JOE EDDY McDONALD MEMORIAL HIGHWAY SIGNS

On July 9, 2012, the Hercules City Council passed a resolution urging the State Legislature to designate the Willow Avenue overcrossing over State Highway Route 4 in the City of Hercules, Contra Costa County, as the Joe Eddy McDonald Memorial Overcrossing, in order to honor and memorialize the life and service of Joe Eddy McDonald. This was a way to remember the tireless work that Joe Eddy and Mary Ann McDonald did to push through the \$86 million Highway 4 West divided highway project after they lost their daughter, Kimaree McDonald, 25, and niece, Tiffane Spencer, 17, in a tragic car accident which occurred along a winding two-lane stretch of Highway 4.

Although the state has named the overcrossing in honor of Joe Eddy McDonald, funding for signs is not provided by the state. At this point, the McDonald family and friends need another \$1,500 to pay for the signs that are required. REAL ESTATE PROJECT UPDATES

Intermodal Transit Center (ITC): On November 20th, the CCTA Board approved the contract the City Council approved on November 12th to provide project administration services to the ITC project. This, along with the employment of a construction management firm, will bring a wider range of resources to bear on the project than the City can provide on its own. It will also help Mr. Silva focus more on project planning, funding and design.

Victoria Crescent: The proposed residential development by City Ventures at the approximately 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site on San Pablo Avenue is tentatively scheduled for consideration by the Planning Commission on December 2, and the City Council on December 17.

The state Department of Finance (DOF) has approved the \$2,125,000 sale of the 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site to City Ventures, as well as the \$5,000,000 sale of the 11.5 acre Sycamore Crossing site to Safeway subsidiary Property Development Centers and the \$8,000,000 sale of the approximately 17 acre Parcel C on John Muir Parkway to Lewis Land Developers. Sale of these former Redevelopment Agency sites is required under the legislation that dissolved redevelopment agencies statewide is also necessary for the payment of a Redevelopment Agency debt to redevelopment bond insurer Ambac and other debts of the Agency.

Sycamore North:

Presidio Development Partners, which is in contract on the property, proposes the “Towne Centrale” project as mixed-used with approximately 140 apartments, four live-work units, and approximately 12,000 sq. ft. of ground-floor retail space. Staff is bringing this project before the City Council on Tuesday, November 26 to provide an update on the project in light of decisions that need to be made regarding the expiration of the Purchase and Sale Agreement at the end of January, 2014, as well as other issues.

“R Alley” Issue. Originally, the Buyer was to have negotiated an easement agreement with the Bayside Home Owners Association. The Buyer, however, was not successful in obtaining the necessary easement from the Bayside Home Owners Association and has asked the City to assist

with this matter. In March of 2013, the City commenced a discussion with the Bayside HOA for acquisition of a public right of way on “R Alley” in order to provide emergency access to the project and to allow for the issuance of encroachment permits for construction and maintenance. The City was unable to get the HOA to negotiate a reasonable agreement and has pursued an eminent domain action that is proceeding through the court process. The HOA has recently hired real estate counsel in this regard and we are hoping for negotiations to ensue.

Marketing and Term of Agreement. The Tenth Amendment to the PSA allows the City to begin marketing the Sycamore North site to other potential buyers on January 1, 2014 and requires that escrow close by January 31, 2014.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending November 21, 2013

Stolen Vehicle: On November 14, 2013, at 8:54am, an officer responded to the 100 block of Ridgepoint Ct. The reporting party stated she parked her 2013 Lexus RX350, in her garage, on November 13th, about 9:30 pm. She left the key in the center console, and left the doors unlocked. She thought she closed the garage door. This morning she discovered the vehicle missing and the garage door open.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On November 14, 2013, at 1130am, an Officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Cottage Ln. The reporting party said a vehicle was blocking the driveway of the residence. The officer located a Red 89 Nissan 240SX which was confirmed to be an outstanding stolen vehicle, reported to Antioch P.D. yesterday, 11/13/13.

The reporting party said someone hit her '12 Acura MDX, while she was in the library giving an Animal Control presentation, and did not leave any contact information. Damage was limited to the lower right corner of the rear bumper, which was dented and gouged, consistent with a tow hitch.

Suspected Mail Theft: On November 14, 2013 at 5:44pm an officer was dispatched to the 400 block of Falcon Way. A Hercules resident found scattered mail, in the 500 block of Falcon Way, during his evening walk. Preliminary investigation determined 3-4 households were affected.

Mutual Combat: On November 14, 2013, at 7:03 pm, officers were dispatched to the Jack in the Box, 3800 San Pablo Ave for a physical altercation between several male juveniles. Officers arrived on scene and found one male sitting near the drive through, bleeding from his mouth and nose. Officers also contacted another male juvenile who stated two of the subjects had arranged a shoe (Nike Jordan) trade and agreed to meet at the Jack-in-the-Box. The subjects exchanged shoes, but the first male did not like the shoes he received and he wanted his shoes back. The other subject said "No, you will have to fight me for the shoes." Several other juveniles were involved in the physical altercation. None of the parties present wanted prosecution. The report was taken for documentation purposes.

Residential Burglary: On November 15, 2013, at 7:41, officers were dispatched to the 1800 block of Pheasant for a residential burglary report. The time frame was 8:15 am- 7:40 pm. The reporting party found his front door ajar. It appeared the suspect used bodily force to open it. The inside of the residence was ransacked.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle: On November 14, 2013, at 8:36 pm, officer was dispatched to the 1500 block of Partridge for a recovered stolen vehicle report. The vehicle, a 95 Infiniti, was parked in the street in front of a residence. The vehicle was reported stolen to Richmond PD on 11-12-13. A shaved key was found inside the vehicle.

Identity Theft: On November 15, 2013 at 3:17pm, an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Ash Ct. The reporting party was contacted by Wells Fargo Bank, on 11/8/13, about some fraudulent activity on her three different checking accounts.

Battery: On November 15, 2013 at 3:33pm, officers were dispatched to the Hercules Middle High School (HMHS) football field for a report of a physical altercation between four students. When officers arrived on scene, they located one of the involved parties, a fifteen year old female, who told officers she was “JUMPED” by three fifteen year old female students. The victim said she was hit at least two times by each suspect. The victim did not have any visible injuries and did not complain of any pain. The suspects are known and the investigation is continuing.

Grand Theft: Grand Theft: On November 15, 2013 at 4:18pm the owners of Hercules Dental, 500 Alfred Nobel, Suite 130, reported the theft of two high speed hand pieces, and the loss/theft of a digital x-ray sensor. The thefts were only recently discovered and the time frame, established by the owner, is between September 2013 and time of call.

The reporting party said she found her rear gate, propped open with a brick, on 11/15/13, at about 4:30pm. She inventoried the loss and contacted HPD the following day. The victim stated she does not use the gate, or garage, regularly and it had been about a week since she last saw the garage or gate undisturbed.

Officers found several family members trying to restrain an adult male. It was determined the male was a danger to himself, and others, and met the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation. He was transported, by ambulance, to County Regional Health Center.

Lost or stolen firearm: On November 17, 2013 at 10:10 PM a Hercules resident reported a handgun missing from her residence. The weapon was last seen it this morning, at 4:00 AM, before she left for work. At 1:00 AM the reporting party called and stated she had found her handgun.

The driver showed objective signs of intoxication. 24 year old Kimara Jones, of Hercules, was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. Hit & Run involving a Pedestrian: On November 18, 2013, at 10:36 a.m., a School Resource Officer was contacted, at the Hercules Middle High School, by a student. The student stated he was walking S/B Refugio Valley Rd. crossing Pheasant Dr. when an unknown vehicle collided into his backpack causing him to spin around. The student didn't sustain any injuries and could only describe the Suspect vehicle as a Blue car with rust. No Suspect description on the driver.

Possession of a Stolen Vehicle: On November 18, 2013 at 12:49 p.m. an Officer was en-route to "call for service" when he saw a suspicious Green '89 Acura Legend parked in the 1400 Block of Partridge Dr. The Officer believed he recognized the lone occupant (in the driver's seat) as a subject known to be on Felony Probation, and living in the 1400 block of Partridge. The Officer turned around, to get behind the vehicle, when the person seated in the driver seat exited and walked to the address where the known probationer lived. The Officer had Dispatch contact San Pablo P.D. to have them contact the registered owner. San Pablo P.D. confirmed the Legend was an un-reported stolen vehicle. Officers contacted the residents and explained they were there to do a Probation Search. In an upstairs bedroom they found a male juvenile hiding underneath a bed. The male was the same person Officer saw seated in the driver's seat of the Legend. The juvenile resembled the other subject, but was determined not to be him. The juvenile initially verbally identified himself as another person. After being arrested the juvenile identified himself, with his true identity, and stated he lived in Oakland. The juvenile was found to be on Searchable Juvenile Probation, out of Alameda County, for Auto Theft. Alameda County Juvenile Probation advised the juvenile had an outstanding Warrant for cutting off his GPS ankle monitor. Alameda County Juvenile Probation took custody of Moffett. The Hercules case, for Auto Theft, will be forwarded to the Contra Costa County Juvenile District Attorney's Office for review.

BobCop – One Line Report: On October 20, 2013 at 6:31 PM a Hercules resident reported, through BOBCOP, that an unknown person made three charges against her Wells Fargo Account. The charges were made at businesses in Stockton.

BobCop – On Line Report: On November 5, 2013 at 12:16 PM a Hercules resident reported, through BOBCOP, that an unknown person opened or applied for numerous credit accounts using his personal information. The reporting party lost his wallet in November of 2006 and believes that is how the suspects got his personal information. The reporting party only learned of the numerous accounts, in his name, after applying for a job and a background check was conducted.
