Possession of a Controlled Substance/Warrants/Identity Theft: On February 4, 2016 at 5:06pm an officer was conducting a security check of the Home Depot parking lot. He observed an older green Honda Civic, which was parked, with two occupants inside the vehicle. The vehicle had paper plates and no other form of visible registration. The officer contacted an adult female sitting in the driver seat and asked her if the vehicle belonged to her. She told him she just purchased it. The female verbally identified herself, as she didn't have any ID on her and recently came back from Massachusetts. She said she was 35. She provided a certificate of title with the VIN number that did not match the VIN on the vehicle's dashboard. The adult male passenger verbally identified himself. The officer searched the vehicle for the driver's ID. During a search of the vehicle the officer located a smoking glass pipe commonly used to smoke illegal narcotics. The officer also located a Ziploc baggie containing a substance believed to be a narcotic. The officer found a black bag and two old laptops that belonged to Santos. The bag contained evidence of identity theft. Both subjects were placed under arrest and later fingerprinted via livescan. The female was asked repeatedly if she was truthful about her name and she said she was. The officer prepared a citation to cite her out on the misdemeanor drug charge. Before she was released, the officer received information that the female lied about the name. Her true name is Cheyanne Colman, 19 of Pacifica. Coleman was found to have 5 outstanding warrants for her arrest for drugs and theft charges. Colman was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. 35 year old Johann Santos was cited and released on misdemeanor ID theft charges.

Attempted Strong Arm Robbery: On February 4, 2016, at about 9:48 pm, Officers responded to the Lucky Supermarket, located in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave, for a reported robbery which had just occurred. Officers contacted the 61 year old female victim. She stated she was getting out of her vehicle when she was approached by an African American Male adult,

about 6 feet tall, wearing a black jacket. The subject told victim to "Give me your purse." She told the subject "No". She ran into the supermarket. The victim did not see any weapon nor did she hear the suspect state that he had one. An area check was conducted and the suspect was not located.

Robbery, Burglary, Domestic Battery & Wireless Communication

Devices: On February 4, 2016, at about 10:22 pm, Officers responded to an apartment in the 100 block of Paradise Drive for a CHP transfer that disconnected. Officers contacted the victim and she said the 32 year old father of her child was over visiting. She asked him to leave because her children were going to bed. The suspect left but returned a couple minutes later and stated he wanted to stay. When the victim refused to let him in he kicked in the front door. The suspect forcibly removed victim's cell phone from her hand, as she was calling 9-1-1, and left in an unknown direction. The victim had multiple scratches on her right hand but declined medical treatment.
