Burglary: On September 12, 2016 at 9:08 a.m. an officer responded to the 1200 block of Willow Ave. to take a report for a mail theft. The victim stated an unknown suspect pried their way in to the locked laundry room and attempted to pry open the coin box on a dryer. The unknown suspect also pried open the mailbox clusters inside the laundry room.

Domestic Violence: On September 12, 2016 at 10:07 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of Village Parkway at Felton Way for a report of a suspicious circumstance. The victim stated she was just robbed of her purse by a person parked in a White Dodge Dart parked at the corner. Officers were familiar with the vehicle and the driver 22 year old male of Hercules. He was contacted and stated that he and the victim had an argument. He was arrested, interviewed and transported to the Main Detention Facility in Martinez for battery and false imprisonment.

Hit and Run vehicle collision: On September 12, 2016 at 11:39 a.m. officers responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. for a report of a hit and run vehicle collision. There is no suspect information.

Auto Burglary: On September 12, 2016 at 12:01 p.m. an officer responded to the 800 block of Willow Ave. for a report of an auto burglary. The victim stated 3 black male adult's shattered a vehicle window and stole her purse. No suspect vehicle was seen. Earlier, Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 3600 block of San Pablo Ave for a suspicious occupied black vehicle seen parked in the area with a report of a black male seen walking around looking into parked cars. Officers checked the area but didn't find the black vehicle or the subjects.

Vandalism to Historic Building – Clubhouse: On September 12, 2016 at 2:49 p.m. officers were dispatched to Railroad Ave. at Main St. for a report of a suspicious circumstance. The reporting party stated the front door to

the historic building was open and kids were seen inside the building yesterday. Officers arrived and found the cyclone fence surrounding the Clubhouse to be unsecure (no force) and the front door to the Clubhouse was forced open. Officers made entry into the Clubhouse and found a storage closet door damaged with the door being broken open. Officers cleared the interior and didn't locate anyone inside. Officers were able to close the damaged front door.

Missing Juvenile: On September 12, 2016 at 10:37 PM an officer responded to the 3100 block of S. Front Street for a report of a missing juvenile. Juvenile did not attend class and was believed to be out with friends in the area. Neighboring agencies were advised.

The victim entered the store and upon returning to his vehicle he found the left rear passenger window shattered and miscellaneous property taken. No suspects or suspect vehicle was seen.

Patrol Info regarding possible Auto Burglary suspect vehicles: An employee in the area of the Willow Shopping Center stated he saw a suspicious black male adult walking around looking into parked vehicles earlier in the morning. The subject was driving a dark colored vehicle.

72 Hour Psychiatric Commitment: On September 13, 2016 at 11:51 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to Chelsea Way for a 75 year old female crying and telling Dispatch she wanted to kill herself. An officer made contact with the female inside the condo. She was crying and upset because her son wasn't home. She was also upset that her son didn't tell her where they were going. She was transported to CCRMC by AMR on a 72 hour psychiatric hold.

Assault with a Deadly Weapon/Domestic Violence: On September 13, 2016 at 4:46 p.m. officers responded to the 100 block of Paradise Dr. for a report of a physical domestic dispute. The suspect forced his way in to the house and assaulted the victim. The suspect was gone when officers arrived. This incident is still under investigation.

Auto Burglary: On September 14, 2016 at 6:25 PM officer's responded to an address on Highway 4 for a report of an auto burglary. The victim's vehicle window was shattered and her purse taken by an unknown suspect. No witnesses to the crime were located.
