JOE EDDY McDONALD MEMORIAL HIGHWAY SIGNS

On July 9, 2012, the Hercules City Council passed a resolution urging the State Legislature to designate the Willow Avenue overcrossing over State Highway Route 4 in the City of Hercules, Contra Costa County, as the Joe Eddy McDonald Memorial Overcrossing, in order to honor and memorialize the life and service of Joe Eddy McDonald. This was a way to remember the tireless work that Joe Eddy and Mary Ann McDonald did to push through the \$86 million Highway 4 West divided highway project after they lost their daughter, Kimaree McDonald, 25, and niece, Tiffane Spencer, 17, in a tragic car accident which occurred along a winding two-lane stretch of Highway 4.

Although the state has named the overcrossing in honor of Joe Eddy McDonald, funding for signs is not provided by the state. At this point, the McDonald family and friends need another \$3,550 to pay for the signs that are required. Community volunteers have organized a Holiday Tree lighting for Sunday, December 8, 2013 from 5:00pm-7:00 pm AT THE Hercules Community Center. It will include refreshments, entertainment and a visit from Santa.

PASTA FIESTA FUNDRAISER

The numbers are in and the recent Pasta Fiesta Fundraiser raised just over \$6,000 to be split between the Hercules Police Explorers and the Friends of the Hercules Senior Center. Almost 300 people attend and enjoyed a dinner prepared by Police Chief Bill Goswick and his helpers.

PLANNING UPDATES

Measure J Update of Growth Management Element. The City Council and the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) have approved an updated draft of the Growth Management Element (GME), which was revised by staff to comply with Measure J requirements to receive maintenance and Improvement program funds. This makes the City eligible for approximately \$705,000 in Measure Return-to-Source gas tax dollars for fiscal years 2011-12 and 2012-13 for local street maintenance and improvements.

November 18 Meeting Cancelled. The Planning Commission Meeting scheduled for Monday, November 18th has been cancelled. The consultants from the Center for Municipal Solutions will not be able to conduct in-person workshop regarding updating the City's Telecommunications Ordinance. We plan to reschedule the workshop for the regular meeting of the Planning Commission on December 2, 2013.

REAL ESTATE PROJECT UPDATES

Intermodal Transit Center (ITC): Contract project manager William Silva and I joined representatives from the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) and the East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD) Tuesday afternoon on an interview panel for construction management services for the next phase of the Path to Transit – Bay Trail work, which has already started. Having a construction management firm on board will provide engineering and environmental expertise needed for optimum project oversight.

On November 20th, the CCTA Board is expected to approve the contract the City Council approved Tuesday for the CCTA to provide project administration services to the ITC project. The Administration and Planning Committee of the CCTA approved the concept last week. This, along with the employment of a construction management firm, will bring a wider range of resources to bear on the project than the City can provide on its own. It will also help Mr. Silva focus more on project planning, funding and design.

Victoria Crescent: The proposed residential development by City Ventures at the approximately 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site on San Pablo Avenue is tentatively scheduled for consideration by the Planning Commission on December 2, and the City Council on December 17.

The state Department of Finance (DOF) has approved the \$2,125,000 sale of the 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site to City Ventures, as well as the \$5,000,000 sale of the 11.5 acre Sycamore Crossing site to Safeway subsidiary Property Development Centers and the \$8,000,000 sale of the approximately 17 acre Parcel C on John Muir Parkway to Lewis Land Developers. Sale of these former Redevelopment Agency sites is required under the legislation that dissolved redevelopment agencies statewide is also necessary for the payment of a Redevelopment Agency debt to redevelopment bond insurer Ambac and other debts of the Agency.

HERCULES MUNICIPAL UTILITY

Clare Gibson of Jarvis Fay, Steve Greenwald of Davis Wright Tremaine and I met Tuesday morning in San Francisco with PG&E and California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) staff to

discuss the approval schedule for the sale of the HMU to PG&E. The meeting was very positive and the CPUC staff believes we will have preliminary approval of the transaction this December. This means that the transaction could be approved as early as January. However, PG&E's request for a rate increase could still delay the closing activities, as we cannot buy the HMU outstanding bonds until PG&E deposits the \$9.5 million sales price that is the lion's share of the projected cost of the bonds.

- Staff continues to meet with Siemens to ensure we receive our promised energy savings as outlined in their contract. We are looking at water saving devices and possibly a new heater for the swim center. Negotiations continue.
- Pavement Maintenance Project –Drafting bid documents for spring pavement rehabilitation project.
- Tree trimming has been done at City Hall to raise the canopies and thin out the trees.
- Staff has submitted the State Revolving Loan Fund Application for the Pinole/Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade.
- Staff continues to meet with Recyclemore and Richmond Sanitary regarding collection and post-collection contracts. The post collection agreement was approved by the JPA and discussions are continuing regarding the Franchise amendment that is necessary due to changes in services. The franchise amendment will be before the Council on November 26, 2013.
- Staff continues to work with Ducks Unlimited on Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project. An RFP was issued for the work and awarded to WRA. Work will commence in approximately six months. Staff continues to meet and have included Contra Costa Flood Control in the discussions. Permits will need to be obtained through them to move forward.

- Staff continues to meet with the Clean Water Program regarding upcoming trash reduction mandates.
- Numerous trip hazards on city sidewalks were removed by contractor.
- Staff repaired numerous street lights within the City.
- Striping renewal has begun on San Pablo Avenue at Sycamore Avenue, San Pablo at Village Parkway and San Pablo Avenue from 550 feet west of Sycamore to John Muir Parkway.
- Staff has received three quotes for re-lamping the Library and will be moving forward with the work soon.
- Staff is working on quotes for Sidewalk repair project.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending November 14, 2013

Vandalism: On November 7, 2013, at 2:41 am, officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Avocet for a loud male subject in the alley way. The officers arrived and they found 25 year old Hector Santiago of Berkeley, standing in the alley way. Santiago had been knocking on the front door of a residence because he thought he left his cell phone inside. His girlfriend, who was inside the residence refused to open the door because Santiago was drunk. Santiago broke the glass portion of the front door while he was knocking. The girlfriend was house sitting for the home owners, who were away on vacation. A case was taken for documentation.

Traffic Collision: On November 7, 2013 at 8:10 am officer responded to an injury accident at the HMHS campus. Two students were driving their vehicles’ in the junior parking lot in the opposite direction when they collided. There was moderate damage to both vehicles. A student passenger was taken to the hospital by ambulance for complaint of pain to her head. One of the drivers was transported to the hospital by her parent.

Vehicle Burglary: On November 7, 2013 at 4:05 pm a Tiburon resident reported someone broke into her rental car by smashing the right rear window. The burglary occurred in the parking lot in the 3500 block of Franklin Canyon Road between 10:30 am and time of call. A purse was stolen containing the victim's identification, credit cards, and cash.

Residential Burglary: On November 7, 2013 5:45 pm officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Pheasant for a residential burglary report. Sometime between 8:30 am and time of call unknown suspect(s) forced open the front door. Stolen from the residence were a laptop and a video game console with games. The residence was not ransacked during the theft. The residence was processed for evidence.

Missing Adult: On November 7, 2013, at 10:35 pm, officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Bobolink Way for a missing person report. The resident said that he and wife had a verbal argument. She left the residence and drove away in her vehicle, but did not take her medication. Dispatch entered her and the vehicle into the system as missing. She returned home at 11:40 pm and she was removed from the system.

Possession of Controlled Substance: On November 7, 2013, at 11:57 pm, an officer made a pedestrian stop on 45 year old William Brossard of Hercules. Brossard is on probation for DUI with a search clause. Officer found suspected methamphetamine and a glass smoking pipe on Brossard. He was arrested and transported to jail.

Driving Under the Influence/ Traffic Collision: On November 8, 2013 at 4:45 am, officers were dispatched to Willow Avenue near Mariners Point for a traffic collision. Officers arrived on scene and they saw a Toyota stopped on the middle island of Willow Ave. The officer contacted the driver, 20 year old Keshara Crawford (of Vallejo) sitting in the driver's seat. Crawford displayed signs of driving under the influence of alcohol. After a DUI investigation she was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

Vehicle Burglary: On November 8, 2013 at 9:14 am an officer was dispatched to Fremont Court for a report of a vehicle burglary. The victim said she parked and locked her car at the end of the court in the evening and when she returned to her car this morning the driver's door was unlocked and open. Clothing, registration papers, and a case of CDs were stolen.

Warrant Arrest: On November 8, 2013 at 10:11 am an officer contacted a pedestrian, 47 year old James Calvin Petroff, on San Pablo Avenue at Victoria Crescent West. Petroff was determined to have an arrest warrant for possession of a stolen car. He was arrested and transported to jail.

Hit and Run Collision: On November 8, 2013 at 4:48 pm and officer was dispatched to the 2000 block of Lewis for a report of a hit and run collision. The resident reported her vehicle was hit while it was parked in front of her residence. A witness saw the suspect vehicle hit the parked car and flee on November 5th at 4:00 am. A collision report was taken.

Mental Health Evaluation: On November 9, 2013 at 9:42 PM Hercules officers were dispatched to the 1300 block of Sycamore Avenue for a mother fighting with her 12 year-old daughter. The young son on scene called police and stated that his mother was trying to stab his sister with

scissors. After speaking with the involved parties regarding the incident officers were unable to confirm the scissors story as the younger brother did not see any scissors. The mother met the needs for a mental health evaluation and was transported to the hospital by ambulance.

Commercial Burglary: On November 10, 2013 at 7:29 a.m. Hercules officers were dispatched to a report of a burglary that just occurred at the laundry room of the condos, in the 1200 block of Willow Avenue. The reporting party witnessed 2 male suspects fleeing the laundry room after breaking into the washing machines to steal change. The 2 suspects left in U-Haul pickup truck with a rear Arizona license plate. It was determined entry was made through a window into the laundry room. Two washing machines were cut open. Evidence was collected for investigation.

Battery on a Peace Officer and Resisting Arrest: On November 10, 2013 at 11:14 a.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Iris Road for a report of a man and a woman yelling outside. The resident reported her son was 20 years old and out of control. Officers arrived and contacted Clark Sanford of Hercules. Sanford refused to talk with officers and did not obey orders. While attempting to detain Sanford he fought with officers. Officers sustained minor scrapes and cuts during the arrest. Sanford sustained a cut to his forehead and to the right side of his face. Sanford was transported the hospital to be medically cleared prior to being transported to jail.

Vandalism: On November 10, 2013 at 5:02 p.m. Hercules officers were dispatched to the 100 block of South Wildwood for a disturbance. The resident called to report that a male was at his house saying he was attacked by another subject. Officers arrived and contacted the 20 year old victim in front of the home. The victim stated that his friend, 19 year old Douglas Devon of Hercules had just gotten into an argument with him and Devon's girlfriend near Jack in the Box. The victim stated Douglas used his skateboard to hit the right front door of the victim's car causing a dent. Douglas was contacted and denied striking the car. A case was taken to be forwarded to the DA's office for prosecution.

Mental Health Evaluation: On November 10, 2013 at 5:31 p.m. Hercules officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Forest Park for a report of a disturbance. The reporting party stated three people were yelling and screaming. The reporting party stated a male was yelling at a female about being high on drugs. Officers arrived and contacted the involved parties. Through an investigation it was determined the disturbance was over someone being suicidal. The female was determined to meet the criteria for a psychiatric hold and she was transported to the hospital by ambulance.

Mental Health Evaluation: On November 10, 2013 at 9:20 pm Hercules officers were dispatched for an older male walking towards the condos in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. Officers located a 67 year old male in the 1000 block of Chelsea. The male was lying on the ground nude from the waist down stating he was cold. The male was severely intoxicated and needed help to sit up. Brown lives alone and was unable to care for himself, so he was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation, by ambulance.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On November 11, 2013 an officer conducted a traffic stop on 20 year old Alexander Tabang, of Brentwood. Tabang appeared to be under the influence

of alcohol so the DUI investigation was initiated. After the investigation Tabang was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

Prisoner Transport: On November 11, 2013 at 7:43 a.m. an officer responded to Alameda County Jail (Santa Rita) to pick up 37 year old Xavier Pittman on our outstanding Misdemeanor Warrant for spousal battery. Pittman was transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Vandalism: On November 11, 2013 at 11:08 a.m. a resident from the 200 block of Coronado reported graffiti vandalism. The graffiti was spray painted on a storm drain across the street from the resident's home. A case was taken for investigation.

Petty Theft and 2 Stolen Vehicles: On November 11, 2013 at 1:35 p.m. an officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Newbury to take a report for two stolen vehicles that were taken between 12:30 p.m. and 1:15 p.m. The victim stated she moved her two vehicles from her home's driveway so her house could be painted. She said she left two sets of car keys laying on the right front passenger seat of her Black '03 Ford F-150 (CA LP# 60281D1) with the window partially rolled down. An unknown suspect(s) gained entry into the truck and stole the two set of car keys. The unknown suspects then stole the following two vehicles: Black '06 GMC Envoy (CA LP# 5UOH336) and a Red '05 Honda Accord (CA LP# 5JWW256). Both vehicles were entered into the stolen vehicle system.

Hit and Run Vehicle Collision: On November 11, 2013 at 5:48 p.m. officers witnessed vehicle collision that occurred at the intersection of Sycamore Avenue and Refugio Valley Road. A Black '03 Dodge Ram (CA LP# 60456D1) ran the red light for E/B Sycamore Ave. at Refugio Valley Rd. colliding into the driver's side door of a Black '02 GMC Yukon. The Yukon was making a left turn from S/B Refugio Valley Rd. onto W/B Sycamore Ave. The driver of the Yukon stopped and the driver of the Ram fled towards Creekside Shopping Center. Officers located the Ram stopped to the rear of Home Depot and the driver was detained. The driver was identified as 36 year old Razidi Wallace of Oakland. Wallace was found to be driving on a suspended driver's license and has been involved in a prior hit and run collision. Wallace was arrested for fleeing the scene of the collision and driving with a suspended license.

Driving Under the Influence Collision: On November 11, 2013 at 9:11 pm Hercules Officers were dispatched to Eagle Court for a possible vehicle collision into a residence. Upon arrival officers located 26 year old Kevin Brown. Brown had crashed his Ford Mustang into vehicles parked in a driveway at the end of the court. The impact pushed one of the vehicles into the garage door and the frame work to the left of the door. A DUI investigation was done and Brown was arrested for DUI.
