





Friday Movie Night Series in Refugio Park

Property Tax Update

Did you know that Hercules is a low-to-no property tax city? The City’s share of total property taxes which our residents pay is now just 5.44% gross and a net 3.41% of the base property taxes levied overall. Other cities on average get substantially more. On June 12th the City Council received a report on property tax, the City’s low share and efforts underway to try to increase that share, and how to read and understand a property tax bill. The City’s share of the base 1% property tax rate on a home where a homeowner pays \$4,225 in total base property taxes is just \$239 a year.

Property taxes are between \$1.2 and \$1.3 million annually of the just over \$15 million in General Fund revenues. You can learn more by viewing the presentation and staff report here: [Property Tax Update](#)

FY 2018/19 Budget

On Tuesday this week, the City Council conducted the first of two public hearings on the proposed FY 2018/19 Budget for the fiscal year which starts July 1, 2018. The second public hearing will occur on Tuesday, June 26th at the 7 PM City Council meeting at which time the City Council is expected to approve the budget with possible changes which are outlined in a series of City Manager recommended Decision Packages and City Council generated Budget Referrals. The proposed FY 2018/19 General Fund budget of just under \$15 million is balanced with a small operating surplus as proposed. In addition, one-time monies are proposed to be allocated to a number of high priority items like topping up our reserves or investing in our facilities and infrastructure. Hercules Heritage Garden Rededication Ceremony



It was great to hear the Mayor talk about the past ground work laid by the community over 25 years ago in creating the Hercules Heritage Garden during last Sunday's rededication ceremony at Heritage Garden. The improvements were headed up by the Hercules Rotary club, Hercules High Interact students, and various members of the community over the last year. The project involved over 50 different volunteers donating funds or providing hundreds of hours clearing out dead plant life, painting the continents in the central globe area, planting over 450 succulents within the continents, removing and replacing 5 tons of rock within the ocean, planting hundreds of bulbs and flower seeds, and planting 26 trees. You can more easily find the Garden and its showcase world globe by looking for the tall streamers adjacent to the Hercules Library at the corner of Sycamore and Civic Avenues through July 8th.

Hercules General Municipal Election – Filing Period Opens Soon

The City of Hercules holds its General Municipal Elections in November of each even numbered year, therefore a General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Hercules on November 6, 2018 to elect two (2) members of the City Council which have expiring terms at the end of this year. Members of the City Council are elected to four (4) year terms. The November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election Nomination Period begins on July 16, 2018 and closes on August 10, 2018 (the 88th day before the election). If an incumbent officer does not run for office by the 88th

day (August 10, 2018) for that incumbent's elective office, the close of the nomination period will extend to August 15, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.

Note: A candidate for state or local office must file Form 501 "Candidate Intention Statement" before soliciting or receiving any contributions or making any expenditures from personal funds on behalf of your candidacy. Form 501 is filed with the Hercules City Clerk located at 111 Civic Drive, Hercules, CA 94547.

For questions in regards to running for a seat on the City Council at the November 6, 2018 Election, please contact Lori Martin, City Clerk at 510-799-8215. It is recommended that you make an appointment with the City Clerk to pull Nomination Papers during normal business hours once the nomination period opens.

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks and buildings. The third phase of the Street Sign Replacement Project is underway and the remaining signs for the City are on order. The replacement generator damaged by fire at the Community Center has been ordered and we are waiting for delivery. Emergency power is supplied in the interim with a temporary generator. The construction contract for the Community Center Re-roofing Project was awarded by City Council on June 12. The Pilot Streetlight Replacement Project, which is replacing 75 streetlights, is nearing completion (see photo). The contract for the City Hall Exterior Painting Project is being executed and that work is anticipated to start in a few weeks. Staff also repaired numerous streetlights throughout town, including a few which were knocked down by automobiles. The Foxboro and Ohlone Community Centers were repainted and a new floor was installed in Ohlone. The top down cleaning of the City's entire sewer system continues. The trees in the Business Park are under evaluation including removal and replacement. Additionally, new landscaping is being designed to revitalize the median islands.

Engineering

The \$52M Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade Project is now 2/3 completed with an anticipated final completion date of June 2019. While overall the project is proceeding smoothly, power and gas services provided by PG&E was delayed. The cost impact of this delay is being assessed. The grading plans for Sycamore Crossing and public improvements and grading plans for Bayfront Block N are under review. Staff is in discussions with firms to provide plan review on the Safeway Project, obtain environmental permits to dredge Lake Refugio, and mitigation monitoring and permit support for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC). Staff is also beginning the design for capital projects to be constructed next construction season, including resurfacing the Refugio Valley Pedestrian Trail and a major street rehabilitation project.

Auto Burglary: On May 31, 2018 at 7:23, an officer was dispatched to 3700 San Pablo Ave regarding an auto burglary that occurred about five minute prior to the call. The reporting party observed an African American male adult, wearing dark clothing. The male was associated with a black Kia Optima (paper plates) seen earlier, in the parking lot, burglarizing another vehicle. The unknown suspect smashed the rear driver side window of the victim's Jaguar and stole personal items, including a breast pump.

Officers observed the subject walking out from a residence's walkway. He was carrying a shoe box. When the subject saw the Officers he quickly went back down the walkway towards a residence. Detention Facility.

Trespassing/Suspicious Circumstance: On June 1, 2018 at 9:31, a School Resource Officer, for the Hercules Middle High School, was notified of a possible trespassing. The school staff arrived at school and smelled burnt marijuana in the high school's cafeteria. The surveillance camera showed two unidentified male inside the cafeteria, during the evening hours. There were no signs of forced entry.

On April 12 2018, the Assistant Manager reported two subjects had walked out of the store. with unpaid merchandise. at 6:50am. The surveillance video showed an African American male adult, and an African American female adult, entered the store at 6:49am, and immediately walked to the Hardware Department.
