The Friends of the Hercules Senior Center and Parks & Recreation is held a Texas Hold 'Em Fundraiser on Friday night at the Community Center. The fundraiser was very successful with nearly 200 participants buying in and sponsoring tables.

SYCAMORE NORTH COMMUNITY MEETING

Presidio Partners, the developer in contract to develop the Sycamore North project, also called Town Centrale, held a community meeting to update interested parties on the progress of the project this morning at City Hall. The meeting was attended by 37 Hercules residents and the biggest topic of discussion was the need to obtain easements on the adjacent "R Alley" to complete the construction of the building. Comments ranged from "We just need to finish the building" to "The building should be torn down." However, most agreed that the developer, the City and the Home Owner Association (HOA) Board need to work out a solution so that the project can move forward. The problem with that, however, is the Bayside HOA Board has been

and continues to refuse to communicate directly with the developer or the City and thus far has only communicated through their management company or lawyer and has not kept the Bayside home owners apprised of the issues or sought their input. The developer and I will now reach out to individual homeowners that are directly impacted by the construction on R Alley.

Also, the appraisal firm engaged to provide an expert estimate of value for the R Alley easements should complete their work soon and the plan is to make an offer to the HOA Board as soon as possible. Our hope is that they will hear from the Bayside home owners and be willing to negotiate in good faith so that this project can move forward.

FISCAL YEAR 2013 – 2014 BUDGET

Staff will be presenting the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget to the City Council for approval on Tuesday, June 25, 2013. Thanks to the passage of Measure A, the City will be able to fill three open police officer positions and avoid lay-offs in fiscal year 2013-2014. The final proposed budget, in which revenues and expenditures for the upcoming fiscal year are balanced, is the first structurally balanced budget for Hercules in several years. The budget, however, has no provision for paying debt to CalHFA, which is currently owed over \$4 million, and staff is negotiating for a deferral and long term payment plan.

A balanced budget could not have been achieved without tough choices by the City Council over the last couple of years to reduce staffing and other expenses, significant financial sacrifices by our employees in all departments, and our staff's commitment to do more with much less in order to continue to provide the best services we can to the community.

We are also thankful for the continued support of the community, most recently by passing Measure A with over 70% of the vote. This puts the City in better condition to move forward with real estate development and other economic development activities that will raise ongoing annual revenues without asking for more tax increases.

REAL PROPERTY PROJECT UPDATES

Sycamore Crossing: A Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) was entered into with Property Development Centers (PDC) in January. PDC is a wholly owned subsidiary of Safeway and plans to build a 55,000 to 65,000 Safeway store and gas station near San Pablo Avenue, with another junior anchor, restaurant and shop space to compliment the supermarket.

Since PDC/Safeway is now proposing a podium or roof-top parked store on the non-deed-restricted 3.5 acre parcel on the site, right at the corner of Sycamore and San Pablo Avenue. Staff will be recommending an extension of the existing Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) to the City Council on June 25 in order to: (1) Provide staff and consultants adequate time to conduct analyses of construction costs and economic factors impacting price and terms of the proposed transaction; (2) Provide the parties adequate time to negotiate a more comprehensive Third Amendment that will enable Buyer to move forward with a podium or roof-parked Safeway

supermarket; and (3) Provide staff time to address certain state requirements for Department of Finance approvals under AB 1484, which was passed subsequent to the execution of the Agreement for Purchase and Sale.

Civic Arts Building A.K.A. Sala Restaurant: On May 16th, about 30 members of the community attended a marketing information meeting to receive an update, ask questions and provide input on the marketing of the vacant Civic Arts Building, also known as Sala Restaurant, at 1991 Railroad Avenue. Since that time, Deborah Perry and Ron Willet of Colliers international have marketing the property for lease and there are a number of proposals that the City is now considering.

Bayfront Intermodal Transit Center: The “Hercules Bayfront Project” will develop a 42.36 acre portion of the Hercules Waterfront District master Plan (WDMP). It is a transit-oriented, mixed-use neighborhood that includes a variety of dwelling unit types with businesses, an associated system of walkable streets, pedestrian interconnections, and public plazas with bay views. The City portion of the project includes the Intermodal Transit Center (ITC) and other public improvements, including the extension of John Muir Parkway and the construction of a major Bay Trail segment.

One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Opportunity: On June 19th, the Contra Costa Transportation Agency (CCTA) recommended approval of a list of projects to be forwarded to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) by June 30th for funding under the OBAG Program. Under the competitive program, the ITC is ranked eight out of twenty-two applications received and will receive \$2.5m in funding should MTC uphold the recommendation. In addition to the competitive program, the City will receive \$701k under the Local Streets Preservation Funding for a project contemplated on Refugio Valley Road.

Hercules Point: During the due diligence period leading up to the acquisition of Hercules Point by the City of Hercules in July of last year, City Staff discovered that Hercules Point had been remediated during the original site clean-up. Staff has continued to follow-up with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) who issued their findings on June 18, 2013 indicating that the prior remediation for commercial and industrial uses could also be considered for an open space park. Although it is necessary to complete the ITC to provide legal access to Hercules Point, this represents an important hurdle that positions the City of Hercules to secure grants for this future project. Past relationships between DTSC and the City Manager figured prominently in this successful step forward.

Construction: Evans Brothers, Inc. began work on Monday, June 17th for the Bay Trail / Path to Transit – Site Preparation Project. Following preparation work, heavy equipment began moving dirt this week.

Ground Breaking Ceremony: A Ground Breaking Ceremony that was tentatively scheduled for July 3 will be pushed back a yet to be determined number of weeks due to scheduling difficulties.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending June 20, 2013
