Identity Theft: On June 7, 2018 at 9:54 am a Hercules resident came to the police department to report a fraud. He said he had been contacted by the “Chinese Police”

They said they needed to him wire them \$14,000 regarding a possible money laundering case he was possibly involved in. The victim has contacted his bank to attempt to stop the transfer.

Property Taken for Destruction: On June 7, 2018 at 4:50 pm, a subject came to the front lobby of the Police Department to turn in a can of Mace that she had had for over 40 years and wanted to get rid of.

Vandalism: On June 7, 2018, at approximately 7:08 pm, an Officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Staples for the report of vandalism. The victim parked his 2011, gold BMW 535i in front of Taco Bell, in Hercules, at approximately 6:00 pm, and there was no damage to the vehicle at the time. At approximately 6:30 pm, the victim came out to his vehicle and found it had been keyed on the driver’s side.

Found Property: On June 7, 2018, at approximately 7:07 pm, an Officer was dispatched to 76 Gas Station for a cell phone which was found. An iPhone 7 was found sometime around 7:00 pm on Willow Avenue in front of 76 Gas Station. The phone was disabled and the Officer was not able to retrieve any information as to the owner. The Phone was booked for safekeeping.

Warrant Arrest/Possession of Controlled Substance: On June 7, 2018, at 9:12 pm, an Officer stopped a black Ford Focus for expired registration. The 57 year old male driver, from Berkeley, had a misdemeanor warrant from Berkeley PD. The subject was arrested, and searched incident to arrest. A substance, believed to be a narcotic, was located on his person. The subject was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility and booked for the warrant and possession of a controlled substance.

Auto Burglary: On June 8, 2018 at 1:03 pm, an officer was dispatched to Franklin Canyon Golf Course (3500 Franklin Canyon Rd.) for an Auto Burglary that occurred sometime between 08:30 am and 1:00 pm. The victim's 2011 Black Chrysler 200 was broken into. The unknown suspects took a bowling bag.

Warrant Arrest: On June 9, 2018, at approximately 1:16 am, an Officer stopped a 2008, Ford, 80 for an equipment violation. The 34 year old female driver, from Vallejo, had a misdemeanor warrant from Napa. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility for the warrant.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On June 9, 2018 at 4:04 pm, an officer conducted a traffic stop, for a vehicle code violation, on a 2000 Mitsubishi. The 30 year old male driver, out of San Pablo, displayed objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication. The subject was given the Standard Field Sobriety Test; and the Preliminary Alcohol Screening Device indicated he was over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. He was cite released to a responsible party.

Missing Person: On June 9, 2018 at 5:27 pm an officer was dispatched to 200 block of Agate Way for the report of a missing person. Family reported an 87 year old male went for a walk on Thursday June 7, 2018 and has not returned. They said that he goes on walks and comes back either the same day or the next but this is a little longer than normal and wanted to report him missing. The subject was located on June 10, 2018.

Evading with Willful and Wanton disregard for Safety: On June 10, 2018, at approximately 1:25 am, an Officer attempted to stop a white, Infiniti M45 sedan on Parker Avenue near Safeway for tinted front windows. The vehicle failed to yield, and a pursuit was initiated. The pursuit went west on Willow to Investment, and then the vehicle made a U-turn and started to drive east on Willow. The Infiniti entered Highway 80 west bound, and reached speeds exceeding 100 MPH. The Officers lost visual of the Infiniti on west bound Highway 80 passing Hilltop Drive.

Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol: On June 10, 2018 at 8:58 p.m. an Officer saw a Gray '08 Nissan Altima driving without any lights on during darkness. The Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The 35 year old female driver, of Rodeo, exhibited objective signs and symptoms of alcohol intoxication. She was administered the Standard Field Sobriety Test and the Preliminary Alcohol Screening Device indicated she of over the presumptive limit for the purposes of driving. She was arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol. She was later cited and released to a responsible party.

Voluntary Missing Person (At-Risk): On June 10, 2018 at 9:56 p.m. an Officer responded to the 100 block of Falcon Way to take a missing person report. The reporting party said he and his girlfriend were driving to Church at approximately 12:00 p.m. They had a verbal argument. The subject exited the vehicle while they were stopped for the stoplight on W/B Sycamore Ave. at Creekside. The subject left her cell phone inside the vehicle, and she was last seen walking up the sidewalk entrance to the Creekside Shopping Center. The boyfriend drove around the Creekside Shopping Center but couldn't locate the subject. He said he also contacted her adult children and close friends, but no one has seen or heard from her. The subject is considered at risk, as she has Type 2 Diabetes. Officers extensively checked the Creekside Shopping Center, Park Lake Plaza, and Refugio Valley Park. The Officer also contacted the subject's adult children and friends. A local "Be on the Look Out" was sent out. A TRAK flyer was also created and sent out.
