Found Property: On February 18, 2016 at 1:00pm a citizen turned in a brown tri-folder with two California identification cards inside. The folder was found near Foxboro Park. The folder and its contents were logged into evidence as found property at HPD.

Metal Health Evaluation: On February 18, 2016 at 3:12pm officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Emerald regarding an adult female yelling and screaming. Officers contacted the female in front of her residence. The female was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Stolen Vehicle: On February 18, 2016 at 4:57pm an officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Crepe Myrtle for a report of a stolen vehicle. The reporting party last saw his '99 Tan Altima, parked in front of his house, about a month ago. The reporting party thought his vehicle was towed because the registration was outdated, until he received a toll violation in the mail. The vehicle was entered into the Stolen Vehicle System.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On February 18, 2016, at about 9:27 pm, an Officer was stopped at the intersection of Beechnut and Redwood Rd. He observed a 1998 Dodge Durango, traveling at a speed in excess of 50 mph, northbound on Redwood Rd. The officer stopped the vehicle for a speed violation and a false registration tab. The driver, 33 year old Tedros Yohannes of Hercules, showed obvious symptoms of intoxication. There were also several bottles of alcohol in plain view. Yohannes was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Testing device indicated Yohannes was over the presumptive level for the purposes of driving. Yohannes was placed under

arrest for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity theft: On 2/19/16 at 12:12 pm, a Hercules resident reported that she was a victim of ID theft. A large amount of cash was withdrawn from her B of A account without her permission.

Warrant arrest: On 2/19/16 at 4:12 pm, an officer observed an occupied black Ford Explorer, with no license plates, had spun out into the wet mud at the WB-80 onramp from Willow. One of the passengers, 38 year old Tiffany Smith, of Vallejo, had a no cite Solano County misdemeanor warrant. Smith was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The Ford was dislodged from the mud, by Freeway Service Patrol, and parked at the parking in the 800 block of Willow. The 29 year old female driver of Berkeley, and her two children, were given courtesy rides to Burger King.

Auto Burglary: On February 19, 2016, at about 9:43 pm, an Officer responded to a residence in the 100 block of Marsala Ct for a reported auto burglary. The victim stated she last saw her 2007 Hummer, undisturbed, parked in the parking lot in front of her residence at about 9 am this morning. At about 9:43 pm, she discovered that the front passenger side window shattered, but was still intact. The rear driver side cargo area window was shattered. The loss was a back pack, and electronics.

Residential Burglary: On February 20, 2016, at about 12:10 am, an Officer responded to a residence in the 100 block of Beryl Ct for a reported burglary. The victim said she left her residence at about 9:45 am this morning and returned at about 9 pm and saw that the living room window was broken and the residence had been ransacked. The items taken include electronics, cash, and jewelry.

Battery: On February 20, 2016 at 11:49am officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Sycamore on a report a man had punched a woman. Officers contacted a 39 year old female reporting party, of Rodeo. Officer also contacted a 60 year old male, of Rodeo, who was the reported suspect in the incident. The female was visibly upset. She stated the male had punched her on her left shoulder, with his fist, after she got into a verbal argument with male's wife. The incident occurred inside the post office. The male said he only touch the female's shoulder to try and clam her down. There were no witness located that saw the incident. The reporting party had no visible injuries and declined medical.

Battery: On February 20, 2016 at 2:44pm officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Skelly for a report of an assault. The reporting party was gone

when officers arrived. He was contacted by phone and declined to come back to the scene. He said he would come to HPD when he could. The other party was at the scene. He said there was an argument but no punches landed. Deposition pending contact with the reporting party.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On February 21, 2016, at about 2:25 am, an Officer initiated a traffic stop, on a 2016 Volkswagen, at I-80 EB at the Cummings Skyway off ramp for a speed violation. The driver, 22 year old Sofia Perez-Leon of Richmond, displayed objective symptoms of being under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. Perez-Leon was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated she was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. She was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. She was later cited and released to a responsible party.

Missing Person – Silver Alert Activation: On February 21, 2016 at 9:33am an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Grissom St. to take a missing person's report. The reporting party reported his 89 year old Father as a missing person (MP). The MP was last seen leaving a family member's home, in Brentwood, yesterday at 2:50 p.m. The MP was driving an off White '86 Oldsmobile Station Wagon. He was possibly in-route to an unknown location in Antioch. The family has not heard from the MP and he doesn't have a cell phone. The MP reportedly had some existing medical conditions. The officer put out an area wide bulletin and contacted CHP for a Silver Alert activation. At 2:01 p.m. CHP activated the Silver Alert for seven counties. At 5:20 p.m. the Police Department was notified the MP returned home to Hercules. The subject was interviewed and appeared to be fine. The Silver Alert was deactivated at approximately 5:30 pm.

Mental Health Evaluation: On February 21, 2016 at 1:11 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the Glenwood for a welfare check on a possibly suicidal subject. The reporting party was in phone contact with an adult male, Hercules resident. The reporting party said the subject said he was having suicidal thoughts. Officers contacted the male, who said has been depressed. The male was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. He was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Mental Health Evaluation: On February 21, 2016 at 2:13 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Chelsea for a welfare check on a possibly suicidal subject. The reporting party said the 74 year old female resident has threatened suicide for the past two days. Officers determined the female met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. The

female was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical Center.

Auto Burglary: On February 21, 2016 at 6:09 p.m. an officer was dispatched to Falcon Way at Refugio Valley Rd. to take a report for an auto burglary. The reporting party said his White '15 Chevy Sonic had a window shattered. The reporting party parked his Solar City work car at 5:50 p.m. When he returned, at 6:09 p.m. he found the right rear passenger window had been shattered. The unknown suspect reached into the rear passenger compartment. The loss is electronic items.

Vehicle theft: On February 22, 2015 at 5:25 a Hercules resident called and stated he parked his 97 Honda Accord in the 100 block of Cottage Lane. The officer spoke to the victim who stated his vehicle was stolen between 7:00 PM last night and the time of call. He did not hear or see anything suspicious.

Non-Injury traffic collision: On February 22, 2016 at 6:23 AM an officer was dispatched to a non-injury accident involving a 2016 Chevrolet and a 1995 Honda. The incident occurred at Tsushima and Sycamore Ave.

Harassing or Annoying Phone Calls: On February 22, 2016 at 11:16 a.m. an officer handled a lobby detail regarding annoying or harassing phone calls. The reporting party stated she has been receiving annoying or harassing phone calls; and believes they are coming from a person in Hercules. The reporting party knows the subject and has had issues when him in the past. The officer is following up.

Auto Burglary: On February 22, 2016 at 11:21 a.m. an Officer handled a lobby detail regarding an auto burglary. The reporting party stated she parked her Beige '94 Honda Accord on Village Parkway at Devonwood at 10:00 p.m. on 02/21/16. When she went out to this morning at 7:00 a.m. she saw the interior had been ransacked. There was no forced entry and she didn't notice anything missing/stolen.

Warrant Arrest – Towed Vehicle: On February 22, 2016 at 3:06 p.m. an officer was flagged down by the Home Depot Store Manager regarding a possible petty theft in progress inside the store. The Store Manager a Red Honda Accord had been circling around the parking lot of the store for the past 20 minutes. The Store Manager gave the officer the license plate number of the vehicle. That license plate returned to a '95 Honda out of Santa Rosa. And second Officer located the Red Accord parked, unoccupied, near the Home Depot Garden Center. A check of the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) on the car didn't match the VIN associated with the license plates attached to the Accord. The VIN on the car returned to a

'98 Honda Accord. The registration was expired as of September 2014. The Store Manager said a Hispanic Male adult, associated with the Accord, had attempted petty theft and was still inside the store. Officers contacted that male exiting the store. The male denied any involvement in a theft. The male was identified as 27 year old Michael Wilmer, of Tracy. Wilmer was determined to be on Parole and he had an outstanding warrant issued on 11/12/2015. Wilmer was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The license plates were removed to be returned to DMV. The vehicle was towed for no current registration. An inventory search and officers found a working, Brass Knuckles, stun gun. The stun gun was booked into safekeeping.

Attempt Residential Burglary: On February 22, 2016 at 8:12 PM Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Obsidian Way for a glass break alarm from the kitchen window. Hercules units were on scene almost immediately. Officers found the side gate ajar. The rear kitchen window screen was removed and the glass was broken. An interior check was conducted and the residence appeared undisturbed. A witness saw someone knowing on doors in the 100 block of Opal The subject was described as an African American male; in his early 20s; 6-2; with a thin build; wearing black pants and a dark gray hoodie. The subject told the witness he was conducting a survey.

Public intoxication: On February 22, 2016 at 9:11 PM Hercules officers were dispatched to the rear of the 200 block of Skelly for a man, who appeared to be intoxicated, lying on the hillside. Officers located 45 Roland Powell, with his dog, on the hillside. The male needed assistance walking up the hill to meet with the paramedics. The male indicated objective symptoms of intoxication. Powell refused medical assistance. Powell was arrested for Public Intoxication and transported him to the Martinez Detention Facility. The dog was returned to his residence.

Driving under the influence of alcohol: On February 22, 2016 at 11:39 PM an officer stopped a vehicle for a violation of the speed law. The driver, 28 year old William Cash displayed objective symptoms of intoxication. Cash was unable to perform most of the Standard Field Sobriety Tests. The Preliminary Alcohol Screening device indicated White was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. White had been in a fight, prior to his arrest. AMR also responded and cleaned his wounds. Cash was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.
