SYCAMORE NORTH COMMUNITY MEETING

Presidio Partners, the developer in contract to develop the Sycamore North project, also called Town Centrale, will hold a community meeting to update interested parties on the progress of the project on Saturday, June 22, 2013 at City Hall.

FISCAL YEAR 2013 – 2014 BUDGET

The second draft of a proposed City budget was presented to the City Council on June 11 and some minor adjustments were directed by the City Council. Thanks to the passage of Measure A, the City will be able to fill three open police officer positions and avoid lay-offs in fiscal year 2013-2014. The final proposed budget, in which revenues and expenditures for the upcoming fiscal year are balanced, will be presented to the City Council for approval on Tuesday, June 25. The budget, however, has no provision for paying debt to CalHFA, which is currently owed over \$4 million, and staff is negotiating for a deferral and long term payment plan.

Thanks to the continued support of the community, most recently by passing Measure A with over 70% of the vote, the City is in better condition to move forward with real estate development and other economic development activities that will raise revenues without asking for more tax increases.

Immediately following the regular meeting, we will conduct another community workshop. As was requested at the last workshop, topics for this workshop will be: Hill Town, Victoria Crescent, and parks, paths, open space, and waterways/watershed. Staff will have an agenda, along with minutes from the previous meeting, to hand out at the start of the workshop.

HERCULES MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISPOSITION

No update: On Tuesday, May 28, the City Council approved and the City executed a contract to sell the assets of Hercules Municipal Utility to Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) for a purchase price of \$9.5 million. Under the Asset Purchase Agreement (“APA”), it is anticipated that, based on the current market value of the bonds, the net proceeds at close will be sufficient to retire the HMU Bond debt—assuming a timely close and a successful bond tender. Timing is critical because debt service obligations will continue to burden the City until the sale has closed, PG&E has paid the purchase price, and the HMU Bonds have been extinguished. There is a lot of work left to do, but this is a major milestone for the City's financial recovery.

AMBAC LAWSUIT UPDATE

No update: Ambac and the City have extended the performance date on the court approved stipulation to July 30, 2013 and are negotiating an amended stipulation to further extend for time and to provide for the requirements of AB 1484. The property attachment that is part of the current stipulation is set at \$6.5 million, but the current amount due at closer to \$5.5 million. Staff and Ambac met with the Department of Finance staff in Sacramento on April 15 to discuss the disposition of properties owned by the City as Successor Agency and expediting the approval of real estate to meet the requirements of the court approved stipulation that former Redevelopment Agency properties are sold expeditiously.

The properties in question include Sycamore Crossing, which is in contract with Property Development Centers/Safeway to build a Safeway anchored Shopping Center, Victoria Crescent, which is in contract with City Ventures to build single family detached homes for sale, and Parcel C, which is out of contract and under negotiations. Any proceeds of these sales will go toward financial obligations of the former Redevelopment Agency. Although no sales proceeds will go to the City, the fees, sales tax and utility user tax that will be created by the development of these properties will go a long way toward stabilizing the City's finances over time.

BAYFRONT INTERMODAL TRANSIT CENTER PROJECT UPDATE

The "Hercules Bayfront Project" will develop a 42.36 acre portion of the Hercules Waterfront District master Plan (WDMP). It is a transit-oriented, mixed-use neighborhood that includes a variety of dwelling unit types with businesses, an associated system of walkable streets, pedestrian interconnections, and public plazas with bay views. The City portion of the project includes the Intermodal Transit Center (ITC) and other public improvements, including the extension of John Muir Parkway and the construction of a major Bay Trail segment.

Ground Breaking: A notice of award was sent to Evans Brothers, Inc. for the Bay Trail / Path to Transit – Site Preparation Project and a pre-construction meeting was held this week. Actual ground breaking in the form of grading work will commence within a week or two.

A Ground Breaking Ceremony that was tentatively scheduled for July 3 will be pushed back a yet to be determined number of weeks due to scheduling difficulties.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending June 13, 2013

Child Welfare Report: On June 6, 2013 at 9:34 am, an officer was dispatched to HPD to meet with a citizen. The reporting party said he thought his 12 yr. old daughter, may be being abused by her mother, who lives in Hercules. The case is being investigated

Warrant Arrest: On June 7, 2013, at 12:45 a.m., HPD officers were dispatched to Foxboro Park, in the 1000 block of Canterbury. The reporting party said there was a group of loud subjects in the park. Officers contacted four subjects in the park. One of the subject's, 24 year old Kayla Leppo of Pinole, had a felony \$20,000 warrant out of Amador County. Leppo was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Commercial Burglary On June 7, 2013 at 8:33 a.m. officers were dispatched to the area of Lucky, in the 1500 block of Sycamore. The reporting party said two adult males just stole two 30-packs of Budweiser beers. Both suspects were described as Caucasian male adults, in their 20's. A 90's Jeep Cherokee, with faded black paint, was parked, pointed out, in a marked stall. The right front passenger was door wide open. Suspect #1 left the store via south entrance/exit doors, and jumped into the waiting Jeep. The Jeep drove off at a high rate of speed. An area check yielded negative results. This case is being classified as a burglary, as it appears the suspect entered the store with the "intent to commit theft"

Stolen Vehicle: On June 7, 2013, at 8:56am an officer was dispatched to the HPD lobby. The reporting party said sometime between 6/5/13 at 6:00pm, and 6/7/13 at 8:56am, someone stole her silver 1998 Acura Integra from the 1500 block of Swallow Way.

Fraud: On June 7, 2013, at 3:00pm an officer was dispatched to the HPD lobby. The reporting party said she received information that someone used her credit card number to take out several cash advances. The reporting party said her credit card is not in her possession and she has not seen it since February of this year. The RP said her credit card was taken without her permission.

Non Injury Collision: On June 7, 2013, at 7:35 p.m. HPD Officers were dispatched to Refugio Valley Road, near Pheasant Drive. A Ford Explorer, and a Dodge were both driving east bound on Refugio Valley Rd, and side swiped each other were the road merges from two lanes into one. There were no injuries.

Criminal Threats/Brandishing a Knife: On June 8, 2013 at 8:07 PM Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Forest Run. The reporting parties stated that their downstairs neighbor threatened to kill the adult male victim. The suspect was holding a butcher knife, in his left hand, at the time. The officers made contact with the suspect's father, who provided a key to the residence. The Officer made entry and arrested 29 year old Frank Sanders IV, of Hercules, for

Making Criminal Threats, and Brandishing a Weapon. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Domestic Battery: On June 9, 2013, at about 8:01 am, dispatch stated they received a call from San Bruno PD regarding someone attempting to report a female who was assaulted. The victim was reportedly at a residence in the 1600 block of Partridge Drive. Officers contacted the 23 year old female victim, who was being assisted into a vehicle by two subjects. One of the subjects said the suspect had hit the victim, and was inside the residence. The other subject, the brother the suspect, talked the suspect out of the house. The victim's right eye was almost swollen shut and her left eye was bruised and swollen. 39 year old Dominguez, of Fairfield, was arrested for Felony Domestic Violence. Dominguez was determined to be the restrained party in a restraining order held by the victim. He was also arrested for Violation of a Restraining Order. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Theft: On June 9, 2013, at about 11:46 am, an Officer responded to 1000 S Shelter for a reported theft from an unlocked Pasaat. The incident occurred sometime between midnight last night and 11:00 am this morning.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On June 9, 2013, at about 5:34 pm, an officer was flagged down regarding a citizen wanting to report that he recovered his 2002 Chevy Corvette. The vehicle was reported stolen July 24, 2010. The reporting party said he located his vehicle about two weeks after he reported it stolen, while he was driving around in Oakland. He had the vehicle towed to his home, but never notified the police that the vehicle had been recovered. He recently attempted to register the vehicle but was informed, by the DMV, that he needed to have the vehicle removed from the Stolen Vehicle System before he could register the vehicle.

Vandalism PC 594 (BobCop): On June 4, 2013 at 10:33 AM. A Hercules resident made an on line report. He stated during the night of June 3, someone jumped the fence into the Pool area, at the Caprice condos, and kicked the pool house door damaging the door and door frame.

Fraudulent Use of an Access Card PC (BobCop): On June 9, 2014, at 10:22 PM., a Hercules resident reported the unauthorized use of her debit card number. On June 5th her bank notified her that someone made a purchase using her Debit card number. The victim's debit card is set-up so the bank sends her a text whenever the card was used to make a purchase over \$50. The victim still has her debit card in her possession and does not know how the thieves could have got her debit number.

Property Damage Only Collision: On June 10, 2013, at about 12:59 pm, Officers responded to Redwood at Maple Ct. A vehicle drove through a neighbor's front yard fence. The car was lodged between the debris and was unable to move. The responsible party remained at the scene and cooperated with the investigation.

Driving Under the Influence: On June 10, 2013 at 22:45 an Officer stopped 32 year old Dustin Perfetto for speeding on San Pablo Ave. at Tsushima Ave. Perfetto showed objective symptoms of intoxication and was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. He was later cited, and released to his wife.

Spousal Abuse: On June 10, 2013 at 11:27 PM Hercules Units were dispatched to the 600 block of Devonwood. The reporting party said there was a physical altercation between an adult male and adult female. It appeared that the fight started over the victim wanting to take the kids and leave the residence. The suspect attempted to take the car keys from the victim, which caused her to fall to the ground. The victim also appeared to have been struck by a fist on the right side of her mouth. 31 year old Matthew Zeiter was placed under arrest Felony Spousal Abuse. Two firearms were removed from the residence, for safe keeping. Zeiter, was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Miscellaneous: Extra Patrol was requested in the area of Railroad and Bayfront for a reported suspicious adult male. The subject was seen tampering with utility boxes and fire hydrant caps.

He has never run away before. A case was taken for a missing juvenile, and he was entered into the Missing and Unidentified Persons System.
