REAL ESTATE PROJECT UPDATES

Victoria Crescent: The proposed residential development by City Ventures at the approximately 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site on San Pablo Avenue is tentatively scheduled for consideration by the Planning Commission on December 2, and the City Council on December 17.

The state Department of Finance (DOF) has approved the \$2,125,000 sale of the 6.5 acre Victoria Crescent site to City Ventures, as well as the \$5,000,000 sale of the 11.5 acre Sycamore Crossing site to Safeway subsidiary Property Development Centers and the \$8,000,000 sale of the approximately 17 acre Parcel C on John Muir Parkway to Lewis Land Developers. Sale of these former Redevelopment Agency sites is required under the legislation that dissolved redevelopment agencies statewide is also necessary for the payment of a Redevelopment Agency debt to redevelopment bond insurer Ambac and other debts of the Agency.

Sycamore North:

Presidio Development Partners, which is in contract on the property, proposes the “Towne Centrale” project as mixed-used with approximately 140 apartments, four live-work units, and approximately 12,000 sq. ft. of ground-floor retail space. The City Council discussed this matter on November 26th and directed staff to bring the matter back for further discussion on December 10th. Staff is seeking City Council direction regarding the possible re-marketing of the property, which the City has the right to do under the Purchase and Sale Agreement on January 1, 2014.

“R Alley” Issue. Originally, the Buyer was to have negotiated an easement agreement with the Bayside Home Owners Association. The Buyer, however, was not successful in obtaining the necessary easement from the Bayside Home Owners Association and has asked the City to assist with this matter. In March of 2013, the City commenced a discussion with the Bayside HOA for

acquisition of a public right of way on “R Alley” in order to provide emergency access to the project and to allow for the issuance of encroachment permits for construction and maintenance. The City was unable to get the HOA to negotiate a reasonable agreement and has pursued an eminent domain action that is proceeding through the court process. The HOA has recently hired real estate counsel in this regard and settlement negotiations are in progress.

The franchise amendment will be before the Council on November 26, 2013.
- Staff continues to work with Ducks Unlimited on Chelsea Wetlands Restoration Project. An RFP was issued for the work and awarded to WRA. Work will commence in approximately six months. Staff continues to meet and have included Contra Costa Flood Control in the discussions. Permits will need to be obtained through them to move forward.

- Staff repaired numerous street lights within the City.
- Striping renewal is complete on San Pablo Avenue at Sycamore Avenue, San Pablo at Village Parkway and San Pablo Avenue from 550 feet west of Sycamore to John Muir Parkway.
- Staff is scheduling the work for re-lamping the high lights in the library.
- Sidewalk repair project has begun at numerous locations throughout the City.

WEEKLY POLICE REPORT – Week ending November 26, 2013

Possession of stolen property/Mail Theft: On November 21, 2013 at about 11:44am Hercules’ Detective observed two male subjects taking mail from several mailboxes, in the 1500 block of Partridge; and get into green vehicle. The detective followed the vehicle until marked police cars were in the area. The green Mercedes was stopped in the 400 block of Sparrow. The adult female driver, and two juveniles, was detained. Mail addressed to residents in Hercules and Vallejo was located inside the vehicle. The female driver also had multiple ID’s and some credit cards in other peoples name inside her purse. All three suspects were arrested for possession of stolen property and theft. 39 year old Alma Braziel, of Vallejo, was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The two Juveniles were cited out and released to an adult.

Voluntary Missing Adult: On November 21, 2013 at 12:13pm, a Hercules resident reported her adult husband as missing. She said she last saw her husband when he left for work. She has exchanged texts with him since, but she does not know where he is.

Indecent Exposure: On 11/21/2013, at about 3:52 PM, officers were dispatched to the 300 block of Brighton St to investigate, an in progress, indecent exposure. When the officers arrived, the

suspect had already left the area, and was not located. The reporting party said she was coming home with her son. When she returned to her vehicle, to gather her belongings, she noticed an adult male standing at the corner of Brighton St and Canterbury Dr. The male walked along the opposite side of the street, passing her residence, and stopping at a park bench located in the dead end of Brighton St. The reporting party called the police and observed. She saw the suspect walk back and stop in front of a house in the 300 block of Brighton St. The male pulled his shorts down and exposed his private parts. The reporting party yelled she was calling the police and the suspect fled on foot.

Residential Burglary: On November 22, 2013, at 4:23pm, officers responded to the 1800 block of Pheasant Dr to investigate a report of a burglary. The home owner advised his wife was the last to leave the house at about 9:40am this morning. He returned home at about 4:20pm to find his front door forced in, and items rifled throughout on the first level. Officers conducted a protective sweep of the residence and did not locate any suspects. It appeared that some sort pry tool was used to force open the front door.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On November 22, 2013, at 10:04 pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Canterbury/ Brighton for a report of a possible drunk driver. The reporting party was following a 03 Chevy P/U. The vehicle was reportedly driving all over the roadway. The vehicle parked in the 200 block of Brighton. The driver was detained, at the scene, by the reporting party. Officers arrived and gave the driver of the Chevy the Standard Field Sobriety Test. Based on the officer's observations, 37 year old Bernardino Jimenez, was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Possession Of Marijuana: On November 23, 2013 at 8:32am an officer stopped a silver 2000 Dodge Stratus, in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave, because the driver was not wearing his seat belt. During the contact, the officer could smell the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. A "probable cause" search was conducted and marijuana was found inside the vehicle. The adult male driver was cited for having marijuana inside his vehicle (no cannabis card) and released at the scene.

Warrant Arrest: On November 23, 2013 at 8:57am, 30 year old Jon Pierre Johnson, of Hercules was observed walking in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. The officer was aware the subject had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Criminal Threats: On November 23, 2013 at 10:39 am a Hercules resident reported that a relative made criminal threats against her on Facebook. She felt threatened, given that she needed for a restraining order against the relative in the past. She felt his threats were credible. She was advised to obtain another restraining order and a report was taken.

Identity Theft: On November 21, 2013 at 2:22pm, a Hercules resident submitted an online report regarding identity theft. The victim stated more than \$400 was fraudulently charged on his Capital One credit card.

Identity Theft: On November 6, 2013 at 10:54am, a Hercules resident submitted an online report regarding identity theft. The victim stated someone used his identifying information to open up a Comcast, and Nordstrom account.

Identity Theft: On August 19, 2013 at 9:52am, a Hercules resident submitted an online report regarding identity theft. The victim stated someone used her identifying information to pass fraudulent checks in her name.

Mail Theft: On November 14, 2013 at 4:08pm, two Hercules residents submitted an online report regarding theft of mail. They both stated that they did not receive mail between 10-16-13 and 10-19-13.

Residential Burglary: On November 23, 2013, at 12:46pm, an officer responded to the 200 block of Starling Way to investigate a report of a burglary. The reporting party advised he and his wife left the house at about 6:30am and he returned home at about 12:20pm. They found the front door forced in and ransacking in his master bedroom. It appeared that a pry tool was used to force open the front door and the suspect(s) ransacked four rooms before fleeing. Loss appears to be electronics, cash, and jewelry.

Residential Burglary: On November 23, 2013, at 9:51 pm, officer was dispatched to the 200 block of Starling for a residential burglary report. The victim stated said the time frame was between 5:30 am, and 9:45 pm. The point of entry was the side garage door and there were pry marks. The loss appears to be small electronics.

Residential Burglary On November 24, 2013 at 9:50 am officers responded to a residential alarm in the 1800 block of Pheasant Dr. The first officers advised the front door was forced open and movement could be heard inside. As other officers were arriving, and positioning, an African American male, 15-16 yrs., dressed in a black track suit, was about to walk out the front door. Slung across his chest was a gray/silver satchel-like shoulder bag. When confronted by officers the suspect ran back inside and closed the door. After establishing a perimeter, that included Pinole PD officers, several call-outs were made via p.a. A subsequent entry and search was conducted and the suspect was not located. A yard-to-yard search, of adjacent properties, was also conducted with negative results. The fence line, along the greenbelt which backs up to that side of Pheasant Dr., was searched for property. Nothing was found. A closer inspection of the greenbelt suggested the responsible(s) made it as far as the City garden at Ohlone Park. Entry was made by prying open the front door. Loss appears to be small electronics.

This burglary was similar to a residential burglary from the day before, in the 200 block of Starling; and two other burglaries, on November 23rd, also in the 200 block of Starling

Stolen Vehicle On November 24, 2013 at 1:12 pm, Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Napoli Ct. The reporting party said his 05 Toyota 4Runner, 4D, was missing. The victim said an acquaintance left his home at about 4am, this date, and took the garage door opener, the electronic key to his front door, and the Toyota. Prior to calling the police the victim had been in contact with the suspect, and the agreed to not call the police provided the vehicle was returned. After several hours of no-return a subsequent report was made.

Unauthorized Use of Access Card On November 24, 2013 at 1:18 pm a Hercules resident reported her American Express card compromised when she discovered bogus charges on her account.

Occupied Stolen Vehicle: On November 24, 2013 at 11:29 PM an officer located the stolen Rav 4, from Napoli Ct (case above), in the 2300 block of Redwood Road. Officers began surveillance of the vehicle and at 11:45 PM a male and female approached the vehicle. The female got into the driver's seat, while the male approached the passenger side of the vehicle. Officers approached the vehicle and took both into custody at 11:51 PM. The victim responded and provided a statement and took possession of his vehicle. The Officer found a substance, believed to be a controlled substance, in 4 separate packages. The substance was located in a cigarette pack between the driver's seat and the center console. 45 year old Angelene Castro of Vallejo, and 33 year old Jason Hall, were arrested for Auto Theft; Possession of a Stolen Auto; Possession of a Controlled Substance; and Possession of stolen property. Both were transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Commercial Burglary On November 25, 2013 at 9:50 am officers responded to a theft that just occurred from Home Depot. The suspect vehicle was a green, older model, Toyota Camry, with gold trim and chrome wheels, with a partial plate of 3EG. It was last seen turning left onto Sycamore Ave. It was being driven by Suspect #2 (no description). The primary suspect was an African American male, in his 20's, wearing blue denim jeans, gray hooded sweatshirt, and a dust mask over his face. Suspect #1 had filled a cart with four power drill combo kits of varying makes, walked out of the store despite being confronted by a store employee, and then loaded the merchandise into the Toyota before getting in the right front passenger seat.

Vehicle Burglary On November 25, 2013 at 8:59 am a resident, from the 200 block of Bristol, reported the burglary of her 10 Dodge Charger, 4D. The theft occurred sometime between 11/25/13, 0000hrs, and time of call. The victim found the trunk open.

Battery: On November 25, 2013, at 5:26 p.m., Officers were dispatched to Lucky Supermarket for a physical fight inside the store. Officers contacted the adult male victim inside the store. The victim said a male, who he knows only by this nickname, walked up behind him and hit him in the back of the head with a closed fist. The victim did not have any further identifying information for the suspect. The suspect is described as a Hispanic male adult, approximately 20 to 25 years old, 6 feet tall, weighing 280 pounds, and wearing a black hooded sweat shirt, a black beanie, and black pants.

Identity theft: On November 25, 2013 at 6:37PM a Hercules resident came to HPD and reported that he received a notice from the IRS asking for him to file his tax returns from 2005, 06, 07,09,10,11. In 2005 the victim was only 12 years old. He stated that according to paperwork he received from the IRS the individual using his social security number is employed in southern California.

Found property: On November 25, 2013 at 9:50 PM officer were in the area of 100 block of Beechnut for a call of Juveniles in the park. A baseball gear bag was located in the cul-de-sac of

Beechnut, behind a car. The neighbors were contacted and no one knew who the owner of the equipment was so it was kept for safe keeping.

Possession of a stolen vehicle, and stolen property: On November 25 at 9:52 PM, while leaving the above call, an officer noticed a Silver Hyundai in the 100 block of Beechnut. The vehicle had paper plates, and both front seats leaned back. A check of the interior was conducted and the VIN was run. The vehicle was reported stolen to Pinole PD on 11/19/13. A further check of the vehicle was conducted and the engine was found to be warm. Officers left the area, and surveillance was conducted. At 10:07pm 29 year old Justin Conlon, of Martinez, was contacted in the driver's seat, and he was arrested. In his possession were several credit cards and a set of ten luck pick type keys. Located in the car were several pieces of mail, from several cities, including Hercules. Four victims of mail theft were contacted. Conlon was charged with Possession of a Stolen Auto and Possession of Stolen Property. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. Conlon is currently on Felony probation in Napa County and had three outstanding warrants including one held by Hercules Police.

Mental Health Evaluation: On November 26, 2013 at 12:22 AM an adult female, from the 100 block of Maple Ct, was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation, after she tried to hit her son. She was transported, by ambulance to the County Regional Health Center.

Mental Health Evaluation: On November 26, 2013 at 1:02 AM an adult male, from the 300 block of Grenadine, was determined to meet the criteria for a Mental Health Evaluation, after he broke several items in his parent's house and became aggressive with Officers. He was transported, by ambulance, to the County Regional Health Center.
