Traffic Collision: On October 13, 2016 at 7:09am, officers responded to the 3800 block of San Pablo Ave for a report of a hit and run collision. The collision occurred in the intersection of San Pablo Ave and Sycamore Ave. One of the parties was contacted on scene and it was later determined there was no hit and run collision.

Suspicious Circumstance: On October 13, 2016 at 1016am, an officer responded to the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave for a theft report. The victim stated she had a large amount of money in her purse. She left her purse inside of her house while visiting a neighbor. When she returned to her house she noticed the money was missing from her purse. There were no signs of forced entry and no evidence of anyone having been inside the victim's house.

Lost Property: On October 13, 2016 at 9:38am, an officer responded to the Police Department for a report of a lost wallet. The RP reported that she lost her Louie Vuitton wallet sometime after 7:30am this morning. The RP last saw her wallet when she placed it on the counter at a local business. Inside the wallet was the RP's driver's license, three credit cards, medical cards, three gift cards and \$5 cash. The RP cancelled all of her cards.

Outside Assist: On October 13, 2016 at 11:26am, officers assisted Richmond PD in taking a subject in to custody on their Ramey Warrant. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

Auto Burglary x3: On October 13, 2016 at 12:00pm, an officer responded to the 3600 block of San Pablo Ave to investigate a theft from a vehicle. When the officer arrived, he was contacted by two additional victims. All three vehicles had their windows shattered and property stolen from inside.

Total loss from all three vehicles was estimated at over \$5,500. Total damage to all three vehicles was estimated at \$1,100.

Warrant Arrest On October 14th 2016 12:59am, an officer conducted a records check of the registered owner of a gold Pontiac Grand Prix. The registered owner, 26 year old Jesse Robert Streater of Rodeo, was discovered to have a no bail warrant out for his arrest. Streater was taken into custody and transported to Main Detention Facility in Martinez.

Petty Theft On October 14th 2016 at approximately 6:56pm an officer took a petty theft report of a stolen cell phone.

Auto Burglary On October 14th 2016 at approximately 8:33pm an officer responded to the 1100 block of Chelsea for an auto burglary that occurred in the 800 block of Willow Ave earlier in the day. The victim stated he parked his vehicle in the parking lot at approximately 6:45AM. Upon his return the right passenger window was shattered and his black canvass bag containing a green bowling ball and bowling shoes were taken. There is no suspect information available.

Battery: On October 14, 2016, at about 10:53am, an officer responded to the 1900 block of Refugio Valley Rd for a report of a battery. This incident is still under investigation.

Mail Theft: On October 15, 2016, at about 2:15 pm, an officer responded to a residence in the 300 block of O'Neil Circle for a reported mail theft that occurred sometime yesterday. There is no suspect information.

Commercial Burglary – Coin Theft: On October 16, 2016 at 10:26 a.m. an officer responded to the 1200 block of Willow Ave to take a report for a commercial burglary of the laundry room. The officers met with the reporting party who stated that two unknown suspects forced entry into the laundry room at approximately 4:55 a.m. and broke into four dryers. The unknown suspects were inside the laundry room for approximately 20 minutes and cut into/drilled out the locks of the dryers. The suspects then stole approximately \$300-\$400 in quarters from these four dryers. The first suspect is described as a 30 year old black male adult, heavysset, full beard, with a possible scar on the top of his head. The second suspect, is an unknown race male, approximately 25-30 years old, thin build, with dark hair. This incident is still under investigation.

Unattended Death: On October 16, 2016 at 10:55 a.m. officers responded to the 200 block of Redwood Rd. for a report of an unresponsive 87 year old male. Fire and ambulance responded and determined that the victim was deceased.
