CITY EXTENDS DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

The Hercules City Council seeks residents for possible appointment to one of the following:

- Planning Commission (3 seats - 2 year terms)
- Community and Library Services Commission (1 seat – 1 year term as a Youth Commissioner)
- Citizens Finance Advisory Committee (1 vacancy) ***NEW***
- Measure O Citizens Oversight Board (1 vacancy) ***NEW***

Applicants must be Hercules residents and at least 18 years of age, with the exception of the Youth Commissioner who must be a High School student, grade 9-12. All positions are voluntary.

BALLOT MEASURE FOR UTILITY USER TAX UPDATE AND INCREASE TO BE ON JUNE BALLOT

Due to a projected \$1.2 million structural deficit in the City's general fund, Lew Edwards & Associates has been engaged to assist with a ballot measure to update and increase the City's Utility Users Tax (UUT). The measure, which would add 2% to the City's UUT for five years, will be placed on the June 4, 2013 ballot for voter consideration so that we will know what our 2013-2014 funding will be before approval of the budget in late June. Without the approximately \$1.0 million of additional annual revenue, the City will be forced to make devastating cuts to the Hercules Police Department or contract police services to the County. Other community services would also have to be cut.

MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW AND STRATEGIC PLAN DISCUSSION SCHEDULED FOR MARCH 12 CITY COUNCIL MEETING

There is a projected structural deficit in the City's general fund for FY2013-14 of \$1.2 million. This is not new news. About \$1.2 million of one-time money was used to balance the FY2012-13 budget, and while additional sales tax revenues of about \$250,000 is projected for FY2013-2014 and some costs can be reduced, projected increases in retirement and health care benefit costs will offset those impacts. Since there is only about \$600,000 of unbudgeted general fund cash remaining and any unexpected expenses will further reduce that sum, one time monies will not be available to balance next year's budget and avoid severe cost cutting measures. With retail development and residential development in the cue, it will still be two to three years before a new Safeway and other stores and restaurants can provide additional sales tax and all new development can provide additional UUT.

With this backdrop, staff will present the mid-year status of the fiscal year 2012-2013 budget to the City Council at the March 12 City Council Meeting and the Council will also discuss strategic goals and priorities for the City.

PLANNING UPDATES

March 4 Meeting of the Planning Commission

There are no hearings scheduled, but two discussion topics, as directed by the City Council:

- **Electronic (LED) Billboard Proposal:** Receive and discuss staff presentation on proposal to lease City-owned land adjacent to Interstate 80 for the purpose of installing and operating an electronic freeway-oriented billboard.

Updating the Hercules General Plan and Central Hercules Plan: Receive staff report and discuss City Council request to review status of the Hercules General Plan, the Central Hercules Plan, and other related land use plans and regulations and propose options for updating the City's various plans.

Planning Commission Recruitments

The City has received only one application (Commissioner Mitchell) for the three Planning Commission seats that will expire on April 1. Therefore, to encourage and recruit additional applicants, the City Council has extended the deadline for submitting applications to Thursday, March 14 (<http://www.ci.hercules.ca.us/index.aspx?page=288>). Interviews are still anticipated to be scheduled immediately thereafter.

Planning Commissioner Attendance Requirement

At its March 12 meeting, the City Council will be discussing a revision to Section 2-2.103 of the Municipal Code (www.codepublishing.com/CA/hercules/) that would reduce from six to three the number of allowed absences from Planning Commission meetings during any 12-month period, which would bring the Planning Commissioner attendance requirement in line with the attendance requirement for Community & Library Services Commissioners.

Franklin Canyon Access Project

The Muir Heritage Land Trust (www.muirheritagelandtrust.org) has submitted a conditional use permit application to open up the 483-acre Franklin Canyon preserve to hikers, bikers, and equestrians (more background info available online at www.landtrustalliance.org/land-trusts/west-success/franklin-canyon/). The land straddles both County and City jurisdiction, but because the project is primarily within City limits, the City will serve as the lead agency for the environmental review. The land is regulated by Measure M, the 2004 Franklin Canyon ballot initiative, which does not require any use or design review permit for the types of facilities to be constructed as part of the project, which primarily includes building hiking & biking trails, installing fencing for grazing cattle, and adding or restoring ponds. A presentation to the Planning Commission is tentatively scheduled for May 6 (during the anticipated public review period for the environmental review documents), to be followed by a project approval hearing tentatively scheduled for the regular Planning Commission meeting on June 17.

Telecommunications Consultants and Ordinance Update

Staff has finalized the contract with the Center for Municipal Solutions (www.telecomsol.com), who will serve at no cost to the City as the City's designated telecommunications consultants. We will aim to schedule a Planning Commission workshop to solicit community input about updating the City's telecom ordinance for late April or early May. CMS will also be assisting the City with reviewing and processing applications for facility installations and upgrades (e.g., cell towers, antennae, and related equipment) and negotiating the leasing of City-owned property to telecom companies.

Single-Use Bag Ordinance Draft EIR

RecycleMore (aka, West Contra Costa Integrated Waste Management Authority, the joint powers agency created by El Cerrito, Hercules, Pinole, Richmond, and San Pablo) has released a Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for a Single-Use Bag Ordinance. The EIR (which can be downloaded at <http://www.recyclemore.com/announcements/single-use-bag-draft-eir>) is available to the public for a 45-day comment period that will end on this coming Monday, March 4, 2013. The proposed ordinance (which covers El Cerrito, Hercules, Pinole, Richmond and San Pablo and the proximate areas of unincorporated Contra Costa County) would prohibit the free distribution of single-use carryout paper and plastic bags at the point of sale (i.e., check-out) for all retail

establishments except restaurants and nonprofit charitable reuse organizations. The ordinance as proposed would apply to all other businesses that put purchases into single-use carryout bags, either paper or plastic, at the point of sale except at stores operated by nonprofit charitable reuse organizations. Single-use plastic bags provided free to customers at the check-out stand for the purpose of holding the customer's purchases would be prohibited by the ordinance. Plastic carryout bags would be allowed by the ordinance if the bags are intended to be and are identified as reusable. An exception to the ban on single-use bags would be made for paper bags containing at least 40 percent recycled content, as long as the retail establishment charges at least five cents for each bag.

REAL PROPERTY PROJECT UPDATES

Victoria Crescent: The City Council, acting as the Successor Agency to the Hercules Redevelopment Successor Agency Board, and the Redevelopment Oversight Board have approved an Amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement with City Ventures, which has extended the Feasibility period to March 31, 2013. No other dates or terms are affected. City Ventures, the Victoria Crescent buyer/developer, is holding a second community outreach meeting on Saturday, March 16 at 12:20 p.m. at the Hercules Senior Center.

Sycamore Crossing: A Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) was entered into with Property Development Centers (PDC) in January. PDC is a wholly owned subsidiary of Safeway and plans to build a 55,000 to 65,000 Safeway store and gas station near San Pablo Avenue, with another junior anchor, restaurant and shop space to compliment the supermarket.

Negotiations for removal of the deed restriction on a portion of the site are still in progress; but at this point Safeway, PDC and the City are focusing on a podium design for the store on the non-deed restricted portion of the site and PDC is marketing future retail and restaurant space as well as discussing residential options for the Sycamore Avenue frontage, which could be retail or residential depending on site constraints and leasing efforts.

Two community meetings have been scheduled to provide a status on the site planning and get input on same. PDC has arranged for these meetings at Hercules Senior Center on Thursday, March 14 at 6:30 p.m. and Saturday morning, March 16 at 9:00 am and Thursday evening, March 7 at 6:30 pm.

Market Hall/Red Barn Site: Palo Alto based McNellis Partners, led by John McNellis, has purchased the Market Hall/Red Barn Site bordered by Interstate 80, Highway 4, San Pablo Avenue and Sycamore. This approximately 6.5 acre site is one of two premier retail sites in Hercules, the other being Sycamore Crossing. McNellis is a well regarded developer of retail centers and is one of several developers that were vying for this site. A second community outreach meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 19 at 6:30 p.m. at the Hercules Library.

Parcel C: An Amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) was approved by the City Council on December 4th to extend the Feasibility Period under the PSA to February 1, 2013 in order to provide time to craft a second, more substantive amendment to deal with bureaucratic delays caused by AB 1484. However, the City and the buyer/developer were not able to come to mutually acceptable terms due to delays created by AB1484 and the need to restructure debt

encumbering the property. Therefore, staff is working on restructuring the existing debt and has commenced discussions with a number of potential buyers. On February 12, in closed session, the City Council directed staff to have the brokers commence another Request for Proposals process and cast a wide net for potential uses and buyers. The site will again be marketed for office, research and development, retail and residential uses by CBRE and Cushman & Wakefield.

Parcel C and Victoria Crescent are the two properties being sold under a court approved \$6.5 million writ of attachment to settle the Ambac lawsuit, so time is of the essence in order to fulfill the requirements of the court sealed settlement to pay Ambac, as well as to pay Oliver & Company nearly \$2 million secured by Parcel C. The Oliver payment is due by March 31, 2013. Staff is in discussions with Oliver to renegotiate the schedule as well as with other potential lenders to restructure the debt.

Town Centrale: Presidio Development Partners proposes to finish construction on the Sycamore North project, now called Town Centrale, as a mixed-used project with approximately 140 apartments, four live-work units, and approximately 12,000 sq. ft. of ground-floor retail space, with 166 on-site parking spaces. All entitlements are in place and Presidio was scheduled to close escrow last week; however, they have asked for additional time, until June 20, 2013, to deal with recent cost estimates that significantly exceed budget. On February 26, the City Council approved an amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement to extend the close of escrow until March 15. This extension is intended to provide time to negotiate a more comprehensive amendment to deal with a number of issues related to this delay.

Sala Restaurant Site: The City has possession and is finalizing a termination agreement with the former tenant. The restaurant was losing money and unable to meet its financial obligations. On February 26, the City Council directed staff to select an appropriate real estate broker to market the space for lease. Once a broker is appointed, a community kick-off meeting will be held at the property so that the community can provide input directly to the broker and inform the request for proposals (RFP) and marketing efforts.
