Warrant Arrest: On July 26, 2018, officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Newbury for disturbance. A 70 year old female had a warrant and was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility.

Auto Burglary: On July 26, 2018, at about 12:45pm an auto burglary occurred in the 1000 block of Victoria Park. The suspect(s) shattered the victim's window and stole property from inside including her wallet.

Strong Arm Robbery: On July 26, 2018 at 4:54pm, an officer was dispatched to the 300 block of Beechnut for a report of a strong arm robbery. The incident occurred, in the 800 block of Willow, about 30 minutes prior to time of call. The female victim reported that she met the suspect to sell him a video game. The male pushed her to the ground and snatched a gold chain from her neck. Suspect described as a light skin African American Male in his twenties; thin; and about 5'6" tall. The suspect fled the area in a red two door Toyota.

Theft: On July 27, 2018 at 6:33pm an employee from Rite-Aid reported that an African American male, wearing a black and red jacket, entered the store and stole multiple items. Suspect vehicle was a white Suzuki passenger car, last seen east on Sycamore.

Possession of Loaded Firearm in Vehicle: On July 28, 2018, at approximately 4:32 am, an Officer checked an occupied 2002 gray Acura, partially in the driveway to a residence, in the 200 block of Sunset, with the driver door open. The Officer contacted a 37 year old male sitting in the

driver's seat. There was a loaded pistol on the floor board under the subject's feet. The firearm was not registered to the subject. He was arrested and later transported to Martinez Detention Facility.

Domestic Battery: On July 28, 2018 at 10:25am, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Schooner Cove for a report of a male jumping on the hood of a vehicle. Officers contacted the 20 year old the female victim who stated no assault took place. She said the adult male subject only jumped on the hood of her car causing damage. The victim declined to press charges. At 2:00pm, the victim contacted officers and stated she lied earlier about male not assaulting her. The victim stated during an argument the male subject choked and shook her. There were no visible injuries located on the victim. The victim still declined to prosecute the male for the assault or the vandalism.

Vehicle Collison: On July 29, 2018, at 2:10 p.m., a rear end vehicle vs. vehicle collision occurred at 4000 San Pablo Avenue. One of the occupants complained of pain, but refused to go to the hospital.

Coroner's Case: On July 29th 2018 at approximately 10:44PM Fire requested HPD respond to a residence in the 100 block of Maple Ct for a 60 year old male having a cardiac arrest. Officers arrived on scene and began CPR on the male until Fire and Ambulance units arrived. The subject was declared deceased and the Contra Costa County Coroner responded and took custody of the subject.

Warrant Arrest On July 30th 2018 at approximately 2:20AM a HPD Officer conducted a pedestrian stop in the 1500 block of Sycamore Ave. A 27 year old male, of Oakland, was placed under arrest for two warrants. He was transported to The Martinez Detention Facility.

Petty Theft: On July 30, 2018, at 12:45 p.m., a citizen reported someone stole her wallet, from her unattended purse, while she was in the book store at the Hercules Library, 109 Civic Drive. Her credit card was later used to make unauthorized purchases.

Petty Theft: On July 30, 2018, at 5:04 p.m., a Rite Aid employee, 1560 Sycamore Avenue, called to report a subject, who had stolen from them before, was currently in the store. The subject activated the alarm as he exited the store. He was last seen driving up Turquoise Drive in a white 2003 Suzuki Aerio. The suspect was described as: an African American male; in his 30's; wearing a blue jacket, and a red baseball cap.

Possession of Controlled substance/drug paraphernalia: On July 30th 2018 at approximately 9:45PM a HPD Officer checked a suspicious vehicle in the 1600 block of Sycamore Ave. The gray 1987 Chevy van displayed a 2019 registration sticker despite the registration being expired in 2006. A 49 year old female, of San Pablo, was contacted inside the vehicle. The Officer saw a glass pipe, commonly used to smoke narcotics, in plain view. She advised her 51 year old husband, was shopping inside Home Depot. Officers saw the male subject exit the store and start to walk toward the Officer's. He suddenly veered off course and officers observed him dropping a small plastic baggie. The baggie contained suspected narcotics. The subject was placed under arrest and later cited/released at the scene. The vehicle was towed for no registration and false tabs.
