SUBJECT: City Manager's Weekly Report

### **HOLIDAY SCHEDULE**

City Offices will be closed until Wednesday January 2. The next City Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 8. I will be out of state through January 4. Liz Warmerdam will be Acting City Manager until I return. Enjoy the Holidays!

### **DEPUTY CITY MANAGER LIZ WARMERDAM IS GOING TO THE CITY OF ALAMEDA**

Liz Warmerdam has accepted the position of Assistant City Manager for the City of Alameda. Her last day here will be January 11. In the short term, her workload will be shifted to me and consultants we have had under contract. They will help with human resources and redevelopment issues as I focus more on the sale of Hercules Municipal Utility and other efforts that Liz has been handling. Long term staffing decisions will be considered after our mid-year budget review.

### **HERCULES MUNICIPAL UTILITY**

**Promenade Rate Increase:** The subsidized Hercules Municipal Utility (HMU) rates that Promenade residents have been receiving in accordance with the Development Agreement governing the original development of the subdivision will cease at the end of this month. The Development Agreement included a provision that guaranteed HMU rates 10% lower than PG&E rates for 10 years. Since HMU residential rates are approximately 30% higher than PG&E rates, HMU rates for Promenade residential customer rates will be going up approximately 40%. Staff will be asking the City Council to consider phasing in this rate increase and this will be a discussion item on the January 8 City Council agenda.

**Disposition of HMU:** The formal Request for Proposal for the sale of the Hercules Municipal Utility was released to the public on November 16th. Proposals are due back to the City by January 9, 2013. In the meantime, interested buyers will be touring the Utility's facilities and talking with staff to learn more about operations. Once proposals are received in January, they

will be reviewed by city staff, Bodington and Company (the city's investment banker/broker) and the City Council temporary advisory committee. Mayor Delgado and Vice Mayor deVera are representing the City Council on the temporary advisory committee. The team will begin negotiations with the best and highest bidder after the bids are analyzed.

## **POTENTIAL GARBAGE RATE INCREASE**

Over the past few months, staff has been working with a consultant to review Richmond Sanitary Services' (RSS) application for an 11% rate increase. The initial review was completed last week and staff will be meeting with RSS to discuss the findings. Staff will be bringing forward a recommendation to City Council for public hearing on January 22.

## **REAL PROPERTY PROJECT UPDATES**

**Market Hall Site:** Palo Alto based McNellis Partners, led by John McNellis, has purchased the Market Hall/Red Barn Site bordered by Interstate 80, Highway 4, San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore in November and has, in coordination with the City, scheduled a community meeting for Saturday, January 12 at 10:00 am at the Senior Center to get community input and discuss ideas for retail development on the Market Hall site. This approximately 6.5 acre site is one of two premier retail sites in Hercules, the other being Sycamore Crossing. McNellis is a well regarded developer of retail centers and is one of several developers that were vying for this site. **Sala Restaurant Site:** Sala Restaurant has closed. The City has possession and is negotiating a termination agreement with the tenants. The restaurant was losing money and unable to meet its financial obligations. Staff has received inquiries from a number of chefs interested in leasing the building and will confer with the City Council on January 8 in closed session, as well as place the subject on the regular City Council meeting agenda for discussion and direction. Staff will also follow up with the Contra Costa College culinary program.

**Victoria Crescent:** Staff in be brining a recommendation to the City Council acting as the Successor Agency to the Hercules Redevelopment Agency for the extension of the Feasibility period on January 8. Staff is recommending that the Feasibility Period to March 31 to deal with delays caused by AB 1484. The Buyer, City Ventures, is planning its first community outreach meeting for January.

**Bayfront – ITC Project:** This project will develop a 42.36 acre portion of the Hercules Waterfront District master Plan (WDMP) area with the “Hercules Bayfront Project,” a transit-oriented, mixed-use neighborhood that includes a variety of dwelling unit types with businesses, an associated system of walkable streets, pedestrian interconnections, and public plazas with bay views. The City portion of the project includes the Intermodal Transit Center (ITC) and other public improvements, including the extension of John Muir Parkway and the construction of a major Bay Trail segment.

Efforts to advance and finalize permitting efforts for the ITC Project continue. Significant progress on this goal was achieved this month. Department of Fish & Game (DFG) issued a draft Streambed Alteration Agreement on December 10<sup>th</sup> for the entire Project. US Army Corp of

Engineers (USACE) issued the 404 Permit for the Bay Trail element on December 19<sup>th</sup>. These two permits will be finalized for consistency with the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) permits.

The City met with Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) on September 24<sup>th</sup> and received comments on the City's permit application on October 4<sup>th</sup>. Additional comments were received on December 13<sup>th</sup> for the initial phase of the Project and responded to on December 20<sup>th</sup>. The City conducted a site walk with Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) on October 29<sup>th</sup> who issued their comments on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. A meeting was held with the US Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) and RWQCB on December 5<sup>th</sup> to provide clarification and additional information. RWQCB requested additional information related to the UPRR Bridge and Transit Loop Bridge and how the Refugio Creek design will interface with the Bay. The Agencies continue to process the information.

In June 2012, the City envisioned issuing the design in three bid packages. This included a single bid package for the construction of the rail related improvements and the San Francisco Bay Trail. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) is the lead agency for the ITC Project while the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) is the lead for the SF Bay Trail Project. During subsequent discussions with FHWA and Caltrans, it was determined that the City should split this bid package into two separate bid packages. Constructing this as two separate bid packages has added some complexity to the design delivery that the City is working through with HDR. The City is also finalizing easements necessary for the contemplated work to occur. Additionally, BKF's design package for John Muir Parkway / Bayfront Boulevard Bridge / Refugio Creek work will be finalized with resolution of the agency permits.

As a result, drawings are being finalized into four bid packages:

1. Promenade Lift Station Removal and Sanitary Sewer Line Replacement
2. Path to Transit (John Muir Parkway / Bayfront Blvd. Bridge / Refugio Creek)
3. San Francisco Bay Trail
4. Track Preparation (Track Preparation / Retaining Walls / Utility Lines)

As a result, additional time will be required finalize the design that was split into the San Francisco Bay Trail and the Track Preparation bid packages and to finalize easements necessary for the work. In consultation with the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), the City approached the California Transportation Commission (CTC) on December 6<sup>th</sup> and requested an extension to award a construction contract for the STIP funded elements. The CTC granted the extension request.

The City held a conference call with FHWA and the East Bay Regional Park District on December 14<sup>th</sup> to discuss the timeline of the Project in consideration of the extension received from the CTC and discuss when FHWA would provide comments on their review of the split design package that was submitted to them on November 26<sup>th</sup>.

## **RECYCLEMORE – POST-COLLECTION STATEMENT OF INTEREST**

RecycleMore (discussed above) is currently reviewing Statements of Interest from waste haulers to provide post-collection handling services (disposal of waste once it is in the truck) for solid

waste, recycling, organics, and other material. Currently, Republic Services (aka Richmond Sanitary Services – RSS) receives about \$20 million dollars annually to process and dispose of over 130,000 tons of material. The contract with RSS is expiring in 2014. RecycleMore staff presented the results of the process at its last meeting, and was directed to negotiate for 60 days with Richmond Sanitary Service.

**Other Activities:**

- Streetlights on San Pablo Avenue from John Muir Parkway to the Rodeo limits and on Linus Pauling from San Pablo Avenue to Alfred Nobel Drive went out suddenly Tuesday night. After an investigation by staff it was determined to be a PGE transformer problem. They have been notified of the outage.
- Inspection/abatement warrants were obtained from the Superior Court to demolish 221 and 227 Carson Street. Demolition began but has been delayed by rain.
- Staff has been working on documents for the San Francisco Bay Trail, John Muir Parkway extension, railroad track preparation documents, and Bayfront Bridge.
- Staff has been answering questions and collecting documents for the sale of the Hercules Municipal Utility.
- Staff investigated a large number of street lights out on San Pablo and Linus Pauling Drive. Determined to be a PGE problem. It was reported but to PGE but nothing has been done as of this writing.
- A large tree branch fell at 3:45am on December 17<sup>th</sup> adjacent to Railroad Avenue at Park Street. Operations Manager, Jeff Brown and Eric Wright removed branch from roadway.
- Holiday coverage schedule has been established. Staffing levels will be at a minimum but will include inspection of sewer lift stations and Park clean-up.

**Library Repair Updates:**

- Interior drywall repair work in progress and should be complete by Friday, December 21st including paint, with the exception of the large conference room where leaking continues to occur.

## **WEEKLY POLICE REPORT - As of December 21, 2012**

**Identity Theft:** On December 15, 2012, at 6:07 a.m., a resident from Forest Park reported Identity Theft. The resident reported an unknown suspect gained access to her personal identifying information and her credit card between December 1<sup>st</sup> and December 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Assault with a Deadly Weapon and Child Endangerment:** On December 15, 2012 at 8:58 p.m., Officers were dispatched to a report of a fight between two males in the 100 block of Paradise Drive. Upon arrival Officers found a 52 year old male bleeding profusely from injuries to his face and head. Other family members were present and told Officers that the victim had just been battered by his 32 year old son. Officers located the suspect on scene and arrested him. It was determined the suspect punched his father repeatedly before throwing him face first into a railing in front of the apartment. The suspect's 5 year old son was present during this battery. The victim sustained facial fractures as a result of his injuries. The suspect was transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

**Vandalism:** On December 15, 2012 at 11:48 p.m., a resident from Chinquapin Court reported vandalism of Christmas decorations. The resident heard a loud noise coming from the front of his house between 11:30 p.m. and time of call. He went outside to investigate and found that an unknown suspect had punctured his inflatable Christmas decoration.

**Public Intoxication:** On December 16, 2012 at 12:10 a.m., Officers were dispatched to a report of a suspicious person who had just knocked on the front door of a residence on Lupine. The reporting party stated the male identified himself as "Pedro Garcia" before turning and leaving. Officers had received another suspicious person call that had just occurred in the same area. Officers located the subject in the 1900 block of Lupine. The subject was identified as 18 year old Pedro Garcia of Oakland. Garcia was determined to be highly intoxicated. Garcia was pat searched and a small paring knife was found in his pocket. Garcia told Officers he had been walking on Lupine after leaving a house party at an unknown location. Garcia was transported to Martinez Detention Facility. Garcia is suspected as damaging the Christmas decoration on Chinquapin.

**Mental Health Evaluation:** On December 16, 2012 at 9:48 p.m., Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 1200 block of Willow Avenue for a 20 year old male, who is diagnosed as schizophrenic and was being violent with family members. Officers arrived and determined he was in need of a mental health evaluation. He was transported by AMR to Contra Costa Regional Medical Center.

**Unauthorized Use of an Access Card:** A resident from the 100 block of Fuchsia reported that someone used his Kohl's department store credit card at the Vallejo store and made an unauthorized purchase. The transactions occurred on November 6<sup>th</sup>. The credit card was supposed to be mailed to the victim but he never received it.

**Auto Burglary:** On December 16, 2012, at about 3:05 p.m., a resident from 1500 block of Swallow reported that someone smashed the left front window and took a fast track device from his vehicle. A home surveillance video camera captured the incident at about 1:41 p.m. and a case was taken for investigation.

**Auto Burglary:** On December 17, 2012, at about 8:23 am, a citizen flagged down an officer at the Shell gas station. She said her vehicle had been broken into, within the last ten minutes. The victim parked her 2007 BMW in front of Starbucks, located at 3700 San Pablo Ave. When she returned she saw the front passenger window had been smashed, and her purse was taken from the seat. A witness saw a possible suspect(s) and the investigation is continuing.

**Residential Burglary:** On December 17, 2012, at about 2:31 pm, residents from the 100 Block of Amethyst reported that their residence was burglarized, sometime during the previous two hours, while they were out. The entry was made through the master bedroom window which had been smashed. This investigation is continuing.

**Warrant Arrest:** On December 17, 2012, at about 2:40 pm, Officer contacted an adult male, in the park, between Beechnut and Coronado. 30 year old Tedros Yohannes, of Hercules, was determined to have an outstanding warrant for his arrest. Yohannes was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility

**Battery:** On December 17, 2012, at about 4:37 pm, and adult male reported he had been physically assaulted, several times, by his former business partner. The assault took place at his business located at 500 Alfred Nobel, sometime in 2011. This incident is still under investigation.

**Residential Burglary:** On December 17, at 7:13 pm, an officer was dispatched to the 200 block Beechnut. The residents had received a call their alarm company, at 6:45 AM, but thought it was a false alarm and cancelled the police response. When the residents returned home they discovered the rear sliding door had been shattered. It is unknown if the suspect(s), made entry. No loss was noted at this time.

**Vandalism (On Line Report):** On December 17, 2012 the victim made an On Line report stating the trunk of her vehicle had been spray painted by unknown suspect(s). The incident occurred between 10:00 PM on December 15<sup>th</sup>, and 6:00 AM on the 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Felony Evading of a Police Officer, False Evidence or Registration & Driving on a Suspended License:** On December 18, 2012 at 19:22 PM, an Officer attempted to stop a red Ford Explorer for a speeding violation, and red light violation, on N/B San Pablo Ave at John Muir. The explorer continued N/B on San Pablo Ave at 80 MPH and drove through the red light at the intersection San Pablo and Parker Ave. The driver turned left and sped back up to 80 MPH. The driver made several evasive turns, causing the Officer to lose sight of the vehicle. The Officer relocated the vehicle parked and unattended in Rodeo. While at the vehicle the owner contacted the Officer. 52 year old Leondus Gordon, of Rodeo, was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Vehicle Crash and Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol:** On December 19, 2012, at about 8:46 am, Officers were dispatched to a head-on collision involving a 2012 Chevy sedan, and a 2004 Toyota van, at Lupine Rd and Tamarack. Upon arrival Officers determined both vehicles had airbag deployment. The driver of the Chevy, had exited her vehicle was seated on the curb. The driver of the Toyota was still seated in her vehicle and was treated, by paramedics, for a complaint of pain. The driver of the Chevy displayed symptoms of being under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. 24 year old Erica Martin, of Hercules, was placed under arrest for Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol. Martin was transported to the Martinez Regional Medical center due to being involved in a collision. After she was medically cleared, Martin was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Mental Health Evaluation:** On December 19, 2012, at about 1:46 pm, Officers were dispatched to Park Lake Plaza (CVS/McDonald's area) for a report of adult males loitering in the area for the past several hours. Upon arrival Officer contacted a 33 year old male, of Richmond, who had been contacted earlier for similar reasons in the Creekside shopping center. The male met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation and was transported to the Martinez Regional Medical

Center, by ambulance.

**Stolen Vehicle/Recovered Stolen Vehicle:** On December 19, 2012 at 7:45 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to the Police Department lobby for the report of a stolen vehicle. The victim reported he parked his Red '91 Honda Prelude, today at 7:00 a.m., on Trellis Bay at Victoria Crescent West. **Non Injury Hit and Run Collision:** On December 20, 2012 at 10:47 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of Silver Maple at Sycamore for a report of a vehicle collision involving three vehicles. Dispatch then updated the call stating one of the involved drivers fled on foot. Officers found the three involved vehicles in the intersection of Sycamore at Lupine. The three involved vehicles were a '97 GMC Sierra; a '91 Toyota Tacoma; and '05 Chevy. Both drivers of the pick-up trucks were on scene and stated the driver of the Corvette fled on foot. An area search for the driver of the Corvette was done but he was not located. The driver of the Corvette caused the collision by colliding into the rear of the Sierra as it was turning left turn; then collided with the front of the Toyota pick-up, which was behind the Sierra. Both trucks sustained minor damage, but Corvette sustained major front end damage. The driver of the Corvette left his wallet inside the Corvette, and was later contacted. The Investigation is continuing.

The victim lives in the 1000 block of Devonwood, and stated an unknown suspect gained entry into her condo's locked detached garage. The Burglary occurred on 12/19/12 between 11:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. She stated the suspect gained entry by removing the garage's emergency release lock then went through her garage's cabinets
