PLANNING UPDATES

July 15 Planning Commission Meeting & Community Workshop

There are currently two agenda items anticipated for the regular meeting of the Planning Commission meeting on Monday, July 15, starting at 6:00 p.m.:

- Design Review Permit 13-07 / Conditional Use Permit 13-03 – A request from T-Mobile to install a microwave dish at an existing telecommunications facility near 1068 Turquoise Drive
- Presentation by City Ventures: potential development of Victoria Crescent

Immediately following the regular meeting, we will conduct another community workshop at which the task force will attempt to begin drafting an executive summary or report of the group's prior discussions and consensus views. As with all meetings, we will e-mail you links by which you will be able to download the agenda and supporting documents at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Appeal of Franklin Canyon/Fernandez Ranch Project Approval

The Refugio Heights HOA, represented by Kathy Melas, has filed an appeal of the Planning Commission's decision on June 17 to approve the Conditional Use Permit for the Muir Heritage Land Trust's Franklin Canyon/Fernandez Ranch Project. The City Council will hear and consider the appeal at its regular meeting on July 23.

REAL PROPERTY PROJECT UPDATES

Sycamore North. Due to delays in negotiating the acquisition of "R Alley" easements adjacent, staff will be recommending an extension of the deadline for closing escrow under the existing purchase and sale agreement. The City Council will consider this item at the July 23 City Council meeting.

Civic Arts Building A.K.A. Sala Restaurant: Due to additional late-arriving proposals for the leasing of this building, staff took the discussion of price and terms off the closed session calendar for July 9 to provide more time to evaluate the proposals. In addition, our due diligence has turned up personal property liens against the former lessee that could impact a lease transaction. Our goal is to get the former lessee to pay the debts necessary to satisfy the liens.

Bayfront – ITC Project: This project will develop a 42.36 acre portion of the Hercules Waterfront District master Plan (WDMP) area with the "Hercules Bayfront Project," a transit-oriented, mixed-use neighborhood that includes a variety of dwelling unit types with businesses, an associated system of walkable streets, pedestrian interconnections, and public plazas with bay views. The City portion of the project includes the Intermodal Transit Center (ITC) and other public improvements, including the extension of John Muir Parkway and the construction of a major Bay Trail segment.

Additional Measure J Funding: In April, Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) initiated an update to the Measure J Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan guides the timing of sales tax expenditure on projects included in the voter approved expenditure plan and is updated every two years to make adjustments based on revenues, debt service cost on bonds, project schedules, and expenditures. CCTA recent bond sale locked in historically low interest rates on both new bonds and the refinancing of existing bonds resulting in additional capacity for capital project. Staff presented to the West Contra Costa Transportation Committee (WCCTAC) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) where \$22-million in projects competed for \$6.5-million in near-term funds and \$10.5-million in funds after 2020. The Hercules ITC was recommended by the TAC to receive the \$2.4-million in additional funding in the near term. WCCTAC will consider the recommendation on July 26th after which it would be confirmed by the CCTA.

Construction: Evans Brothers, Inc. continues to make significant progress reshaping the Village in anticipation of the next construction packages and remains on schedule. Rough grading of the roadway for the anticipated extension of John Muir Parkway commenced this week. Additionally, Evans Brothers have achieved a significant project milestone by placing fill at the future Transit Loop Drive (Shoreline Loop) to a critical elevation and will wait the necessary one-month period

prior to completing the fill. These vertical faces are located where the future station track will approach the railroad platform and are a good indication of the widened railroad right-of-way necessary for the future rail station.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES UPDATES

There were no permits issued this week due to last week's office closure.

- Staff continues to meet with Pinole staff to discuss plant upgrades at the Pinole/Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- Staff continues to work with Ducks Unlimited on Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project, Phase Two environmental soil borings.
- A large tree branch that fell in Woodfield Park was removed by staff.
- Staff continues to work with Ducks Unlimited on Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project.
- Staff is working with PG&E on LED streetlight replacement program. (Documents Received from PG&E and are being forwarded to Council for approval)
- Goats from Goats R Us have are completing a large area grazing on Lupine.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending July 11, 2013

Battery: On July 3, 2013 at 12:39 p.m. an adult female resident, from the 100 block of Decatur Ct, came into HPD to report a battery. The reporting party said her father pushed her to the ground, and kicked her. The incident occurred on July 2, 2013. A battery report was taken.

Miscellaneous: On July 3, 2013, at 7:35pm Officers were dispatched to the area of Violet Rd, and Marigold, for a welfare check. Officers contact an adult female. She had visible superficial scratches on her neck and ears consistent with finger nail marks. The driver, a 69 year old female of Stockton, was traveling westbound on Sycamore Ave in her 2007 Mercedes. She fell asleep and hit a tree along the south side of Sycamore. The driver was uninjured during the collision.
