JOINT CITY COUNCIL – SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

A joint meeting of the Hercules City Council and the Board of the West Contra Costa Unified School District will be held at the Hercules City Council Chamber on Tuesday, January 15 at 7:00 p.m. The agenda is available on the City web-site and includes items of mutual interest to the City and the School District.

POTENTIAL GARBAGE RATE INCREASE

Over the past few months, staff has been working with a consultant to review Richmond Sanitary Services' (RSS) application for an 11% rate increase. The initial review has been completed last

week and staff will be meeting with RSS to discuss the findings. Staff will be bringing forward a recommendation to City Council for public hearing on January 22.

REAL PROPERTY PROJECT UPDATES

Market Hall Site: Palo Alto based McNellis Partners, led by John McNellis, who purchased the Market Hall/Red Barn Site bordered by Interstate 80, Highway 4, San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore in November, held a community meeting at the Hercules Senior Center this morning. About 50 people attended, including all City Council Members. This approximately 6.5 acre site is one of two premier retail sites in Hercules, the other being Sycamore Crossing. McNellis, who is a well regarded developer of retail centers, sought community input and a dialogue with the people of Hercules as to what is desirable and feasible for the site. Sala Restaurant Site: Sala Restaurant has closed. The City has possession and is negotiating a termination agreement with the tenants. The restaurant was losing money and unable to meet its financial obligations. Staff has received inquiries from a number of chefs interested in leasing the building and will be placing this topic on a City Council agenda soon for discussion and direction.

Victoria Crescent: Staff brought a recommendation to the City Council acting as the Successor Agency to the Hercules Redevelopment Agency for the extension of the Feasibility period on January 8. The City Council failed to support a motion to approve the staff recommendation with a second. However, the City Council, at the request of the Mayor and a poll of the Council, will consider this item again at a Special City Council meeting on Tuesday, January 15 at 6:00 p.m.

Sycamore Crossing: The mediation session scheduled for January 11 was at least postponed as the parties considered offers and counter offers as to the cost to remove the deed restriction on about three quarters of the site. The City and Safeway need to decide next steps in what is now essentially a financial negotiation with the holder of the deed restriction. While having the ability to build a one story supermarket on the currently restricted portion of the site or build a podium or roof-parked supermarket on the three-plus acres parcel that is not deed restricted is a big positive in terms of cost and leasing flexibility, at some point, we must move forward with the supermarket. Staff will be scheduling a closed session discussion with the City Council soon.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending January 11, 2013

Chief Goswick and SRO Wrangham met with the Principals of schools in Hercules to discuss the safety of students and staff as well as security measures and preparedness. They will also conduct site visits and make recommendation to enhance safety measures. Site visits have been conducted at Hercules Day Care facilities and recommendation were presented to staff.

The Hercules Police Explorer POST #2111 hosted a fundraiser at Outback Steakhouse in Pinole on Thursday. The Explorers served food and for every purchase, the Explorers received the tip for every table they waited on. The tips earned by the Explorers came to \$2,600! One hundred

Lee was transported back to HPD where he was interviewed. After he was interviewed, he was transported to MDF.

The driver of the vehicle identified himself verbally as Christopher Lopez and stated that he did not have any identification because his wallet was stolen. The Officer then conducted a search of the vehicle in an attempt to verify Mr. Lopez's identity. During his search, the officer located a ziplock bag containing crystal methamphetamine. Lopez was placed under arrest for possession of methamphetamine and after the Officer placed him in the back seat of the patrol vehicle Lopez provided his real name. Abraham Lopez of Vallejo told the Officer because he had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. Dispatch confirmed that Lopez had an active \$25,000 dollar warrant issued in Napa County for possession of dangerous drugs. Lopes was transported to MDF.

Misc. investigation: On January 10, 2013 at 11:56 p.m. Hercules units received a call of a single gunshot heard in the rear yard of 172 Woodfield. The reporting party also heard talk about someone pulling a gun. Upon arrival Hercules units contacted two males in front of the residence.
