Stolen Vehicle: On January 5, 2016 at 8:03 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Canterbury St. to take a stolen vehicle report. The reporting party stated an unknown suspect stole his '99 Toyota Camry, from the street in front of his house, sometime between 5:30 p.m. last night and 7:00 a.m. this morning.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On January 5, 2016 at 8:21 a.m. an officer did an area check on Canterbury St. for any dumped stolen vehicles. The officer located an unoccupied stolen vehicle parked in the 1100 block of Canterbury St. The Silver '95 Acura Integra was stolen from San Pablo on 01/03/16. The car stereo and speakers stolen from the interior.

Recovered Stolen US Mail: On January 5, 2016 at 9:03 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to a gulley across from Camden Lane. A citizen located US mail, and a box, which appeared to have been stolen. The Officer located various pieces of mail stolen from mailboxes in the Promenade area (some mail dated 12/30/15). An empty Amazon box was also found among the mail. The Officer collected the mail and Amazon box and brought it back to HPD. The mail and Amazon box was turned over to US Postal Inspector.

Lost Property: On January 5, 2016 at 10:50 a.m. a supervisor processed an online police report regarding a lost wallet. The reporting party stated she lost her Black Leather Marc Jacobs wallet at the BART Transit Lot yesterday, 01/04/16 between 4:30 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.

Miscellaneous Incident/Mental Health Evaluation: On January 5, 2016 at 2:26 p.m. The Watch Commander received information about a 20 year old female possibly being held against her will. An officer contacted the reporting party who said his friend messaged him on Facebook and told him she was being held against her will at an apartment complex in Hercules. The officer was able to ping the female's cell phone. The

coordinates came back to an apartment in the 100 block of Paradise Drive. Officers contacted all the occupants of the apartment and searched the interior and found no indication of suspicious, or illegal activity. An Officer identified, and interviewed the female who had been communicating with the reporting party. The female first stated she had been held against her will. During the interview the female's behavior became erratic. She told the officer she was "crazy" and wanted to talk to a doctor. The female was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance to the County Regional Medical Center.

Vandalism 594(2)(a) PC: On January 5, 2016 at 7:01 PM a property owner reported the bathroom window at her rental property, in the 100 block of Dove Ct, was broken. The house is currently vacant and was seen intact on January 3, 2015.
