Vandalism: On July 18, 2018 at 8:51am, an officer responded to 294 Sorrento for a window smash to a 2012 Hyundai Accent (6VSW044). The vandalism occurred sometime overnight.

Vandalism: On July 18, 2018 at 10:41am an officer was dispatched to the 100 block of Midship for an out of control male throwing things. The reporting party stated her 24 year old son damaged her property and she wanted prosecution. The mother said she feared for her safety. An Emergency Protective Order was requested and granted. The son was arrested, cited and released. He was served with his copy of the Emergency Protective Order.

Auto Burglary: At approximately 11:23am, an officer was dispatched to a call of an auto burglary in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The reporting party stated he had arrived his black 2018 Chevy Impala Rental car, at Starbucks at about 9:45am. At about 10:45am he returned to his vehicle and saw there was damage to the driver side rear quarter window (shattered and broken out) and scratches on the rear fender near the trunk. There did not appear to be any loss at this time.

Theft/ Probation Violation: On July 18, 2018, at 2:47pm, officers were dispatched to a theft that occurred at Rite Aid (1560 Sycamore Avenue). The store manager advised that two adult males entered the store, selected items from the shelf, and walked passed all the cash registers showing no intent to pay, and exited the store. The store manager described the subjects as an African American male adult; wearing a gray

hooded sweater; and an Caucasian male adult; approximately 6'02"; with short blonde hair; wearing a white t-shirt. Two adult males, matching the descriptions of the suspects, were located nearby. The items, reported stolen, were found inside in one of the suspect's vehicle. An infield show up was done and the store manager positively ID's the two suspects. One subject was found to be on felony probation out of Marin County. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility. The second subject was cited and released.

Auto Burglary: On July 18, 2018 between 2:00pm and 2:40pm, an auto burglary occurred at in the 800 block of Willow Ave. The unidentified suspect shattered the driver's side window of victim's rental vehicle.

Warrant Arrest: On July 18, 2018, at approximately 9:18 pm, during a Vehicle Suspicious Enforcement Team activity, in Walnut Creek, a 43 year old male was arrested for an outstanding felony warrant and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Warrant Arrest: On July 18, 2018, at approximately 11:11 pm, an Officer checked on a suspicious occupied vehicle parked at 76 Gas Station located in the 800 block of Willow Avenue. A 60 year old male occupant was found to have a felony no bail Warrant out of Solano County. The subject was arrested and transported to the Marten Detention Facility.

Miscellaneous Information: On July 18, 2018, at approximately 10:20 pm, Officers were dispatched to 2000 block of Lupine Road for a disturbance. The reporting party said, a 20 year old female, came to her residence, and made threats to hurt her and her 19 year old daughter. The subject left prior to Officers arrival. Officers determined no crime had been committed, and recommended the parties get a restraining order. Officers were dispatched back to the residence two more times. The reporting party said the subject was out in front of the house honking her horn, and making threats, but was gone when officers arrived. A report was taken to document the incident.
