Residential Burglary: On September 26, 2016 at 7:09 a.m. an Officer was dispatched to the 900 block of Devonwood to take a report for a residential burglary. The burglary occurred while she was in the Hospital on 09/14/16. Jewelry and other household items were taken.

Mental Health Evaluation: On September 26, 2016 at 10:26 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 100 block of South Wildwood regarding a suspicious circumstance. The reporting party stated his neighbor's garage door open only a crack and he could hear a vehicle's engine running inside the garage. Officers arrived and saw the garage was only open approximately 6" from the bottom and heard the vehicle's engine running. Officers attempted to make contact inside the garage, and at the front door, but received no answer. Fire and AMR were staged. Officers returned to the garage and could no longer hear the vehicle's engine running. Officers spent 30 minutes attempting to get the occupant to open the garage door or the front door. They were finally able to open the garage door after Fire use a ladder to open an upstairs bedroom window. The occupant was identified as a 44 year old female of Hercules. The female was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. She was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Medical center.

Identity Theft: On September 26, 2016 at 1:57 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to a lobby detail regarding an identity theft. The reporting party said she was checking her Chase bank account and saw her account was debited a large sum for legal services. When the reporting party contacted Chase bank she was told there was a levy placed on her bank account. Apparently a Chase bank credit card was opened in her name with an outstanding debt of \$1,500. The fraudulent account was opened in Wilson's name in 2006 and had a listed home address in Sacramento.

Warrant Arrest: On September 26, 2016 at 2:44 p.m. an Officer checked on a stranded motorist on E/B Refugio Valley Rd. at Sycamore Ave. The vehicle, a Black '04 Ford Explorer, was stopped with the hazard lights on. Two adult males were standing outside the vehicle. 35 year old Jamie Williams of Richmond, had an outstanding Misdemeanor Warrant out of Oakland P.D. The Warrant was issued on 05/25/2016. Williams was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Hit and Run: On September 26, 2016 at 6:55PM an employee from Rite Aid called to report that the business had been hit by a car. The employee reported that an unknown customer reported to the pharmacist that a Gold Lexus, hit and damaged a planter box attached to Rite Aid at 5:00 PM.
