Demonstration Streetlight Project Underway


The City is proceeding with the replacement of the failing hollow-core wooden street lights in those areas where the current neighborhood Landscape & Lighting Assessments are sufficient to allow for full or partial replacement. Replacement streetlights will be installed in the Foxboro neighborhood, and along Coronado and Carson streets in the Refugio Heights neighborhood. In addition, an example neighborhood replacement streetlight are being installed in the Hercules by the Bay, Gems & Birds, and Village Parkway neighborhoods. The demonstration replacement streetlight in the Hercules by the Bay Neighborhood is on Hercules Avenue and is featured in the photo below. The demonstration lights will be identified by the sign shown.



Groundbreaking for the Bayfront First Phase



The community is cordially invited to attend the groundbreaking for the first phase of the Bayfront development! The Exchange @ Bayfront will be 172 units of apartment in a four story structure with 14,000 square feet of ground floor retail. This first phase project will formally start the private development components of the long-awaited Waterfront Master Plan. On Wednesday evening we hosted a Facebook Live Community Discussion regarding the proposed increases to Landscape & Lighting Assessments in five neighborhoods – Hercules by the Bay, Gems & Birds, Village Parkway, Refugio Heights, and Birds & Country Run. The proposed assessment increases are primarily needed to fund the replacement failing hollow-core wood streetlights with new energy efficient streetlights, and in some instances to address operating deficits in these neighborhoods. The video of the Facebook Live Community Discussion is available on the City’s Facebook page and may answer many of the questions property owners may have about the proposed assessment increases.

Landscape & Lighting Ballots

Ballots regarding an increase in landscaping and lighting district assessments were sent last week to property owners in 5 (five) neighborhoods in Citywide Landscape & Lighting Assessment District 83-1. Those neighborhoods are:

Zone 1 – Hercules by the Bay
Zone 3 & 4 – Gems & Birds
Zone 6 – Village Parkway
Zone 7 – Refugio Heights
Zone 9 – Birds & Country Run

Property owners are being asked to approve increased assessments to fund streetlight replacement and maintain neighborhood landscaping services. 2017 Strategic Plan Update & Review

On May 8, 2018, the Hercules City Council reviewed and updated the 2017 Hercules Strategic Plan. The Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats assessment was modified, and one objective related to Public Safety was added. This new objective relates to ensuring that we provide one police officer per 1,000 of population. The City Council also received a status report on each of the objectives established in the Strategic Plan. The status report is attached and shows significant progress on the established objectives with less than a year have passed. Our hard-working City staff works continuously to move many projects and activities of benefit to the community forward, with the support of our City Council, Board & Commission Members, and volunteers, and that is clearly demonstrated by the status report. Hercules General Municipal Election – Filing Period Opens Soon

The City of Hercules holds its General Municipal Elections in November of each even numbered year, therefore a General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Hercules on November 6, 2018 to elect two (2) members of the City Council which have expiring terms at the end of this year. Members of the City Council are elected to four (4) year terms. The November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election Nomination Period begins on July 16, 2018 and closes on August 10, 2018 (the 88th day before the election). If an incumbent officer does not run for office by the 88th day (August 10, 2018) for that incumbent's elective office, the close of the nomination period will extend to August 15, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.

Note: A candidate for state or local office must file Form 501 "Candidate Intention Statement"

before soliciting or receiving any contributions or making any expenditures from personal funds on behalf of your candidacy. Form 501 is filed with the Hercules City Clerk located at 111 Civic Drive, Hercules, CA 94547.

It is recommended that you make an appointment with the City Clerk to pull Nomination Papers during normal business hours once the nomination period opens.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. They moved into the new modular maintenance and operations building and the old building will be hauled off shortly. The first phase of the Street Sign Replacement Project, which

replaced street signs on major streets, has been completed and the first order of signs for residential streets just arrived. The replacement generator damaged by fire at the Community Center has been ordered and we are waiting for delivery. Emergency power is supplied in the interim with a temporary generator. Bids for Community Center Re-roofing Project were opened and the recommendation for award will be brought before Council for consideration at the first meeting in June while bids for Duck Pond Park Improvement Project are out to bid and will be opened next Tuesday. The Pilot Streetlight Replacement Project, which is replacing 75 streetlights, is underway. Staff also repaired numerous streetlights throughout town, including a few which were knocked down by automobiles. The top down cleaning of the City's entire sewer system is now underway.

Engineering

Bay Trail West has been substantially completed. This 0.3 mile long project eliminates the last paving gap along the waterfront and is funded with a \$1.5M grant. The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is now 2/3 completed with an anticipated final completion date of February 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, most recently the new power supply provided by PG&E was delayed. The cost impacts of this delay is being assessed. The grading plans for Sycamore Crossing and public improvements for Bayfront Block N are under review. Staff is in discussions with firms to provide plan review on the Safeway Project, obtain environmental permits to dredge Lake Refugio, and mitigation monitoring and permit support for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC). Staff is also beginning the design for capital projects to be constructed next construction season, including resurfacing the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail and a major street rehabilitation project.


