Attempt Stolen Vehicle/Vandalism: On September 1, 2016 at 4:44 p.m. an officer responded to the 900 block of Valley Run for a report of a vandalism. The victim reported that her vehicle had been moved slightly and the rear window shattered.

Carjacking: On September 3, 2016, at approximately 12:28 am, officers responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. The victim was sitting parked in his vehicle when he was approached by 2 unknown black male adults in their 20's. One suspect described as light skinned, 6'2, tall heavy build, with short hair, wearing a blue jacket, khaki pants, and white shoes. Suspect 2 described as dark skinned, 5'9, medium build, short hair and a goatee, wearing a long sleeve pink shirt with a white tee-shirt underneath, and white shoes. The victim stated that both suspect's approached him, told him they had a gun, this was a robbery and to get out of the vehicle. The victim stated he never saw a gun. The suspect's drove away in the victim's vehicle.

Public Intoxication: On September 3, 2016, at about 8:16 pm, officers responded to the area of Hercules Ave and San Pablo Ave for a report of a male subject, wearing white clothing, acting suspiciously. The subject was located in the area of Hercules Ave and Santa Fe and identified as 51 year old John Overdorf of Hayward. Overdorf exhibited signs of being heavily intoxicated. Overdorf was placed under arrest for Public Intoxication and transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Property Damage Only Vehicle Collision: On September 4, 2016 at 6:41 a.m. officers responded to the area of Bayfront Blvd. at Railroad Ave. for a report of a vehicle collision. As a precaution fire and ambulance were also dispatched. The victim was checked for injuries and released to family at the scene.

Outside Assist – Pinole P.D.’s Robbery Suspect’s: On September 4, 2016 at 9:09 a.m. Hercules officer’s observed Pinole PD’s robbery suspects in the area of San Pablo Ave and Hercules Ave. The suspect vehicle was driving N/B San Pablo Ave occupied by 2 black adult females. Officer’s initiated a traffic stop and the driver yielded to the officer’s at the E/B I-80 on-ramp from John Muir Parkway. The suspects were identified as Monae White of Richmond and Kenjana Hawkins of El Sobrante. A search of the vehicle yielded the stolen items taken from Safeway. Both White and Hawkins were identified by witnesses. Pinole PD took custody of both suspects.

Domestic Violence – Spousal Battery/Brandishing a Knife/Criminal

Threats: On September 4, 2016 at 1:38 p.m. officers responded to the 3900 block of San Pablo Ave for a report of a vandalism which occurred in the 200 block of Skelly Way. Victim stated suspect, 35 year old Michael Mori, had slashed her vehicle tires. There was a brief struggle between the victim and Mori during which Mori threatened the victim with the knife. A Hercules officer located a vehicle that Mori was a passenger in. The officer stopped the vehicle and took Mori in to custody. Mori was interviewed at the Hercules Police Department before being transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Warrant Arrest: On September 4, 2016 at 4:20 p.m. an officer observed William Brossard of Hercules in the 1200 block of Canterbury Street. Brossard had an outstanding cite releasable Misdemeanor Warrant. Brossard was arrested and cited out on the warrant.

Prisoner Transport: On September 5, 2016 at 9:28 a.m. an officer responded to Santa Rita Jail (Alameda County) to pick up 23 year old Jamie Davies of Oakland. Davies was arrested on several outstanding Felony Warrants out of Hercules. Davies was transported to MDF.

Court Order Violation: On September 5, 2016 at 6:07 p.m. officers responded to the 100 block of S. Arbor Bay for a report of a court order violation. The victim stated that her 33 year old son Matthew Jurgensen, a transient, just violated her restraining order against him. Jurgensen was gone when officers arrived but later located. He was arrested, interviewed and transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez.
