all incidents and has stock piled equipment and supplies to handle these types of events.
