City Streets Get Passing Grade

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission just released a report on the condition of local streets for communities throughout the Bay Area. Streets in Hercules were rated as "Good" and the following link will take you to the MTC site and more information: http://www.mtc.ca.gov/news/street_fight/pci_2014.htm. Certainly, we need to be investing more in our street maintenance program and are going to be making some improvements to some key streets over the next year. Later this year we expect to start on the rehabilitation of Willow between the Highway 4 overpass and Sycamore. In 2016, we are going to rehabilitating Refugio Valley Road with grant funds we have secured.

Sycamore Crossings Project

The developer of the Safeway anchored Sycamore Crossings project, Terramar, advises that they have submitted for their permits from the regional water agencies. Since there is a creek and other designated wetlands on the site, submitting for and securing their regional permits is a key effort. With the permit application and supporting documentation now submitted, we are hoping for a reasonably quick turnaround to allow the project to proceed to the construction phase. More information as to timing will be known in early summer.

Historic Structures Field Meeting

Property Owner David Curry is hosting a community field meetings to discuss his plans for the three historic structures on his property on Railroad Avenue. The meeting will take place on Thursday, April 24th at 6 PM. The Masonic Lodge will be open for tours for anyone interested in seeing the interior of the building.

On Tuesday evening this week, the City Council made appointments to the Planning Commission and the youth member of the Community & Library Services Commission. Congratulations to

returning Planning Commissioner Susan Tolley and new Planning Commissioners Hector Rubio and William Wilkins. Di Angelo Soriano will be joining the Community & Library Services Commission as the Youth Member.

Mandatory Water Rationing

The Board of the East Bay Municipal Utilities District voted this week to institute mandatory water use reduction by 20% for all customers. EBMUD is the water service provider for Hercules. They will be using 2013 as the base year. This means that if you reduced 15 % in 2014 then you must now only reduce by an additional 5 %. The City will also be having to comply with these mandatory reductions so you may start to see some impact in landscaped areas like parks and medians, though we are looking at ways to mitigate any impacts.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations –Staff completed their regularly scheduled janitorial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings, repaired street lights throughout town, replaced street signs that were faded or damaged by graffiti, continued to repair lighting in Victoria By The Bay, and assembled trash cans obtained through grant funding. M&O staff also coordinated with the West Contra Costa County Integrated Waste Management Authority on solid waste issues, Ducks Unlimited on the Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, and provided direction to the City’s landscape maintenance contractors on water reduction strategies. Sidewalk repairs were completed at approximately 10 locations throughout the City. Lastly, the bid package for contract landscape maintenance for the City’s lighting and landscaping districts has been completed and will be advertised for bid this coming Monday, April 20.

Engineering –Construction on the \$6M Bay Trail phase of the Intermodal Transit Center (ITC) continues and is approximately 65% complete. Staff is working with the environmental regulatory agencies to secure the permits for Path to Transit, which is the next phase of the ITC project and scheduled to go out to bid this May. The Willow Avenue rehabilitation project is under design. Staff has issued an encroachment permit for Town Centrale to install a storm drain line across South Front Street so minor traffic delays may be experienced when traveling on this street. The 90% plans for the \$48M Pinole-Hercules Waste Water Treatment Plant are undergoing a quality assurance and quality control review by Carollo Engineers, who will be performing the construction management.

Unauthorized use of Access Card: On April 6, 2015, at approximately 9:56 a.m., a Hercules resident came to HPD to report her ex-girlfriend, used three of her credit cards without her permission.

Fraud: On April 6, 2015, at 2:25 p.m., an officer responded to HPD for a fraud report. Two Manteca residents reported they paid a travel agent (based in Hercules) to book them round trip flights to the Philippines. When they went to get on their plane to come back home they found out the return flight had been cancelled. The reporting parties attempted numerous phone calls to the suspect, when they were stranded in the Philippines. When they returned home, they have not been

able to contact her. The reporting parties had to pay for a one way tickets home one day later.

Vehicle Theft: On April 6, 2015 a Hercules resident came to Hercules Police Department to report his Brown, 1993, Honda Accord stolen. The reporting party lent his vehicle to a friend (who is transient), on April 2, 2015 at 9:30 a.m. and she will not return the vehicle. The reporting party has talked to the suspect, several times, and she refuses to return the vehicle. An officer made several attempts to contact the suspect, via phone calls, and was unable to make contact with her. The officer left several messages for the suspect but she has not returned any of the messages.

Miscellaneous Investigation (Dog Bite): On April 6, 2015, at 11:13 p.m. Officers responded to the area of Sanderling, and Baywood, for a dog bite victim. The responsible dog, a brown pit bull, was still on the loose. The pit bull had no collar and eventually strayed onto the front porch of a residence in the 1100 block of Baywood. Officers had to use pepper spray to snare the dog and place in a patrol vehicle. Animal control responded to the PD and picked up the dog. The dog bite victim had a small hand scratch or puncture because the victim tried to get between her dog and the pit pull during the attack.

Identity Theft: On April 7, 2015, at approximately 1:30 p.m., a Hercules resident came to HPD to report an identity theft. On April 6, 2015 the reporting party contacted the IRS to see if they had received the E-file for his taxes. The IRS informed him someone had already filed taxes using his personal information.

Identity Theft: On April 7, 2015, at 11:25p.m., a Hercules resident reported receiving a Nordstrom's Debit card, in the mail, she did not authorize. There was a secondary name and possible El Sobrante address on the account. The reporting party went to the El Sobrante location and confronted the resident before calling the police to report the crime. The resident denied any criminal involvement.

Suspicious Circumstance: On April 8, 2015, at approximately 3:57 p.m., HPD Officers were dispatched to the area of the 2100 block of Railroad Avenue. Two callers reported seeing three African American male juveniles, and one Asian male juvenile all approximately 16 years old acting suspiciously. One of the subject was described as wearing a burgundy hoody, and one wearing a camo hoody. Two of the subjects had guns in their waistbands. An officer arrived in the area and located four males matching the descriptions, and detained them. One of the callers reporting parties said the subjects were on the side of his business in the bushes prior to our arrival. There was a back pack located, which had two BB guns inside of it. All four subjects were positively identified as being the males seen in the area, and two were identified as having a gun in their waist band. The investigation revealed the four juveniles had purchased an item, another juvenile, and were dissatisfied with their purchase. The four juveniles said they were trying to get the money back. There were no specific threats made, and the guns were only seen in the waist band of two of the subjects. A case was taken, and all juveniles were released to parents.

Attempted Residential Burglary: On April 8, 2015, at approximately 3:58 p.m., a resident from the 2300 block of Forest Run reported she heard some noise in front of her residence. When she went to look out a side window, and observed three African American males, between 18 to 20

years old, with thin builds, trying to open one of her windows. One of the males had removed the screen and was attempting to push the window open. She pounded on her front door and the males all ran away. There was damage to the screen; however, entry was never made into the residence.

Identity Theft: On April 8, 2015, at approximately 7:55p.m., a HPD Officer was dispatched to the lobby of HPD for an identity theft report. The reporting party said someone filed a tax return using her personal information.

Theft: On April 10, 2015 at 11:21a.m., an officer responded to HPD for a lobby detail. The reporting party was notified, by her bank, that there were suspicious charges on her account. An unknown suspect fraudulently used the reporting party's debit card information without consent.

False Impersonation: At 3:21 p.m. the wife, from the above incident, called and said she had documents that would send her husband to prison. The wife showed officers a California

Identification Card, a Social Security Card, and a Puerto Rican Birth Certificate; all in the name of a 35 year old Puerto Rican citizen. 38 year old Joao Oliveria Do Nascimento's (the husband) picture was on the ID. The officer contacted the husband, via phone, and he admitted purchasing the birth certificate. He used the birth certificate to get a CA ID and a SS number. Nascimento came to HPD and was arrested for False Impersonation and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Arrest: On April 13, 2015, at 07:19 a.m., officers responded to the 100 block of Dove Court for an unwanted subject. Officers arrested 21 year old Victor Hernandez, from Hercules, for three outstanding felony warrants involving auto theft and possession of stolen property. Hernandez was transported to County Jail.

Based on the video, the caller believed her friend was at Refugio Valley Park. The park and all nearby areas were checked with negative results. Shortly after, it was determined the subjects was at a relative's house in Solano County.

Possession of a Loaded Firearm in a Vehicle; Possession of Marijuana while Driving a Motor Vehicle: On April 14, 2015, at 4:18 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on the on-ramp to I-80 from Willow. While contacting the driver, the officer smelled marijuana coming from the vehicle. The officer searched the vehicle and found a loaded firearm along with a small amount of marijuana. The driver, 26 year old Stephen Montgomery from San Francisco, was arrested and transported to County Jail.

Identity Theft: On April 14, 2015 at 7:49 PM a Hercules resident reported that an unknown subject opened a Kohl's account in her name and then made two purchases maxing the account out.
