WATCH COMMANDER'S SHIFT REPORT

Battery: On October 6, 2016 at 1:35pm an officer responded to the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Road for a report of a battery. It was reported that 2 juveniles were involved in a physical altercation. The officer determined a crime had occurred. The suspect juvenile was taken in to custody without incident and cite released to a parent.

Non-Injury Vehicle Collision: On October 6, 2016 at 6:49 p.m. officers responded to Willow Ave near Cambridge St for a report of an injury vehicle collision. It was reported that an occupant was trapped. When officers arrived it was determined that none of the involved occupants were trapped. A female juvenile occupant had a complaint of pain only. The Acura was found facing East in the middle of the intersection of Willow Ave. at Cambridge St. The second vehicle, a Toyota Camry had moderate damage to the driver's door and was T-boned by the Acura. The Camry was found facing South in the #1 lane of S/B Willow Ave. The Acura had major front end damage. The driver of the Camry was driving E/B on Cambridge St. and was turning left onto N/B Willow Ave. when she was T-boned by the Acura. She stated her view of traffic to her left on Willow Ave. was obstructed by a large truck with flatbed trailer that was stopped in the Fire lane facing S/B on Willow Ave. against the West curb and didn't see the Acura approaching her as she made the left turn due to the vision obstruction. The female juvenile was transported by AMR as a precaution but didn't have any injuries.

Auto Burglary: On October 6, 2016 at 8:07 p.m. an officer responded to the 800 block of Willow Ave. to take an auto burglary report. The victim advised the vehicle window was smashed within the past 20 minutes and that there was no suspect information. The unknown suspects then reached inside the vehicle and stole two suitcases as well as one duffel bag which included a Dell Laptop and miscellaneous personal information.

Auto Burglary: On October 6, 2016 at 8:27 p.m. an officer notified dispatch he was taking a second auto burglary report for another victim in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The victim vehicle, a Gray '13 Mercedes, was parked in the middle row of visitor parking near a restaurant. The victim stated she had parked her vehicle within the past 15-20 minutes and was inside a nearby business. Upon returning to her vehicle she discovered the right rear passenger window shattered. The unknown suspect then reached inside and stole an Armani satchel containing an empty Armani wallet. The unknown suspect may have cut themselves in the process of shattering the window as the officer located two drops of blood underneath the shattered window. A swab of the blood was collected. There were no witnesses and there is no suspect information.

Auto Burglary: On October 6, 2016 at 8:41 p.m. the officer notified dispatch he was taking a third auto burglary report for another victim in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The victim vehicle was parked in the middle row of visitor parking in the shopping center. When the victims returned to their vehicle they found the right rear passenger window shattered. The unknown suspect took a Black Samsonite hard case from the rear passenger floorboard. The hard case contained a work Dell Laptop computer and a personal Apple MacBook Pro Laptop computer. There were no witnesses and there is no suspect information.

Mental Health Evaluation: On October 7, 2016 at 1:09pm, officers responded to the 1600 block of Pheasant Drive for an unwanted guest. Officers contacted a 28 year old adult female of Hercules. Prior, the female had been told to stay away from the location. This was the third time officers responded to the location for this same subject. While speaking with her, officers determined that she needed a mental health evaluation. The subject was transported to Contra Costa Regional by ambulance.

Warrant Arrest: On October 8, 2016, as approximately 1:48 am, an officer conducted a traffic stop at Sycamore and Refugio Valley. The passenger in the vehicle, 22 year old Keondre Napoleon, of Pinole, had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant for driving on a suspended license. Napoleon was cite released on scene.

Misdemeanor Battery: On October 8, 2016 at 12:35pm, officers were dispatched to the soccer fields in the 2400 block of Refugio Valley Road for a physical altercation between adults. During the investigation the officer determined that a pushing match took place between three adults. The incident started when the suspect, 30 year old Jason Edward Davis of Hercules threatened to discipline one of the juvenile soccer players that was taunting him during his son's soccer game. Davis was approached by an adult female and told not to threaten to spank someone else's child.

During the argument between Davis and the female, the female's 18 year old son intervened and threatened Davis. A pushing match ensued and the female was pushed to the ground. Per witnesses, Davis was determined to be the dominant aggressor. Davis was taken into custody for battery. He was transported to the Hercules Police Department, booked and cite/released.

Mental Health Evaluation: On October 8, 2016 at 5:54pm, officers responded to the area of Willow Ave and Palm for a welfare check on a partially clothed adult female who appeared distraught. Officers contacted a 28 year old female of Carmichael walking on Willow Ave/over Highway 4. During the contact with her, officers determined she needed medical attention. The subject was transported to Contra Costa Regional by ambulance.

Domestic Violence – Spousal Battery: On October 9, 2016 at 2:02 p.m. officers responded to the 100 block of Copper Beach Glenn for a report of a corporal injury to a spouse that just occurred. The victim female stated her husband just slammed her head against the door and left. Officers arrived and contacted the 48 year old suspect of Hercules. He was detained and interviewed on scene. He admitted to getting in to an argument with his wife and pushing her against a wall inside their home. The officer also interviewed the victim and she related a similar story of having her head pushed against a wall. Two additional family members were also interview. The victim didn't want prosecution. The suspect was transported to the Hercules Police Department and interviewed. He was then transported to the Main Detention Facility.

Found Property: On October 9, 2106, at 4:46pm an officer responded to the Police Department for a lobby detail. The reporting party stated they found a black iPhone 5 or 5S lying on the ground on Railroad Av at Santa Fe Street. The iPhone was found to have been erased and returned to factory settings. It was entered in the evidence as found property.
