Mental Health Evaluation: On December 30, 2015 at 8:11 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Pepperwood St. for a report of a disturbance. The reporting party said her 20 year old brother was tearing up the house. Officers could hear loud yelling coming from inside the house. The male came outside and was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. He was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Lost Property/Identity Theft/Forgery: On December 30, 2015 at 9:17 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail regarding lost property. The reporting parties said yesterday morning they removed their respective backpacks from their car and accidentally left them on the curb in the 100 block of Walnut Ct. Both backpacks were apparently picked up by an unknown suspect. The unknown suspect cashed two checks, belonging to one of the reporting parties, at two different Chase Bank locations in Vallejo. The unknown suspect also went online and attempted to change the account information belonging to the second reporting party.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol & Suspended driver's license:

On January 1, 2016, at about 2:39 am, an Officer initiated a traffic stop, on a 2003 Jeep, for a speeding violation. The driver, 30 year old Jony Villanueva of Pittsburg, was determined to be driving while his driving privileges were suspended. Villanueva displayed objective symptoms of being intoxicated. Villanueva was administered the Standard Filed Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated Villanueva was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. . Villanueva was placed under arrest and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Petty Theft: On January 1, 2016 at 10:59am an officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Taraya for a report of an auto burglary. The reporting party said sometime after 1:00am this morning someone stole a pair of glasses, makeup, FastTrack and other miscellaneous item from her unlocked vehicle.

Drinking Alcohol in City Park/False Tab- Towed Vehicle: On January 3, 2016 at 9:24 a.m. an officer checked on an occupied vehicle backed in to a parking space at Refugio Valley Park. The Red '92 Pontiac Bonneville had expired registration as of July 2015 (last fees paid in 2014). The driver was found to have a suspended or revoked driver's license. The rear license plate of the Bonneville had a 2016 year tab affixed. The driver was in possession of an opened can of Mickey's beer. 51 year old Charles Fleming, of Rodeo, was cited for the muni code violation and released.

Miscellaneous Incident: On January 3, 2016 at 10:48 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to a suspicious event in the 1500 block of Swallow Way. Dispatch advised a neighbor saw a male subject ring the doorbell of this house before walking over to the left side of the house and hopping over the fence. The male was associated with a Gray Honda Civic parked further down the street. Officers found a garbage can tilted over on its side in front of the side gate on the left side of the house. Officers, in full Police Uniforms, checked the front door and found it unsecured. Officers opened the front door and made an announcement for anyone inside to show themselves. A few minutes later, a Caucasian male adult wearing black basketball shorts and a green t-shirt appeared in the foyer of the house. Officers challenged the male and he turned and ran back inside towards the left side of the house. Another Officer saw the male run out of

the left side of the house. The male was told to stop but ignored the verbal command. The male was then seen running Westbound in the greenbelt away from the house. A short time later a male called Dispatch and said he was the resident and was scared off by people entering his house. He was told it was the Police and asked to step outside and he complied. The male turned out to be a resident of the house. Officers explained the circumstances surrounding the call and discussed why officers entered the house. The male told the officer a friend hopped over his fence but would not identify the friend. The male was advised to identify himself and not run if he is contacted by the Police.
