### FISCAL YEAR 2013 – 2014 BUDGET

The fiscal year 2013-2014 City budget was approved by the City Council on June 25. Thanks to the passage of Measure A, the City will be able to fill three open police officer positions and avoid lay-offs in fiscal year 2013-2014. The final budget, in which operating revenues and expenditures for the upcoming fiscal year, is balanced. The budget, however, has no provision for paying debt to CalHFA, which is currently owed over \$4 million, and staff is negotiating for a deferral and long term payment plan.

Thanks to the continued support of the community, most recently by passing Measure A with over 70% of the vote, the City is in better condition to move forward with real estate development and other economic development activities that will raise revenues without asking for more tax increases.

The victim stated the incident occurred last night, at her home in Hercules. The victim went to the hospital experiencing "blurred vision". The victim was contacted said she and her husband had a verbal argument last night. Her husband pushed her with enough force that she fell down. She hit her head on the floor. Today she experienced blurred vision and went to the hospital. She was diagnosed with a concussion. The husband was contacted and placed under arrest for Felony Spousal Abuse. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

**Traffic Collision:** On June 24, 2013, at about 6:02 pm, Officers responded to the area of San Pablo Ave, and Sycamore Ave, for a reported traffic collision. The 18 year old male driver, of the Lexus, said he lost control of his vehicle as he turned right N/B onto San Pablo Ave, from W/B Sycamore Ave. He drove over the center median and collided with a BMW, driven by a 49 year old male, who was stopped at a red light. Both parties were uninjured.

**Indecent Exposure** On June 26, 2013 at 5:45pm, an adult female reported on Saturday, 6/22/2013, at about 10:00am she was sunbathing at the pool located on Dartford and Brighton. She saw a Caucasian male, about 55 yrs old, standing on the outside of the pool, in the bushes. The male's shorts were pulled down low, and he was shirtless. The suspect fled in an older red pick-up truck.

**Petty Theft and Brandishing a Firearm:** On June 26, 2013 at 7:52 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the Lucky store, in the 1500 Sycamore Ave. The reporting party stated an African American adult male stole some liquor, and was last seen running towards Refugio Valley Park. **Recovered Stolen Vehicle:** On June 26, 2013 at 11:12 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the area of the 1400 block of Partridge Drive. The reporting party stated a reckless driver hit a parked vehicle, and the driver fled the area, on foot, towards Pheasant Drive. The responsible vehicle was a Toyota Corolla. Officers did an area check but didn't find anyone on foot on Partridge Drive nor Pheasant Drive. Officers located the unoccupied Toyota parked in the 1400 block of Partridge Drive.
