Safeway – Sycamore Crossing Project (located on Sycamore and San Pablo Avenues)

Building Division

Town Centrale (aka Sycamore North, located on Sycamore Avenue)

Building construction plans have been submitted this week for the City's third party plan check review to complete the existing building shell on Sycamore Avenue, west of San Pablo Avenue. Copies of the exterior drawings and landscape site plan that were approved by City Council in October 2012 can be viewed on the City's website at the following link:

POLICE DEPARTMENT

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: On September 26, 2014, between 10:00am and 2:00pm, Hercules Police Reserve Officers conducted a “Prescription/Over the Counter Medication” collection. Citizens were able to bring expired or unwanted medications, to the City Hall Parking lot; and drop the medication in to collection boxes. Many citizens took advantage of this collection day. Officers collected 78.6 pounds of medications, which will not go into the water supply, or the land fill. The collection boxes were taken to the Drug Enforcement Agency, in Oakland, for disposal.

Possession of a Controlled Substance for Sale: On 9/22/14 at approximately 2210hrs, an officer saw a blue 1993 Honda Civic drive from the shell station towards the Sycamore Ave.

exit. Instead of driving out through the exit, the driver drove out through the entrance. The driver turned right from the entryway, against a red light, onto Sycamore Avenue. The officer stopped the vehicle and determined the 33 year old driver was driving on a suspended driver's license. The officer did an inventory search of the vehicle, prior to towing it (driver driving on a suspended license). The officer found a small clear plastic cylindrical container (similar to a pill bottle) under the driver's seat. Inside the container was a substance believed to be illegal narcotics. Suspect was arrested for Possession of a Controlled Substance. The officer searched the suspect, incident to arrest, and located a large amount of cash; a glass pipe, believed used to smoke an illegal substance; and a small clear plastic wrapper, containing a substance believed to be narcotics. The suspect was also charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance for Sale. He was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Identity Theft and Credit Card Fraud

Below you will find identify theft and credit card fraud reports that the Hercules Police Department has received since September 16, 2014.

Unauthorized Use of an Access Card: On September 16, 2014 at 4:21 p.m. an Officer was dispatched to an HPD lobby detail regarding an unauthorized use of an access card. at Home Depot. The Walnut Creek resident told the Officer an unknown suspect fraudulently used his Home Depot credit card at the Hercules Home Depot on 08/27/14. The victim said his credit card was stolen from a vehicle, in Vallejo, but was not reported

Identity Theft: On September 19, 2014, at 10:50 pm an officer processed an online report regarding Identity Theft. The Hercules resident stated she is unable to make changes to her credit card accounts because there are names on the account she did not authorize. There is no loss at this time.

Identity Theft: On September 23, 2014 at 10:50 PM an officer processed an online report. The Hercules resident stated she was the victim of identity theft. On September 11, 2014 Target called the victim, to confirm that she was opening a Target redcard account, in White Plains NY. A subject that attempted to open the account used her Name, DOB, phone number and the last four of her social security number. On September 22, 2014 she learned a large purchase was charged to her Nordstrom's card on 9/11/14 in White Plains NY. The reporting party did not authorize either the account or the purchase.

Identity Theft: On September 29, 2014 at 8:41 a.m. an officer was dispatched to a lobby detail regarding identity theft. The female victim stated an unknown suspect used her healthcare plan identification number, and name, to fraudulently obtain (intercept) her prescription. The victim was supposed to pickup her prescription at the Hercules CVS, prior to having dental surgery. When she went to the pharmacy she was told the prescription had already been filled. The healthcare company determined the prescription was filled at the Los Gatos CVS. The investigation is continuing.

Identity Theft: On September 30, 2014 at 2:35 AM, an Officer stopped a vehicle, for expired registration, at the Park in Ride in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. A 44 year old male

passenger was found to be on searchable probation. The officer did a probation search of the passenger, and the area he was seated. During the search the Officer located a large knife with brass knuckles affixed to the handle (an illegal weapon). The Officer then conducted a search of 43 year old driver, and his vehicle, for more weapons. The Officer located numerous materials related to Identity Theft. The passenger was released at the scene. The driver, a Martinez resident, was arrested, for Identity Theft and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The investigation is continuing.

Unauthorized Use of an Access Card: On September 28, 2014 at 1:53 p.m. an officer was dispatched to a lobby detail regarding a theft from the reporting party's ATM account. The Rodeo resident stated at 12:45 p.m. he was using the ATM at the Bank of America. He saw a male adult using the ATM to his right. The victim completed his transaction, but didn't hit the cancel button to close out his transaction. The victim saw the male, to his right, quickly walk over to the victim's ATM; and begin to use it. The victim saw the male finish the transaction, at the ATM he (the victim) had just used, and get into a White Chevy Impala (unknown plate). The victim went back to the ATM at 1:02 p.m. to check his account and saw that \$300 in cash had been withdrawn. The Suspect was described as an African American male; 30-35 years old; 5'10"; thin build; with Black hair; and wearing a White shirt, and Brown pants.

SAFETY TIPS TO HELP PREVENT RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

Most of the burglaries have been during the daylight hours, between 6:00am and 6:00pm. The locations have been all over the city. However, sometimes more than one home is targeted in a particular neighborhood.

Most residential burglaries are a "crime of opportunity". Suspects look for an unoccupied home(s), with easy access. Twelve of the 43 burglaries, in 2013, have listed unlocked windows, or doors, as the point of entry. Four entries were through open windows on the second story. Forced side or back doors (out of sight) accounted for many of the entries.

The most common "method of operation", for a residential burglary, is for the suspect(s) to wander around a neighborhood and look for unoccupied homes (away at work or on vacation). The suspect knocks on the door, or rings the door bell, and if someone answers they says they are looking for someone (Is Joe Smith here). The resident says "No one by that name lives here", and the suspect moves on. If no one answers the door the suspect looks for an "easy" entry. If there is an unlocked door, or open window, they go inside. Most of the recent losses have been small electronic, jewelry, and cash (easily hidden and transported items).

If the suspect does not find an open door, or window, they may move on. The suspect may also go to the side of the house, or backyard, and find a garage door they can force; or a patio door that can be broken, without them being noticed (again out of sight).

HERE ARE SOME BASIC THINGS YOU CAN DO TO "HARDEN YOUR TARGET:

1) WHEN YOU ARE NOT AT HOME LOCK ALL DOORS AND WINDOWS

When the weather is nice it is tempting to leave a window open. However, even second story, or small bathroom, windows are vulnerable

2) If someone comes to your door, and you do not know them, do not answer the door. However, try to let the person know there is someone inside (Who is it? or maybe George can you get the door?) **CALL THE POLICE**. If you are using a home phone you can call **911, or 510-724-1111**. If you are using a Cell phone call **510-724-1111**.

3) Try to make your residence look occupied. Think about leaving a car in the drive way. Try not to leave your trash cans out all day. Maybe you have a neighbor who will put your trash cans on the side of the house.

4) If you are going to be gone for a few days have someone collect your mail, and or paper. If you are expecting a package try to have someone pick it up for you.

5) If you are going to be gone for any length of time make sure someone is taking care of your yard, so the house looks lived in. Leave lights on timers. Place the lights in several locations and vary the times they go on and off.

6) WATCH OUT FOR YOUR NEIGHBOR AND ASK THEM TO WATCH OUT FOR YOU. You and your neighbors are the eyes and ears for the Police Department. If you see, or hear, something suspicious, call the police **IMMEDIATELY**.

PREVENT VEHICLE BREAK-INS!

Auto burglary is a crime of opportunity. Don't give the crooks the chance to take advantage of you! Below are some tips to help you avoid becoming a victim:

DON'T leave ANYTHING visible in your vehicle! Criminals will break into your vehicle to take something that might have zero to little monetary value. If you must leave items in your car, put them in the center console, glove compartment, trunk, or anywhere out of sight.

PARK your vehicle in your garage or some other indoor secured parking area when at all possible. If you are parking in a public place try to park your vehicle in an area of high visibility. Stay away from areas of concealment such as alleyways or behind bushes.

Lock your doors and roll up your windows!

Below you will find property crimes reports that the Hercules Police Department has received since September 16, 2014.

Auto Burglary PC 459: On September 16, 2014 at 9:34 PM a Hercules resident reported that she parked, and locked, her car in front of Starbucks at 3700 San Pablo Ave, at 7:00 PM. When she returned to her car at 9:30 PM she found her notebook, which had been on the left rear seat, on the ground and her left rear window shattered.

Auto Burglary: On September 20, 2014 at 9:43am an officer was dispatched, to the 800 block of Willow Ave, for a report of an auto burglary. The incident occurred about five minutes prior to the victim calling dispatch. A witness reported seeing an African American male 5'10", late 20's; wearing a gray hoodie, and baggie jeans; walking away from the victim's Honda around the time of the burglary.

Auto Burglary: On September 20, 2014 at 2:06pm an officer was dispatched to 3500 Franklin Canyon Rd. for a report of an auto burglary. The reporting party parked, and locked, his Toyota in the parking lot at 9:00am this morning. He returned to his vehicle at about 2:00pm and saw that it had been burglarized (Smashed Window).

Petty Theft: On September 21, 2014 at 6:07 p.m. Hercules Officers were dispatched, to the Sycamore Hills Retirement building (1550 Sycamore Ave), for a report of two Caucasian females (one adult and one juvenile) who stole a debit card from a resident. The victim told Officers the two females knocked on his door asking for a donation for a "Softball Team." The victim let the females inside his apartment. He said that after the females left his apartment he noticed his Chase Bank Debit card was missing. Officers searched the entire building but couldn't locate the females. The two females were seen at the Pinole Senior Center earlier today also trying to "solicit" donations.

Auto Burglary: On September 24, 2014 at 7:28 a.m. an officer was dispatched, for an auto burglary report, in the 1200 block of Willow Ave. The reporting party stated an unknown suspect shattered the right front passenger window on her Gray '11 Kia Optima. The unknown suspect stole a backpack, containing a pair of headphones; and a purse containing, a checkbook, and credit cards.

Petty Theft: On September 26, 2014 at approximately 2:55PM an Officer was dispatched to Lucky Supermarket for an in-custody theft suspect. A 17 year old male, of San Pablo, took alcohol and was apprehended by loss prevention. The juvenile was booked and released to his mother.

Petty Theft: On 09-26-14 at approximately 5:46PM a petty theft case was taken via online reporting. The victim reported \$5, in loose change, was taken from his unlocked car. The incident could have happened anywhere in the two week period leading up to the discovery of the theft.

Grand Theft: On September 28, 2014 at 11:32 a.m. an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Decatur Ct. to take report for the theft of a catalytic converter. The victim stated an unknown suspect cut and removed the catalytic converter from her '03 Toyota Sequoia. The vehicle was parked in the driveway. The theft occurred sometime between 4:00pm, on Friday, and 3:30 pm on Saturday.

Grand Theft: On September 28, 2014 at 12:05 p.m. an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Manzanita Place to take a report of catalytic converter theft. The victim stated an unknown suspect cut and removed the catalytic converter from her '06 Toyota Tundra, which was parked in the driveway. The theft occurred sometime between 5:00 pm on Thursday and 6:00am today.

Auto Burglary: On September 29, 2014 at 10:20 a.m. and officer processed an online, BobCop, police report regarding an auto burglary. The Fremont resident reported, on 09/26/14 at 12:00 p.m., she parked her 2011 black BMW in the employee parking lot of Bio-Rad, 200 Alfred Nobel Dr. When she returned to her vehicle at 3:00 p.m. she found the right rear passenger window had been shattered by an unknown suspect. The loss was personal property.

Auto Burglary: On September 29, 2014 at 8:20 PM, officers responded to the 800 block of Willow Avenue for a report of an auto burglary, which had just occurred. Dispatch advised the suspect was possibly an Asian male, who fled the scene in a black four door BMW with tinted windows. The BMW was last seen heading southbound on Willow Avenue. Officers searched the area and were unable to locate the suspect vehicle. A witness heard the sound of glass breaking, and saw the suspect on the side of the victim's vehicle, a gray 2011 Chrysler van. The suspect hurried to the BMW, was parked next to the van, and got in on the passenger side. The loss included electronics and personal papers. A Pinole PD Officer located some paperwork, belonging to the victim, on the westbound I-80 on ramp from Pinole Valley Road. The papers were returned to the victim.

Commercial Burglary: On October 1, 2014 at 2:56 AM, officers responded to Quiznos, at 844 Willow Avenue #A3, for an audible motion alarm. Officers and set up an inner perimeter around the business. Richmond PD K-9 and a Pinole PD Officer responded to assist. The business owner arrived and officers used the key to make entry. The suspect fled the scene prior to the officers' arrival. It appeared the suspect may have used a pry tool to gain entry into the business next door, #A4. From there, the suspect tore a hole through the sheet rock of the wall separating #A3 and #A4. The suspect attempted to remove the safe, but was unable to as it was bolted to the floor. The investigation is continuing.
